






Top Priorities

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Safe, Supportive Learning Environments
 Provide a recurring \$3.5 million investment to sustain **critical safety infrastructure**.
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Attract and Retain a High-Quality Workforce
 Increase **state-funded base pay for teachers** to reach the national average and **invest in market-rate wages for classified staff** including teacher assistants, custodians, bus drivers, and other frontline workers.

Expand Access to Postsecondary Pathways
 Allow local school boards to have school **calendar flexibility** to align high school and community college schedules, support dual-enrollment students, address weather disruptions, and align semesters with winter break.
- 
Serve Students with the Greatest Needs
 Increase the 13% enrollment cap on state funding for **students with disabilities** to 16% and transition to a weighted student funding formula that accounts for severity of needs.
- 
College, Career, and Whole-Child Readiness
 Increase **school counselor** allocations to match the recommended ratio of 1:250 (currently 1:299) to support career and postsecondary planning for students.

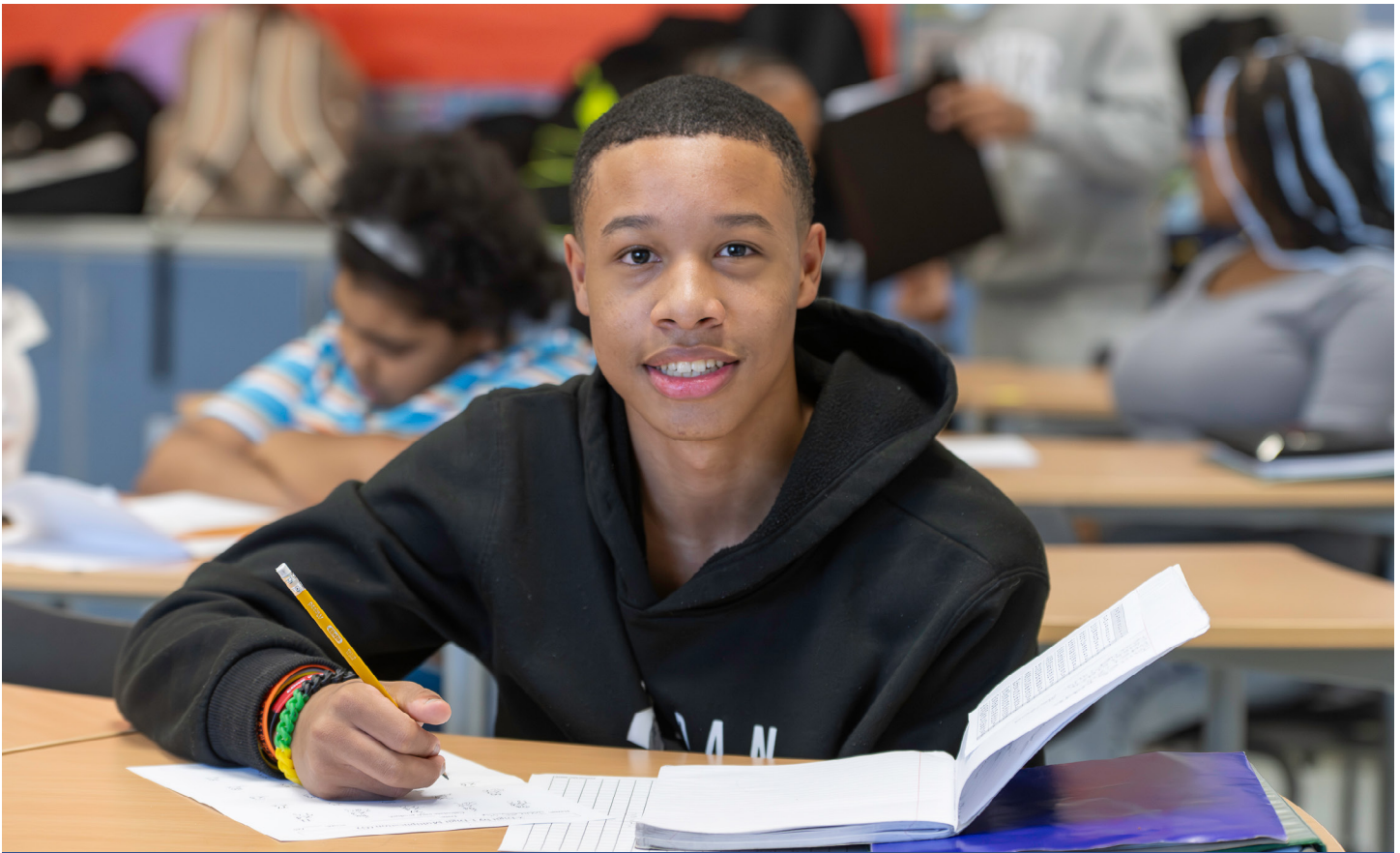

Guilford County Schools Also Supports

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Accountability and Academic Supports
High Dosage Tutoring: Commit \$5 million (2026–2028) to sustain GCS’s personalized tutoring program.
English Language Learner Support: Increase the funding school districts receive to reflect the number of students they serve with limited English proficiency.
School Accountability Model Redesign: Shift the North Carolina school accountability model to comprehensively measure whole-school impact rather than single test scores.
Voucher Accountability: Require voucher-funded schools to meet the same health, safety, and accountability standards as public schools.
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Access to Career Pathways and Early Learning
Rural Transportation: Fund transportation for rural students to access dual enrollment, CTE, and business sites.
NC Pre-K Transportation Funding: Include NC Pre-K and EC Pre-K students in Average Daily Membership (ADM) for state transportation funding and efficiency ratings to ensure Public School Units can provide transportation to Pre-K students without financial penalty.
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Infrastructure and Sustainability
Technology Access: Establish recurring state funding to refresh devices, maintain cyber security, and support digital assessments.
- Educator Bonuses:** Provide funding for recruitment and retention bonuses, especially for hard-to-fill positions.
NC Pre-K Teacher Assistant Certification Supplement: Establish an annual certification supplement to offset credentialing costs.
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Student Health, Wellness, and Mental Health
School Psychologists: Increase allocations to match the 1:500 recommended ratio (currently 1:1,389).
Social Workers: Increase allocations to match the 1:250 recommended ratio (currently 1:784).
Universal Student Meals: Provide meals at no cost to all students statewide.
Telehealth Funding: Establish recurring state funding for school-based telehealth services and authorize Medicaid reimbursement for virtual healthcare and behavioral/mental health visits to increase student access to timely healthcare services.
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Workforce Supports and Early Childhood
Teacher Supplement Inclusion: Include Guilford County in the State’s Teacher Supplement Assistance Allotment to reflect the low-income population in Guilford County.
