


POPS 2025 – Don't Miss Out!




Spring 2025 Testing Days

Attendance Reminder: Documenting Excused Absences







ADHD & Substance Use: What Parents Should Know

The CDC estimates that 11.4% of children in the US have ever been diagnosed with Attention Deficit Disorder or Attention Deficit Hyperactivity Disorder (ADD, ADHD) according to a 2022

national survey. Most people are familiar with the symptoms of ADHD but few realize how it can impact all areas of a student's development. Adolescence is a crucial time of brain development and it can be particularly challenging with a diagnosis of ADD/ADHD. Impulse control and poor decision making are heightened with ADHD making them more vulnerable to using substances such as alcohol and cannabis.
