Dear Mr. Witt:

The Colorado Department of Education (CDE) received Education ReEnvisioned BOCES' application to form a new administrative unit on September 3, 2018. In accordance with ECEA 3.01(4) the department is reviewing the application. If any additional information is required, CDE will notify the BOCES no later than September 19, 2018. Any additional information requested must be submitted no later than close of business on October 1, 2018.

In addition to the review of the application, either the Department or any entity affected by an application for a new or reorganized administrative unit may request the entity seeking the change to secure and pay for a report prepared by a CDE approved independent third party. The report must describe the anticipated revenues and expenditures for all affected administrative units. The independent third party must possess sufficient expertise in accounting, special education budget development and projection, and special education fiscal requirements. The request for the third party report must be made within 30 calendar days of the day the Department notifies the applicant and affected entities that the application is complete [ECEA 3.01(3)(e)]. The Department recommends that Education ReEnvisioned be prepared to move forward with conducting the independent third party report in the event that it is requested.

If requested, the third party report should be submitted to CDE as soon as possible since a final determination cannot be made until all requested information has been provided. Background Information, Description of Need:

The Colorado Department of Education has issued our District Performance Framework (DPF) and School Performance Frameworks (SPF). These are just preliminary ratings at this time and the final frameworks will be issued after the Request to Reconsider has been submitted and the process finalized.

The Request to Reconsider draft was due on September 14. The Colorado Department of Education (CDE) will review the draft and provide feedback for the final draft due on October 15. This year there were two paths that we could take in our request since we were approved for three different codes for Colorado Preparatory Academy (CPA), and Pikes Peak Online School (PPOS) has been Alternative Education Campus (AEC) approved.

Our official DPF and SPFs are attached, and I will be presenting our Request to Reconsider information and the two paths noted above for discussion and feedback from our Board of Directors.

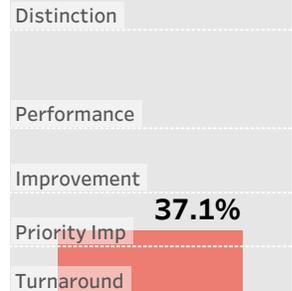

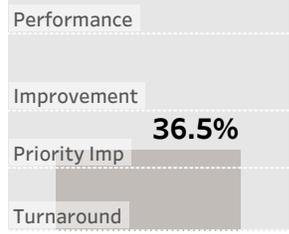

Title of Agenda Item: Enrollment Update

Item Type: Action Information Discussion

Background Information, Description of Need: As we prepare for the amended budget process, the first and biggest issue to know and understand is the student count that will be funded, and how that compares to the original adopted budget.

Relevant Data and Expected Outcomes: Student count at the two schools, CPA and PPOS, are both up over last year and higher than the original budget as well. The increased student count will result in more funds being available to serve the students through our contracted service provider, K12, as well as the EDreINV – directed services handled through the Oversight and Shared Support Costs (OSSC) structure, and then, as well, provide a limited increase to the Administrative Revenue that is charged at 3% of revenue.

Recommended Course of Action/Motion Requested: We will continue to monitor this up to and through the official ‘October Count’ process in preparation for determining the amended budget for the year.

In this month's Business Director report, you will see the financials as submitted to the auditor. So, while still technically, unaudited, they are final from our perspective and we would not anticipate any material changes from the audit process.

These result reflect an improved fund balance in the general funds of 3.6%, up from last year's ending 3.1% figure. This does include fully writing off the unpaid balance from STEMsCO. As a result, any repayment we might receive from them in the future would effectively be new revenue in that fiscal year.

All of the peripheral activities are basically wrapped up as of this report – those regarding not only STEMsCO, but our former participation and support of the CEL grant with the former partners of CDLS and iLC as well. Therefore, we head into the new year with good clarity and focus and much more security from a financial perspective than a year ago.

After the audit process concludes, we will be able to distribute that final report with any reconciliation of what changes between now and then.

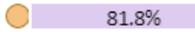
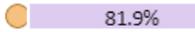
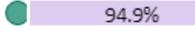
