Wildcat Spotlight—Sean Jochum/Brian Uebelhor-Future Indiana Diploma—JHS Update-Geoff Mauck Jasper High School counselors Sean Jochum and Brian Uebelhor gave a presentation on the future Indiana diploma. The new plan will offer diplomas with different seals, and an emphasis on experiential and work-based learning. The draft hasn't been finalized, so the counselors said there are some areas where advising parents is difficult since the classes aren't completely approved. Mr. Jochum stated there will be two sets of students on two different types of diplomas.

Mr. Uebelhor discussed the new diploma seals, explaining that the new Enrollment seal will function in much the same way that the honors diploma did. There will be three seals the student can achieve which are Enrollment+, Employment+, and Enlistment+. They explained what would be required for each seal.

Jasper High School Principal Geoff Mauck gave an update on Jasper High School, detailing the many clubs, organizations, and activities at the high school. The Student Council was voted the best in Indiana, and student athletes have continued to impress with three SIAC Championship teams and five sectional championship wins.

Building & Maintenance Update—The Stenftenagel Group

Mr.Stenftenagel asked approval for the proposal to replace JMS Unit F roof membrane at a cost of \$93,475.00 from South Central Roofing.

A motion by Steve Lukemeyer, second by Arlet Jackle, to approve the JMS Unit F roof membrane replacement, was unanimously approved by the Board.

Wiffle Ball Field Project—Terry Gobert

Mr. Gobert presented plans for a new wiffle ball field and other improvements to the existing baseball complex. The wiffle ball project will be funded entirely by donations from Friends of Baseball. The project will include a turf wiffle ball field. There will be a four-foot outfield fence with safety capping that will surround the field, which will be accessible to the public when not in use for organized events. Additional improvements include new concrete walkways, bleachers, and a viewing deck. The project will also incorporate salvaged elements from the existing Ruxer Field, such as foul poles and a deck from behind the field house. He stated a family reached out to him with a generous donation for the project. Mrs. Jackle stated it sounds like it's going to be great for the community.

Dr. Lorey stated the renaming of the facility to include the Gobert family name was proposed by school officials in recognition of the family's dedication to the baseball program. Dr. Lorey stated the program that we have is successful because of the family passion that the Gobert's give to the program. It is her recommendation to rename the field to Alvin C. Ruxer Field at Gobert Family Park.

A motion by Steve Lukemeyer, second by Sara Schmidt, to rename the complex to Alvin C. Ruxer Field at Gobert Family Park, was unanimously approved by the Board.

Mr. Stenftenagel asked for approval of the repair/replacement of the soccer fence repair at JMS for \$24,323.52 with K & W's PV Fencing.

A motion by Arlet Jackle, second by Steve Lukemeyer, to approve the soccer fence repairs and replacement at JMS with K & W's PV Fencing for \$24,323.52, was unanimously approved by the Board.

Mr. Stenftenagel asked the Board to approve the SafeEVAC system and to develop bids and specifications for the project. Jasper High School has been identified as a potential site for the installation of the SafeEVAC system. This is a newly developed intelligent evacuation system. SafeEVAC's Technology utilizes next generation AI threat identification, first responder notification patented and patent-pending directional signage and intelligent evacuation software.

A motion by Sara Schmidt, second by Dr. Englert, to approve the SafeEVAC system bids and specifications project, was unanimously approved by the Board.

Dr. Lorey asked the Board to approve the NEOLA policy updates. The Board was given the policies at the last Board meeting.

A motion by Dr. Englert, second by Arlet Jackle, to approve the NEOLA policy updates, was unanimously approved by the Board.

Dr. Lorey asked the Board to approve the 2025 Conflict of Interest statement for Mrs. Jackle. The conflict of interest is because Mrs. Jackle drives a bus for the school corporation and is on the School Board.

A motion by Steve Lukemeyer, second by Dr. Englert, to approve the Conflict of Interest for Arlet Jackle was voted 4-0 with Mrs. Jackle abstaining from the vote.

Dr. Lorey asked the Board to approve the 2025 Conflict of Interest statement for Brady Gunselman. The conflict of Interest is because Mr. Gunselman is our grounds supervisor for the school corporation and owns Brady Gunselman G-Crew LLC with cleans up after football games at Alumni Stadium. A motion by Steve Lukemeyer, second by Sara Schmidt, to approve the Conflict of Interest for Brady Gunselman, was unanimously approved by the Board.
