You couldn't wipe the smile off West High's Joseph Viviano's face this summer when he found out that he was accepted into The St. Louis Symphony Youth Orchestra (SLSYO) trombone section for the 2023-2024 season.

"I checked my email several times a day waiting to find out the results because I was so anxious to know the outcome," Viviano detailed. "On that Tuesday morning, it was the third time I had checked my email, and there it was, the '23/24 SLSYO Audition Results.' My heart rate went up instantly as I read through the email and saw, 'You have been selected to be a member of the 2023/2024 St. Louis Symphony Youth Orchestra.' I have never been more relieved to know the outcome of something; I was very excited and couldn't stop thinking about it."

Viviano, a senior at West High, started playing for fun in the fourth grade, but his interest in playing organized music sparked in sixth grade during West Middle's jazz band concert. "Since that moment, I knew that was the path I wanted to take, and soon after, joined the jazz band," he said.

He is now involved in marching band,

jazz band, pep band, and pit for West High's musicals; he plays tenor/bass trombone and baritone, and his list of accomplishments is impressive. On his resume, including being accepted into the SLSYO trombone section, Viviano has accomplished 2nd trombone in All-Suburban band, 2021-22; 4th trombone in All-State band, 2021-22; 1st trombone and baritone in All-Suburban, 2022-23; 2nd trombone in All-State jazz band 2022-23; gold rating for trombone solo at Missouri State High School Activities Association Solo and Ensemble, 2022-23; and Drum Major for the marching band, 2023-24.

"What has stood out most in my experience at West High is all the great people I have met," Viviano said. "Each year, I have made multiple new friends in marching band. Many I talk to and often see outside of school; it has definitely enhanced my high school experience a ton, and I can't recommend joining it enough."




Hazelwood Central Football Star Tionne Gray Leads By Example and Aspires to Make History

Hazelwood Central High School has a long list of notable alumni in the school's history, including the football program's head coach and Super Bowl champion, Carey Davis. With Coach Davis' guidance, Hawks senior Tionne Gray is looking to add his name to that list.

"He has the opportunity to put his name on the list of some of the best to ever play here. I want that for him, he wants that for himself, and he wants the team to have success as well," Coach Davis said.

Tionne, an offensive and defensive lineman, enters his last football season at Central High with much-deserved hype from national and local talent evaluators. He currently ranks as a top 10 football prospect in Missouri by outlets such as ESPN, Rivals.com, and 247sports.com, among others.

The four-star recruit, who has verbally committed to the University of Oregon, was recently named to the preseason All-St. Louis County team by prepredzone.com for his work on the defensive line. As a junior, Tionne was named to the All-Conference team in the Suburban Conference Yellow Pool division and named to the All-District team for Class 6 District 2.

His goals going into his senior year are straight and to the point. "I want 50 or more tackles, 10 tackles for loss, 10 quarterback sacks, and as a team, I want to win state," Tionne exclaimed. "I want to make history."

Going into his senior year, the coaching staff raves about the leader Tionne has become for the Hawks football team.

"He's a leader, both on and off the field," Coach Davis boasted. "He works hard, does everything you ask of him, and leads by example. It's always interesting to me that the players who get recruited the most and have the highest ceilings are the ones who work the hardest; it sets the example for the other players."

"I'm trying to be more of a leader, making sure our team is always working together and not against each other," Tionne said. "We have to be together and have that chemistry so we can win state!"

Today, O'Neal oversees all 16 of Midwest BankCentre's branches and over 80 retail employees, nearly 30% of the bank's staff.



HSD's Explore Teaching Program Produces New Teachers for the District

In 2012, West High piloted the Exploring Teaching Program to allow students to explore the education industry while taking various courses throughout the pathway. Alexis Wells was the first teacher cadet and now works at Russell Elementary as a second-grade long-term substitute teacher. However, she's not the only one, as the program has come full circle with two former students starting their careers as full-time teachers in the Hazelwood School District.

Brooke Wenzara, a 2018 West High and Exploring Teaching Program graduate, accepted a job at Jamestown Elementary and will teach first grade. Sara Plambeck, also a 2018 graduate, accepted a position at Lusher Elementary and will teach fourth grade.

In the DESE-approved Career and Technical Education (CTE) program, Wenzara and Plambeck learned about different industries while applying that knowledge through their coursework in various capacities within HSD's elementary schools and middle schools. In these settings, they worked with classroom teachers and librarians to gain a deeper insight into their chosen career path.

"During my time in the Explore Teaching Program, it helped me solidify that I wanted to go into education for my career," detailed Wenzara. "The program provided the opportunity to work in elementary classrooms and a daycare setting. A lot of the content I learned through the program helped me in my first year in college. My favorite part was that I got



to experience working with students before I even started college."

The program is open to all high school seniors in HSD. Students must have senior status to participate in the Exploring Teaching Capstone and Exploring Teaching Internship courses.

New Gymnasium Floors At Central High, West High, and the Opportunity Center Bring Excitement to HSD

In May 2023, the HSD Board of Education approved utilizing Prop H funds for repairs/refinishing of the floors for the Central High School field house and small gym, the West High School main gym, and the Opportunity Center main gym. As the 2023-2024 school year begins, students and the schools' sports teams will be able to enjoy the finished product.

"The back to school fair was the grand opening of the new gym floor," said Subrinia Chappelle, West High's Athletic and Activities Director. "The community was able to see the amazing finished project, and the volleyball team is looking forward to playing on the new floor this fall season."

"Having a new gym floor is extremely exciting. Not only does it greatly enhance the appearance of the gym and our school, but it also reflects the investment into our students and the environment we are creating for education and extracurricular activities," detailed Dr. Nicholas Howard, Central High's Athletic and Activities Director. "This is something we want to show off to our community and visitors. This also enhances school spirit and excitement for all stakeholders to be able to use such a nice gym."

These are just the latest improvements in a long list of projects following the approval of Prop H in November. Prop H was a \$130 million zero-tax-rate-change bond issue ballot measure for the Hazelwood School District. Prop H was approved by nearly 80% of voters.

"Having a large bond issue pass is extremely exciting just knowing the entire school community is truly invested in creating the very best environment for student achievement both inside and outside the classroom," exclaimed Dr. Howard. "Having new and improved facilities not only enhances the student experience, but it will continue to attract families to come to our schools for years to come. Prop H funding is going to allow our students to utilize facilities and tools that will enhance their learning environment and overall high school experience."

The “New Hazelwood Central” Featuring A Renewed Focus On Student and Family Engagement

With the start of the 2023-2024 school year, Hazelwood Central High School is renewing its focus on customer service, student engagement, student voice, and outreach and partnerships with our families.

“I’m excited about the things we have planned for our school community,” Dr. Syreeta Holland, building principal at Central High, said. “We have worked tirelessly to provide updates to our campus and within the walls of CHS. Although we have made significant gains, we are excited by what is still to come.”

“I am excited about the new students, staff, and administrative team,” said Dr. Rhonda Key, Assistant Superintendent for High School Education. “We look forward to the new school year at the new Central High School.”

Part of the school’s excitement comes with the new administrative team. Led by Dr. Holland, the administrative team consists of Cori Cloyd, 9th-grade assistant principal; Anthony Smith, 10th-grade assistant principal; Jami Vault, 11th-grade assistant principal; Joshua Fullerton, 11th and 12th-grade assistant principal; and Cassandra Brown, 12th-grade associate principal.

In addition, among the new faces at Central High is the school athletics and activities director, Dr. Nicholas Howard, who brings 14 years of educational leadership experience to HSD.

“I am really excited to engage our students about all the opportunities we can provide at such a large high school like Hazelwood Central,” Dr. Howard explained. “The first thing we focused on is improving the lines of consistent communication with all stakeholders. Now that we have fluent communication, we can implement effective practice,

and from there, we can build trust and phenomenal relationships. We want to create that family atmosphere with all stakeholders so we can create an environment for student achievement.”

Communication with parents is a central focus for school leaders, with the team planning intermittent opportunities for stakeholders to have their voices heard at community forums.

There is a heightened sense of focus on culture and climate, with visual reminders as you walk the halls of Central High and see the new decor, highlighting major universities from across the country, historically black colleges and universities (HBCUs), character words, and positive affirmations.

“We are working to create a welcoming environment for all students, which is evident by the flags from various countries that are represented in our student population,” Dr. Holland said. “Part of our back to school professional development entailed educators discussing how they will contribute to the positive atmosphere of our school and take ownership of the culture and climate.”

Dr. Holland and her team are working to rewrite the school’s mission and vision, expand inclusivity, better detail expectations, and improve instruction.

“We will be revamping our extended learning opportunities while focusing on creating career pathways and highlighting pathways to allow students to earn various certifications,” Dr. Holland detailed.

Hazelwood Central will continue to be a great place to learn for all students, and we look forward to providing exceptional customer service and support to them and their families.

Pre-K Program Expansion Sees Record Enrollment

The Hazelwood School District is excited about the record Pre-K enrollment following the expansion of our Early Childhood Education Program! A new addition for the 2023-2024 school year, the redesigned Pre-K Early Childhood Program is now offered at all 19 elementary schools, and each classroom also reserves tuition-based spots for staff and the community.

“This expansion has been a part of the district’s vision for several years, and I am proud to see it come to fruition,” said Hazelwood School District Superintendent, Dr. Nettie Collins-Hart.

There are 31 Pre-K classrooms at elementary school sites and 317 students at those sites. In total, there are now 57 Pre-K classrooms across the district, including Early Childhood Center locations, and 584 students in the Pre-K program. There is also a waiting list.

The Early Childhood Program provides Pre-K services with before and after-school care to district employees at a reduced rate of \$100 per week and \$200 per week for the non-employee rate. There is no fee for students eligible through our free and reduced lunch program. The hours

are 7:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Monday through Friday, when school is in session for HSD staff. Transportation is also provided.

“Hazelwood is also able to offer supports for students that cannot be found in traditional daycare programs,” said Dr. Stacy Ray, Director of Early Childhood Education. “We have curriculum and programs based on standards with a focus on early literacy and mathematics.”

All of Hazelwood’s Pre-K classrooms are taught by teachers certified in early childhood education.

HSD Director of Maintenance, David Dudley, Receives Missouri School Plant Managers Association Facility Manager Certification




The Hazelwood School District Hosts Legislative Update


