# DAILY SCHEDULE AT EAST

School day is 8:35 AM — 3:55 PM.

Students attend seven periods each day (ELA -2 periods, Math, Science, History, PE/Athletics plus one more elective).

There are currently three lunches (A,B,C) which occur during 4<sup>th</sup> period.

Students have a 4-minute passing period to get to their next class.

### TWO CATEGORIES OF ATTENDANCE

### **Excused**

- Medical Notes are best
- Limited number of parent notes before medical notes are required (5 per semester)

### Unexcused

No note after 3 days, the absence becomes unexcused

### WHAT IS FIGHTING? WHAT IS NOT FIGHTING?

### Fighting is...

- Two (or more) students who engage in mutual combat.
- It does not matter who "swings" first.
- If there has been on going conflict that is mutual and one seeks out the other and a fight occurs, it is a fight.
- If your student is having a conflict with someone, they need to let a school staff member know so we can resolve the issue.

### Fighting is NOT...


- If your student is put in a situation where a physical conflict is brought to them unprovoked, then there is a reasonable right to self-defense.
- If your student approaches another student to initiate a conflict unprovoked, then it will be considered assault.
- JH students often engage in physical horseplay, and we work very hard to determine if the situation is a fight or horseplay.

# BE CAREFUL WHAT YOU SAY!


- Please talk to your students about the words they use, what they say, and how they share information.
- Students sometimes make statements that others may find disturbing.
- When this happens, we have no choice but to investigate the statements.
  - Campus SRO and District Attorney are involved
- If it is determined that a threatening statement was made by the DA, then Terroristic Threat charges are filed.
  - This is a mandatory placement at ALA.

# HEAR SOMETHING, SEE SOMETHING, SAY SOMETHING

- If you or your child hears something that doesn't seem right, report it.
- If you or your child sees something that doesn't seem right, report it.
- If something doesn't seem right, it usually isn't.
- We take all of these concerns with the utmost seriousness.



# OVERVIEW OF A TYPICAL SEVENTH-GRADE SCHEDULE



- A "semester" is approximately five months long (2 nine-week grading periods). The first, or fall semester, starts at the beginning of the school year and ends in December, and the second, or spring semester, begins in January and ends at the end of the school year.
- Some courses will meet for one semester; others, like your academic core subjects, will be two semesters (all year) long.




