## PHS Graduation Requirements

- Must earn minimum of 88 credits

- 40 Hours of Community Service

### Freshman Year Schedule

- All Freshmen will take:
  - Biology CP or Honors
  - Math (AIM 1, Algebra 1 or Honors Geometry)
  - World History CP or Honors
  - Genre Studies (ELA) CP or Honors
  - World Language CP or Honors
  - Health and Wellness
  - Electives

A minimum of two years of the same language is required for admission to a 4-year college.



## PROGRAM OF STUDIES

- The Program of Studies lists all the graduation requirements, course descriptions, course pathways and much more. This is important information for students and parents to read!
- Students should read course descriptions prior to selecting courses.
- The Program of Studies will be available for students to download on the Guidance page of the PHS website.



### Course Selection

- Students can only select academic course levels (honors or CP) recommended by teachers
- When selecting courses:
  - Students must select a total of 28 credits
  - Students should select 3 alternates that are <u>different</u> than their elective choices
- All duplicate requests will be deleted. Selecting the same course several times does not increase the chance of getting the course.
- Course selection is NOT first-come, first-serve. It is simply collecting numbers to determine
  which classes to run. Students do not need to be the first person select courses to get a course
  they may want.
- Grade 8 students will select their courses with Ms. McLean during 21<sup>st</sup> Century Skills
- Students should review their course selection with their parents at home

## Course Selection Find the Right Balance!

- Please select courses with care, be mindful of course descriptions and level requirements.
   Review the Program of Studies and read course descriptions.
- Find the balance between realistically challenging and creating a program for success.
- Courses that the students select will determine:
  - The master schedule
  - Number of sections that will be offered of each class
  - Class sizes
  - Teacher workload/equity
- Changes to student schedules can be difficult to accommodate due to scheduling restrictions.

## Titan Time

- Students report to Advisory each Monday to login to Enriching Students to see their Titan Time schedule for the week.
- Any days during the week for which a student is not scheduled, the Advisor works with the student to complete the weekly schedule.
- Students in good academic standing with openings in their weekly schedule can ask their Advisor to schedule them in common areas:
  - The library or cafe to work quietly and independently
  - The gymnasium to participate in planned fitness activities


## The Pathways Program
