
MTHS Engineering Design and Development (EDD) Honors Capstone Class Half Year Presentations (2024-25)



The Engineering Design and Development class held their official half-year presentations on January 6th, displaying the culmination of their research and hard work thus far.

The presentation process had gone smoothly with only a change in dates being an issue. Before the official presentations, the students prepared themselves through a trial run to gain insights on how to improve.





A multitude of alumni (about 15) of the class took the time to come in to personally listen and critique each group's presentations on January 2nd. There was a larger influx of returning students compared to previous years, increasing the stakes and expectations placed on them.

One notable alumni was **Audrey Chen**, a Computer Science major studying at **Carnegie Mellon University** who also interned at **Lockheed Martin** (A defense manufacturer responsible for creating new technologies for national security). Using her coding expertise, she worked on numerous projects fixing issues on battleship systems or on radars with her team. We were lucky to have her come in and speak to our AP Computer Science Principles sections on her own experiences and how students can reach or go beyond where she has gotten.



The students utilized the feedback they had received to perfect every aspect of their presentation. This not only would assist them on the upcoming date, but help with solidifying their foundational skills of presenting for when they continue on their future journey.

Cognizant of what had to be improved and how to ensure the official presentation goes as smoothly as possible, the EDD students went into the weekend knowing they were ready to crush their project proposals.

The topics addressed in their presentations consisted of:

- Overcooked or Undercooked Food
 - Bike Phone Stands
 - The Modular Outdoor Gardening Irrigation System
 - Indoor Plant Hydration






The students faced panelists, who came in to evaluate their proposals and give a few comments on what they think of their justifications. We are grateful to these panelists as they attended despite their busy schedules.

Those who attended included district supervisor Mr. Zachary Morolda, the teacher liaison for MEF grant the EDD students received, Ms. Kristin Miller, Ms. Athena Evans, a current employee of Lockheed Martin and alumni of the program.

The half-year presentations were an incredible learning experience for the students as they continue to work on their projects. All of the feedback, data, and research they have collected thus far will allow them to get closer to a **working prototype in June** when their final presentations occur. Until then, they will continue with their outreach to experts and collaborating with each other to solve their issue of choice.

All of our students have worked diligently and we can't wait to see what great things they will accomplish!

AP Computer Science principles (PLTW)



Students in 3 Project Lead the Way (PLTW) AP CSP classes were approved to be part of the Lockheed Martin's Code Quest Academy.

First virtual sessions with assigned mentors - showcased the significance of Computer Science in our country's top defense company. We have successfully had multiple follow-up sessions where they worked on problem sets created by Lockheed Martin professionals by using Python language in the Visual Studio Code (VSC) interface that the students use in the class to work on their PLTW Project Based curriculum learning environment.

Students teams mentored will be competing in the annual worldwide CODE Quest and CYBER Quest competitions conducted in the Lockheed Martin Moorestown NJ location during the month of March. 2025.



MTHS students currently enrolled in AP Computer Science Principles are eligible for a Dual Credit* opportunity due to a partnership between Monroe Township High School and Rowan University for Spring 2025.

The PLTW Computer Science curriculum taught at MTHS has been approved by the university and students get college credit at a discounted rate per credit.

Dual Enrollment programs enable students to take courses concurrently at two separate institutions: typically, dual enrollment participants are high school students who enroll at a partner college or university and take approved undergraduate courses, taught by university faculty/adjuncts/HS teachers hired as adjuncts in person at a pre-approved high school.

We are very proud of all of our students and their accomplishments!
