WHAT WILL YOU CREATE?



HIGH SCHOOL PROGRAM (HSP): Ages 14–17

STUDENTS MUST BE 14 BY JUNE 1 TO ATTEND.

HSP welcomes high school-aged students to either the day or boarding program. Day students participate seven days a week and may choose whether or not to attend dinner with the boarding students and participate in evening cultural activities. Boarding students are housed in state-of-the-art dormitories on-campus, and meals and accommodations are included in tuition.

LEARN

Language-based courses include English as an Additional Language (EAL) and French. Students also participate in a Discovery class in which teachers share their passions for arts, culture, sports, adventure, and more.

Project-based courses include a number of inspiring, creative, and interesting subjects. All require a minimum English level.

HOW IT WORKS:

- Choose a course to study.
- Classes meet for four hours on weekday mornings.
- · Classes are small (usually around 12 students).
- A strong level of English is necessary for many courses, and if students' language levels don't meet requirements, they will be placed in an appropriate EAL class.

ENGLISH AS AN ADDITIONAL LANGUAGE

- Improve confidence and fluency.
- Focus on English skills in all four disciplines: reading, writing, speaking, listening.
- Immerse yourself in an English environment.
- Courses are offered for English language-learners of all levels.

FRENCH

- Focus on language and Francophone culture.
- · Learn through food, songs, films, and field trips.
- Courses include beginner and intermediate levels (not appropriate for advanced learners).

ACADEMIC WRITING

- Focus on structuring narrative, expository, and persuasive essays.
- Learn tips for how to use AI and other web-based tools.
- · Discuss integrity issues around Al.
- Leave with a portfolio of work to enhance school and university applications.

- Attend a required weekend trip to the Vitra Design Museum in Germany (additional cost).


DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY

FASHION & TEXTILE DESIGN

- Engage with fashion illustration and design.
- Create using indigo dyeing, silk painting, and block printing.
- Discuss today's industry challenges, such as sustainability and being conscious consumers.
- Go on field trips to Milan to tour Italian ateliers, textile factories, and fashion museums.





INTRODUCTION TO INVESTMENT

- · Learn investment techniques and strategies.
- Use virtual capital to create an investment portfolio and discuss daily progress.
- Benefit from theoretical sessions on the principles of investing, risk profiles, and diversification.
- Discuss investment options, such as bonds, foreign exchange, gold, and cryptocurrency.
- Designed for students aged 15 and older; students must bring their own laptop.

FILMMAKING

- Filmmaking Lab includes learning the craft of film production on and off screen.
- Craft an original script in the Screenwriting Lab.
- Learn the basics of acting on film for the On-Screen Acting Lab.
- · Create an original short film.
- This course is designed for students 15 and older.

FINE ART PORTFOLIO

- Expect an intensive drawing and painting course.
- Use classic techniques taught for centuries to enhance existing skills
- Prepare for AP or IB Art courses.
- Leave with a portfolio of work to enhance university applications.
- A recommendation from an art teacher is preferred.

LA CUCINA ITALIANA

- Enjoy hands-on lessons from a professional working chef.
- Cook delicious multi-course meals following complex professional recipes.

- Visit markets to source local ingredients and meet local producers.
- · Learn knife skills, food safety, and hygiene.
- Leave with a knowledge of the food culture of Italy and recipes to share with friends and family.

LEAN STARTUP MASTERCLASS

- Learn the principles of the lean startup approach (build-measure-learn feedback loop).
- Examine how digital innovation has changed entrepreneurship.
- Create a new business with a budget and marketing plan with a team of students.
- Pitch your ideas at TASIS Shark Tank in front of staff and peers.
- Designed for students 15 and older; students must bring their own laptop.

NEXT STOP: BROADWAY!

- Take a comprehensive musical theater class taught by working professionals, including actors, directors, producers, choreographers, and writers.
- Help create and perform in an original musical.
- Learn about costume and set design, stage management, lighting, and direction.
- Feel empowered as you produce a musical for your peers.
- · No previous experience is required.



STEAM (SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, ARTS, MATH)

- Investigate scientific concepts and principles present in our everyday lives.
- Enjoy lab work, creative group projects, and discussions about chemistry, biology, and physics.
- Choose a scientific phenomenon to learn about and explain to others.
- Create posters and projects to display at the Summer Arts Festival.
- · Students must bring their own laptop.

EXPLORE

HSP students go on cultural or adventure trips each weekend.

Day trips explore destinations a short ride from campus, are included in tuition, and are selected upon arrival to campus. Examples include:

- City breaks: Explore Zurich, Lucerne, Milan, or Como
- Adventure breaks: Canyoning, kayaking, whitewater rafting, or caving
- Relaxing breaks: Enjoy an afternoon at lidos in Tesserete, Locarno, or Ascona

Overnight trips take students to destinations further afield for one or two nights. Overnight trips are at an

additional cost and should be booked during the time of application, as space is limited. Examples include:

- · Cultural trips: Explore Venice, Nice, or Rome
- Adventure trips: Challenge yourself in Andermatt,
 Zermatt, or Interlaken
- Experiential trips: Learn to cook, take incredible photos, or write your story in Tuscany

PLAY

Afternoons at HSP are devoted to sports, the arts, and outdoor adventures. Many choices are included in tuition, such as hiking, tennis, dance, rock climbing, yoga, indoor soccer, and indoor volleyball.

Sports Clubs provide a challenging environment for students and *are at an extra cost*. These include Milan Academy Scuola Calcio, Golf Academy, Tennis Academy, CrossFit, sailing, wakeboarding, and waterskiing.

MIDDLE SCHOOL PROGRAM (MSP): **Ages 11–13**

STUDENTS MUST BE 11 BY JUNE 1 TO ATTEND.

MSP welcomes middle school-aged students to either the day or boarding program. Day students participate seven days a week and may choose to return home either before dinner or after evening cultural activities. Boarding students are housed in state-of-the-art dormitories on-campus, and meals and accommodations are included in tuition.

LEARN

Language courses help students build confidence in their language skills and improve their fluency.

- English as an Additional Language (all levels offered)
- Italian (beginner level offered)
- · French (beginner and intermediate levels offered)

Project courses include a number of inspiring, creative, and interesting subjects. *All require a minimum English level.*

HOW IT WORKS:

- · Choose one of the courses listed below.
- · Classes meet for four hours on weekday mornings.
- Classes are small (usually around 12 students).
- A strong level of English is necessary for a few of the courses, and if students' language levels don't meet requirements, they will be placed in an appropriate EAL class.

CREATIVE WRITING

- Practice using literary devices and shaping narratives.
- · Strengthen critical thinking skills.
- Discuss AI and the importance of original and creative thinking.
- This course is designed for to native speakers or nearfluent students who are taught primarily in English during the academic year.

DIGITAL PHOTOGRAPHY

- Learn camera features, composition, lighting techniques, and image processing.
- Take field trips to shoot the stunning scenery of Ticino.
- · Students must bring their own DSLR camera.

MUSICAL THEATER

- Participate in any way you wish—acting, production design, costume design, and more!
- Build confidence and improve performance skills.

- · Create an original production alongside your peers.
- Taught by working professionals, including actors, directors, producers, choreographers, and writers.

STEAM (SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, ARTS, MATH)

- · Study how science works in the real world.
- Project-based learning focused on finding solutions and connections to real-world problems.
- Experiment with electronics, coding, engineering design, 3D printing, and programming Arduino boards.

DISCOVERY CLASS

Students choose an afternoon **Discovery class** created by our teachers to share their passions, covering topics ranging from health and wellbeing to book clubs and podcasting. Musical Theater students, however, will focus on rehearsals at this time.

Discovery classes are selected upon arrival to campus.

EXPLORE

Day trips explore destinations a short ride from campus, are included in tuition, and are assigned upon arrival to campus. Examples include the following:



LE CHÂTEAU DES ENFANTS (CDE): **Ages 7–10**

STUDENTS MUST BE 7 BY JUNE 1 TO ATTEND.

CDE welcomes elementary students to either the day or boarding program. Day students participate five days a week and have weekends free. Boarding students participate in exciting clubs and excursions during the weekend. Meals and accommodations are included in tuition.

LEARN

Our language classes are designed to develop confidence and fluency. Along with a language, CDE children are immersed in music, science, movement, and the arts.

Students will select one language course for the duration of the session:

- English (all levels offered)
- French (beginner and intermediate levels offered)
- Italian (beginner level offered)

STEAM

(SCIENCE, TECHNOLOGY, ENGINEERING, ART, AND MATH)

All students attend an hour of STEAM class each afternoon, focusing on creative thinking and problem-solving while using their target language.

EXPLORE

CDE students go on weekly excursions with their language classmates that explore beautiful Ticino. Recent trips have included visiting the Locarno Falconeria, pedal boating on Lake Lugano, and walking on the San Salvatore nature trails.

Boarding students take Saturday trips to destinations further afield. Recent trips have included the Swiss Transport Museum in Lucerne, the Parco San Grato botanical gardens, the Locarno Lido, and a rainy-day favorite, the Splash & Spa water park!

Sundays for boarding students include morning and afternoon clubs where students can play and learn in new ways. Popular clubs have included stand-up paddleboarding, tie-dying t-shirts, nature photography, and horseback riding.





A highlight of the summer is our **camping trip** for all children to a site at the foothills of the Alps. Children build confidence as they help with setting up tents and preparing meals—and, of course, how to make S'mores by a campfire! Both day and boarding students may sign up for camping upon arrival to campus.

PLAY

Morning activities focus on fitness and movement and include swimming, sports, and outdoor activities such as hiking, kickball, or field games. These are selected upon arrival to campus.

Sports Clubs are an alternative to morning activities and are *available at an extra cost*. Milan Academy Scuola Calcio features coaches from AC Milan, and Tennis Junior Camp is for beginner and intermediate players. Sports clubs should be selected during the time of application, as spaces are limited.

Afternoon activities focus on hands-on learning through the arts and sciences. Activities usually include cooking, robotics, crafts, and music. Students can also audition for the CDE musical, where they can explore both acting and production while working on an original musical that will be performed at the Summer Arts Festival.

MINNOWS: Ages 4-6



STUDENTS MUST BE 4 BY JUNE 1 TO ATTEND.

The Minnows welcomes our youngest learners to our beautiful early childhood development center, AI Focolare, just a few minutes down the hill from our main campus. Minnows participate Monday through Friday and have weekends free. Daily snacks and lunches are included in tuition.

LEARN

Minnows spend their days immersed in a creative, engaging, interactive classroom environment and quickly become a tight-knit community of diverse learners. Students will select one language of instruction to focus on for the duration of the session.

- English
- French
- Italian

Our small classes focus on the spoken language, and teachers are encouraged to be as creative as possible, using movement and hands-on activities. Children learn basic vocabulary and use these words while on trips off-campus. Minnows also practice writing and can even learn to read simple sentences. The curriculum is constantly changing to accommodate how quickly the children are learning, with the aim of building confident language-learners.

Students also have a weekly STEAM lesson provided by a STEAM-certified teacher during their language class time, participate in music every day, and build their creativity with arts and crafts projects throughout the week.

EXPLORE

Minnows take weekly field trips that explore the local area. Favorite field trips have included visiting an Alpine farm and learning facts about the animals, going on a nature walk in the Montagnola woods, touring downtown Lugano, visiting Swissminiatur Park, exploring the Bellinzona castles, and hosting a visit from the Apiary and discovering fun facts about bees.

Minnows have the opportunity to attend as either a Standard Day or Extended Day student:

Standard Day

Our Standard Day program is Monday—Friday from 8:45 to 15:00

Extended Day

Extended Day Minnows attend Monday—Friday from 8:45 to 17:30. Four- and five-year-old Minnows are welcome to try the Extended Day program, but if it is not a good fit, they may be asked to shift to the Standard Day program.

PLAY

In the Minnows program, play and creativity are the key ingredients in our recipe for success. Our caring educators encourage interaction, problem-solving, teachable moments, experimentation, innovation, and, of course, laughter.

During Choice Time, students choose from a variety of activities, including arts and crafts, group games, cooking, and playing in the outdoor playground. Activities are designed to promote gross and fine motor skills and encourage communication. Special events include Pirate Day, a Renaissance Fair, and a Science Fair.


