
DAYS

As you may have heard, Mrs. Sparks was offered an excellent opportunity within the Thomas County School system and has taken on her new role as a school nurse. During her time with us, Mrs. Sparks enjoyed working with the students, seeing them grow, and celebrating every successful step they have made. While the students and staff will miss her and all her hard efforts at Bishop Hall, we appreciate her contributions and wish her the best in her next chapter.

Ensuring that there is no gap in the support Bishop Hall provides our students, we would like to introduce you to our newest team member, Brian Phinazee. Mr. Phinazee hails from Coolidge and graduated from TCCHS in 2004 before he enlisted in the US Air Force. During his enlistment, Mr. Phinazee has been stationed at five duty stations, visited over 30 countries, and is a veteran of both Operation Enduring Freedom and Operation Iraqi Freedom. He spent the first half of his career as a Vehicle Operator and changed jobs in Command and Control in 2012, working with 1st Special Operations and at the US Air Force Academy. During his time in uniform, he earned an AA in Transportation and an AA in Emergency Management. In 2015, Mr. Phinazee retired as an E6, Technical Sergeant.

Since his retirement, Mr. Phinazee changed gears and decided to attend Valdosta State University and obtained both a BA and MA in English. During that time, Mr. Phinazee worked with the university tutoring department and taught English 1101 and 1102 for four semesters to first-year college students. After COVID-19, Mr. Phinazee began substituting with the Thomas County Schools for 2024/2025, returning to his Alma Mater.

This academic year, Mr. Phinazee started working at the ISS for Bishop Hall and the Renaissance Center for the first half of the year. After Mrs. Sparks transferred, he moved over to help the IEP Program and Mrs. Bailey at Bishop Hall continues to provide support to our students in various capacities, even taking the initiative to revitalize Bishop Hall's guitar club which has been growing each week.

At Bishop Hall, our students and their education continue to be our top priority. We hope that Mr. Phinazee's background and practical approach to education will further bolster the amazing staff here. We're glad to have Mr. Phinazee join our team!
