A student must earn 22.0 credits for a Regents-endorsed diploma. The core requirements include: 4 credits of English, 4 credits of social studies, 3 credits of mathematics, 3 credits of science, 1 credit of foreign language, 2 credits in physical education, 1 credit in the fine arts and .5 credit of health. In addition, all students must pass the New York State Assessment requirements. Students may also earn a Regents diploma with Advanced Designation by fulfilling additional exam and course requirements. Local diplomas are awarded when appropriate to meet the student's educational needs.

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Academic programs are offered on the Advanced (L4), Regents College Preparatory (L3), and General (L2) levels. To enhance the learning experience, a variety of electives are offered to the students. An honors program is offered in English and social studies. Advanced Placement courses are offered in 14 different areas for students. Several college level courses are offered in conjunction with local universities.
