REPORT OF COMMITTEES OF THE BOARD OF EDUCATION

- Mrs. Young, Buildings and Operations – Auditorium seats replacement for the High School and Middle School is 100% complete. Middle School auditorium lighting installation is still in progress. Fire alarm replacement at Burling and Intermediate 100% complete. The old pedestrian bridge at the Intermediate School has been removed and the installation of the new bridge will commence within the next month or two. HVAC at Franklin and Carson is in the beginning stage. The additional parking lot project in the front of the High School has begun. The bidding process for the STEM school project is in progress.
- Mrs. Young, Superintendent Search – The deadline for the application process is October 31st. Beginning November 1st applications will be separated based on qualifications. Applications will be available for Board Member review at the Administration Building from November 11 – 23 between the hours of 8:30 a.m. – 3:30 p.m. If a member is not available during those hours, evening and/or Saturday hours will be provided. A sample of interview questions was emailed to Board Members for review and approval
- Ms. Johnson, Policy Committee – Proposed policies were reviewed and are ready to move forward. Policy 0141 is still being investigated for more detail. The Committee agreed to present another policy at the November meeting for approval at the December meeting.
- Ms. Johnson, NJSBA Board of Directors – Key takeaways points from September 20th Board meeting:
 - Each summer the auditors conduct a thorough review of the Association's finances. The final report is then presented to the board of directors in November.

- Workshop 2024 is coming up on the 21st – 24th of this month and will feature 200 training sessions as well as an expansive exhibit floor, student performances and special events. The agenda can be found on the NJSBA website as well as on the mobile app..
- Mandated training changes – Last year the NJSBA made changes to the Governance I program, this year they updated the Governance II program. The area of focus for the update was policy. Setting district policy is a primary responsibility of any board of education and oftentimes new board members get assigned to their district’s policy committee. Adding more comprehensive information on policy in Gov. 2 will help new board members have a better understanding of policy making.
- This year nine boards were awarded certification in the Spring and eleven in the Fall. Certified Board means that each Board Member has attended classes and training to become a certified Board Member which helps make the Board more efficient. All members of the Board must be certified in order to achieve the status of a Certified Board.
- Ms. Johnson – Attended college night at the High School. There was an excellent turnout with about 200-300 parents in attendance. Visited the model UN club where students compete in debating. We have a great team that’s starting. Our Cheerleaders will compete in November. Thanked Ms. Kelly and the Students.

REPORT OF BOARD SOLICITOR

- **Mr. Li – Current proposals in legislature:**
 - **Senate bill 3783 – Will prohibit municipalities including school districts from purchasing, installing or using artificial turf on it's playing fields. There is a provision built into the bill that will allow current and existing fields that have artificial turf to continue to be used.**
 - **Senate bill 3666 – Will require school districts to provide instruction on the risk of compulsive gambling as part of the New Jersey student learning standards in the Health and Physical Education curriculum.**
 - **Senate 3790 – Will require mandatory child abuse record background checks for staff members in addition to the criminal background check.**
 - **Senate bill 3695 – Will require the Department of Education to develop a cell phone and social media policy to be followed by all school districts in the state.**
 - **Senate bill 3447 – Will establish a special education transportation task force. The force will focus on the best practices for special education transportation.**
