It does, however, respectfully suggest that citizens attempt to resolve concerns by speaking directly to school administrators before bringing it to the Board. Individuals with a relevant interest in the function or duties of the Board are invited to speak a maximum of five (5) minutes on any one issue. You are required to give your name and address before speaking.

Executive Meetings are conducted when the Board of Education must review and discuss confidential matters. By illustration, pending legal cases, personnel matters, and collective bargaining proposals are appropriate reasons for the Board to hold an Executive Session. These meetings are not open to the public.

3. ***BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Township of Pennsauken*** to amend the November 21, 2013 Business Agenda Item #4 to read as follows:

BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Township of Pennsauken to approve bussing for the Middle School program “Accessing Your Potential” (AYP) Monday – Thursday, 2:30pm-4:30pm, from January 12, 2014 through June 13, 2014. The program addresses areas of academic weakness in mathematics and language arts literacy utilizing Scholastic’s researched-based Read-About program and teacher developed curriculum in mathematics and language arts. The teachers listed below will design, coordinate and teach the program on an as needed basis at a cost of \$40 per hour, not to exceed \$25,000.

The program will operate from January, 2014 through April, 2014, 3-4:30p.m. Monday through Thursday. Students will be provided snacks and have supervised recreation. The following teachers will design coordinate and teach the program: Michael McCoach, Timothy Gilbride, Elizabeth Bieryla, Elizabeth Procida, Kimberly Ciurlino, Nancy Dodimead, Patricia Rustico, and Janelle Wright at a cost of \$40 per hour each. Cost of the program is not to exceed \$6,000.00.

6. ***BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Township of Pennsauken*** to develop a partnership with New Jersey Academy for Aquatic Sciences, NJAAS and the Adventure Aquarium. This partnership could include any of the following ideas, as developed cooperatively and dependent on funding acquired in partnership with NJAAS through grants: enhance professional development for teachers, pursue extracurricular or summer programs for students, and include high school career connections.

Justification: The NJAAS can promote STEM career objectives and opportunities. The students can benefit in experiences based on lessons, activities, and internships.

7. ***BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Township of Pennsauken to approve*** a virtual lab product by Sparkplug Learning to pilot and/or test the product in third grade classes where wireless internet is available. Sparkplug Learning has developed a prototype that is designed to provide students an authentic digital laboratory. Sparkplug Learning has indicated that it would provide tablets to students to engage in three 30-minute online lab experiences during the 2014-2015 school year, based on successful application. There is no cost to the Board.

Justification: Virtual lab experience has connected well to STEM initiatives. The topic of choice is Ecology during the 30-minute exercise.
