3. **BE IT RESOLVED by the Board of Education of the Township of Pennsauken** to approve Alex Cooper, Department of Environmental Protection, to visit the Pennsauken Intermediate School 6th grade science lab to do presentations for several 6th grade classes on the environment and watershed applications. Possible dates for the visit are November 28, November 30, or December 3, 2012.

Justification: The 6th grade science curriculum includes an environmental science unit. This program can enrich this program and connects to our continued push towards STEM concepts and integration.

December 3, 2012 through to April 25, 2013 and utilize the following programs Scholastic's Read About for reading remediation, First in Math to reinforce math facts and Alex Mathematics to reinforce skills and concepts. All of the programs are web-based computer and researched based. Students will also have access to the programs at home for continued practice if they have internet access. Staffing for the program consist of 4 -6 teachers at a cost not to exceed \$30,000. Account – Title I

Justification: The program is designed to assist students who need additional assistance in math and language arts.
