
IAAP 4+1 (ARTS) PATHWAY AND CIVICS PATHWAY

WHAT IS THE INDIVIDUAL ARTS ASSESSMENT PATHWAY (IAAP)?

For a NYS Regents Diploma: *An approved pathway to graduation *Students must meet credit requirements (22 credits) *Students must pass 4 regents (one of each in ELA, Math, Science, Social Studies) plus chose a pathway



WHAT ARE THE PATHWAYS?

Pathway	Students must successfully complete:
Arts Pathway	 an additional Arts course (or sequence) culminating in a Department-approved pathway assessment; and the culminating <u>Department-Approved Pathway Assessment in the Arts;</u> or the <u>Individual Arts Assessment Pathway (IAAP) requirements</u>. Note the IAAP will be piloted beginning in Fall 2022.
Career and Technical Education (CTE) Pathway	 a <u>NYSED-Approved CTE Program</u> and the culminating 3-part technical assessment.
Career Development and Occupational Studies (CDOS) Pathway	 the <u>CDOS Commencement Credential Requirements</u> (Option 1 or Option 2).
Civics Pathway	the <u>Seal of Civic Readiness requirements</u> .
Humanities Pathway	 an additional Social Studies or English Language Arts course culminating in a Regents or Department-approved alternative assessment; and the culminating Regents Exam or Department-Approved Alternative.
STEM Pathway	 an additional Science or Mathematics course culminating in a Regents or Department-approved alternative assessment; and the culminating <u>Regents Exam</u> or <u>Department-Approved</u> <u>Alternative</u>.
World Languages Pathway	 a sequence of World Languages courses culminating in a Department-approved pathway assessment; and the culminating <u>Department-Approved Pathway Assessment in</u> <u>World Languages</u>.

WHAT'S THE PLAN?



We have applied for and have been approved to provide the Individual Arts Assessment Pathway (IAAP).



Based on teacher recommendation, students have the option to accelerate and take studio in art during 8th grade.

All students will have the opportunity to take a full credit studio in art class during 9th grade.

Art electives such as art of crafts, sculpture, drawing, creative journaling, graphic design, and painting will be offered for grades 9-12.

Students are required to take 3 full credits in art, maintain a portfolio over the course of 3-4 years, and follow a state approved rubric.

WHAT'S THE PLAN?

Opportunities to earn points will be provided within **Social Studies** classes.

All students will be begin earning points beginning with the middle school capstone project in 8th grade.

Civic Participation and Volunteerism will be encouraged.
