

ACADEMIC CHALLENGE TEAM

Club Advisor - Ms. Nimphius

The ACADEMIC CHALLENGE TEAM competes in dual matches featuring JEOPARDY! like questions in all subject areas. The team competes in three W.A.C.K.O. (WESTCHESTER ACADEMIC CHALLENGE OF KNOWLEDGE ORGANIZATION) tournaments (NOV-JUNE) and the OMAR Q BECKINS tournament (MAR). Tournaments are on Saturdays and winners qualify for the NATIONAL TOURNAMENT in June.
