# Definition of Title I:

- Title I provides federal funding to schools to help students who are struggling academically or at risk of falling behind.
- Title I is allocated to schools based on the percentage of students receiving free/reduced lunch.
- Schools with a percentage of at least 40% are eligible for a schoolwide program.

**General Johnnie Middle School  
Operates a Title I Schoolwide  
Program.**

# Schoolwide means:

- The school uses Title I funds to upgrade the entire educational program of the school.
- Title I funds are used to serve all children in order to raise academic achievement.
- Title I funds will be used to provide additional assistance to all students who experience difficulties in meeting the State's performance targets.

# To be a “Schoolwide” School:

- The school must have a free/reduced lunch count of at least 40%.
- The school must collect and analyze data that affects student achievement.
- The school must develop a comprehensive site plan and annually review the effectiveness of the plan.

# Assessment:

- General Johnnie Wilson Middle School assesses student academic performance three times per year using the IREADY Diagnostic interim assessment to determine academic levels and measure academic growth throughout the year.
- General Johnnie Wilson Middle School students are administered the Ohio State Test in all grades levels. (See next slide)
- General Johnnie Wilson Middle School teachers create high quality assessments aligned to the Ohio content standards used to determine areas of strength and improvement for teacher instructional design and for support in defining individual support for students.
- Teachers meet weekly in teams to analyze student assessment data and design strategies to meet individual students' need to support progress.

Ohio's State Tests are given each spring to measure student's knowledge and skills as follows:
