Dear Jasper-Troupsburg Community,

As we welcome March, we find ourselves at a pivotal point in the school year—balancing the excitement of spring activities with a continued focus on academic growth and future planning. With just a few months left, we remain committed to our vision of instructional excellence, a community of care and wellness, and a culture of collaboration. I'd like to share some important updates from across the district.

Our district has been working diligently to update our website to enhance communication and improve user experience. The new site features a more streamlined look and improved functionality across different devices, including computers, phones, and tablets. This platform will continue to evolve, and we welcome your feedback as we refine it further.

We were pleased to welcome New York State Assemblyman Joseph Sempolinski to the district to discuss the progress of rebuilding the Jasper Building. We shared updates on our ongoing work with FEMA and advocated for additional support to address local costs associated with the second disaster. Assemblyman Sempolinski assured us he would explore ways to help support our efforts.

Our construction management firm, Campus Construction, is now working closely with FEMA as they recalculate costs associated with the first disaster. This is an important step, as having an accurate cost assessment strengthens our case for meeting FEMA's 50% damage threshold, which could lead to a directed relocation of the building. The outcome of this process will ultimately determine our next steps in rebuilding the school.

To keep our community informed, we invite you to attend a public meeting at the Jasper Town Hall on Friday, March 14, from 12:00–1:00 PM to discuss the project. Additionally, you are always welcome to join our Board of Education meeting on March 12 at 6:00 PM in Troupsburg for further updates.

As we move into March, I hope we can start leaving the cold weather behind and enjoy all the opportunities this season brings. Thank you for your continued support, partnership, and dedication to our students' success. If you have any questions or feedback, please feel free to reach out.
