All of the 7th and 8th grade physical education students participated in a hot shots competition during their classes.

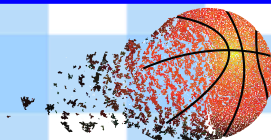

As we observe Black History Month this February, the Trinity Area School District proudly honors the profound contributions of African Americans to our nation's history and culture. Established in 1926 by historian Carter G. Woodson as Negro History Week, this commemoration expanded to a month-long celebration in 1976, coinciding with the birthdays of Abraham Lincoln and Frederick Douglass. The 2025 theme, African Americans and Labor, highlights the pivotal roles Black individuals have played across all sectors of work, from agriculture to industry, often in the face of systemic challenges. We encourage our community to engage in educational events and reflective discussions throughout February, fostering a deeper understanding and appreciation of the enduring legacy and achievements of African Americans.

Ruby Bridges and Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. were the highlights of second grade's biography unit of study this month. Students learned components of a biography, interpreting research, and implementation of text and graphic features.



3rd grade students at Trinity North enjoyed a virtual field trip that took them through the major moments of the Civil Rights Movement. Some of the moments included in the trip were: Brown vs. Board of Education of Topeka, Rosa Parks & the Montgomery Bus Boycott, The Little Rock Nine, Greensboro Sit-Ins, Ruby Bridges, March on Washington, and the Assassination of Dr. Martin Luther King, Jr.



This month, Trinity West talked about significant African American contributors during read aloud time and watched videos about them, including Barack Obama, Simone Biles, Jesse Owens, Jackie Robinson, Mae Jemison, Matthew Henson, Rosa Parks, and Daniel Hale Williams. They also did a unit on Ruby Bridges.

Ms. Tascha Kopko: The Keeper of the Grounds

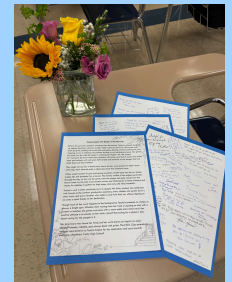
Before the sun even considers stretching over the horizon, Tascha is already bundled up against the bitter cold, her breath visible in the pre-dawn air. She moves with quiet purpose, pushing salt across slick sidewalks, clearing covered parking lots, and chipping away at stubborn ice patches leading to our building entrances. Her gloves are thick, but the cold still seeps in, numbing her fingers. Yet, she presses on—because she knows that soon, teachers will arrive, arms full of books and coffee cups, and students will rush past, half-awake and unaware of the danger that had been there just hours before.



They might not see her in those early hours, but her work speaks for itself—each safe step, each cleared path, a silent assurance that someone cares.

When winter loosens its grip and spring breathes warmth back into the air, Tascha trades her salt spreader for a mower. The steady rumble of the engine carries her through the day as she cuts the grass, trims the edges, and pulls weeds from the flower beds. By the time track season arrives, the infield grass is neatly trimmed and ready for athletes to gather for high jumps, shot puts, and relay handoffs.

Tascha's work is often unnoticed, but it is deeply felt. Every student who celebrates with friends at the outdoor graduation ceremony, every athlete who sprints down a clear track, and every teacher who walks to and from their car without slipping on ice owes a quiet thanks to her dedication.



Though much of her work happens in the background, Tascha's presence on campus is always a bright spot. Whether she's waving from her truck or pausing to chat with a student or teacher, she greets everyone with a warm smile and a kind word. Her positive attitude is as steady as her work—proof that caring for a place is also about caring for the people in it.
