Elementary Parent School Climate Survey

## OVERVIEW

The **Elementary Parent Climate Survey** received **56 responses**, with **30 responses from Carnegie Elementary School** and **26 from Crafton Elementary School**. Overall, the feedback indicates strong parental approval of the school climate, instructional quality, and communication efforts.

## ACADEMIC AND INSTRUCTIONAL QUALITY

Parents largely agree that the schools maintain high academic expectations for all students, with **49 respondents (87%)** indicating that they either “Agree” or “Strongly Agree” that adults at the school uphold high standards. Additionally, **50 parents (89%)** feel that coursework is well-structured and motivates students to learn.

Support for students with learning difficulties was also rated positively, with **48 parents (86%)** agreeing that the schools provide strong support systems for all students, including those with learning challenges.

## SCHOOL CLIMATE AND ENVIRONMENT

The schools foster a welcoming and supportive environment for both students and parents. A notable **53 parents (95%)** feel that the schools have adults who truly care about students, and **52 parents (93%)** agree that cultural diversity is respected within the schools. Additionally, **49 parents (87%)** feel that the schools maintain clean and well-kept facilities.

## COMMUNICATION AND PARENT ENGAGEMENT

Communication between the schools and families was another positive highlight. A total of **46 parents (82%)** feel well-informed about their child’s academic progress, while **47 parents (84%)** believe they receive adequate information about school activities. Furthermore, **50 parents (89%)** agreed that the school responds promptly to phone calls, messages, and emails, reflecting a strong commitment to family engagement.

## STUDENT SUPPORT AND SERVICES

In terms of emotional and counseling support, **48 parents (86%)** believe that quality services are available to assist students with social and emotional needs. Additionally, **42 parents (75%)** feel that the schools provide healthy food choices, though this area received slightly lower agreement levels compared to other aspects of the survey.

## OVERALL TAKEAWAY

The results suggest a **strongly positive** perception of the elementary schools, particularly in the areas of **academic expectations, school climate, parent communication, and student support**. Areas for further consideration could include **enhancing food choices** to meet parent expectations.

This feedback will be valuable in guiding school improvement efforts and ensuring continued success in fostering a **safe, supportive, and engaging learning environment** for all students.
