Announcement from the Greater Twin Cities Youth Symphonies

We are excited to announce that Denae Olsen was the recipient of the third annual Greater Twin Cities Youth Symphonies School Music Grant. Denae receive some wonderful testimonials from teachers and students!

From a student:

"Ever since Denae Olsen started at Murray three years ago, her dedication has fueled the music program to grow significantly. When I started at Murray, I thought I was just going to be playing the cello, but at the moment I stepped into that music classroom I was a cellist. And that's what Ms. Denae does. Despite a limited budget, she instills a passion & love for music in each and every one of her students, making a huge impact on the Murray music community."

From a private music teacher:

"I've had the pleasure of working with Denae through teaching flute students who attend her school the last two years. She has such a passion for bringing accessible music education to a diverse student body that is relatable and fun. The progress the students make from the start of the school year to the end is quite inspiring and it is clear that the students love being around her. The work that she does with limited resources is quite astounding, especially with the current SPPS budget cuts in the arts which has made it challenging to ensure the students have maintained instruments and supplies. She cares so much for the students that she often pays for items out of pocket."

This \$1,000 grant for a public-school orchestra or band program can be used for instruments, music, and supplies. GTCYS received a total of **170 total nominations** for **56 school music programs** during the brief nomination window in January. These nominations told stories of phenomenal teaching, inspirational impact, and serious need. We are honored to provide the annual tradition of the GTCYS School Music Grant, and we will continue to dedicate our time and resources to supporting and partnering with the Twin Cities' vibrant music education community.

Breakthrough is a FREE 6-year college readiness program. Our Breakthrough summer program blends academics with summer camp-style fun for middle school students. During the school year we offer advising and enrichment through middle and high school, and provide individual college counseling once our students are in 11th grade. Our college counselors work with students to explore college options including financial aid and scholarships, and the average Breakthrough student graduates high school with financial aid in place to cover 89% of their college costs.

Breakthrough is free to the students and families we serve. Students must apply to the program, and commit to working hard and participating in Breakthrough!

Our program serves students that may have barriers to a 4 -year college, and our goal is to close that gap. All of our students must meet at least ONE of the following need criteria:

- Single Parent household
- First generation to graduate college
- Identify as a race/ethnicity that is under-represented in college
- Qualify for free/reduced lunch
- Speaks a language other than English at home

For 8th grade families:

Here is some info from the Murray counselors (Justine Revermann and Stephanie Lee) as your student prepares for high school:

- **Como Park 9th grade Registration: Thursday, April 10th from 5-7PM at Como Park High School**
 - Please prioritize this as your student needs to register for their high school classes.
- Roseville: Contact their enrollment office at Enrollment@isd623.org or 651-635-1626. If they are attending Roseville - tell the SPPS Placement Center to take them off 9th grade SPPS enrollment.

Nearly all Murray 8th graders are automatically enrolled at Como Park High School - based on your address. If you do NOT want to attend Como, please apply to the high school of choice (you might not get transportation if it's out of your living area and might be put on a waiting list). If your student is not attending SPPS for high school (such as Roseville), please contact the SPPS placement Center (651-632-3700) and let them know where they will be going and to remove them from SPPS enrollment for next year. Most Murray students end up going to Como for high school, but another small group go to Roseville or Central, and a handful usually end up going to other high schools.

Held in partnership with University of Minnesota Recreation & Wellness Youth Programs; half of your day at camp will feature recreational activities, and half will be filled with science fun!

- DAY 1** Use your scientific skills and experiment with chemistry at the Analytic Chemistry Lab.
- DAY 2** Visit with the Genomics Center staff where students will extract DNA, learn about cutting edge DNA sequencing methods and see a mini sequencer working. They will also learn about how genes control the development of an organism and examine fruit fly mutants.
- DAY 3** Visit an agricultural field on campus and explore where the plants are grown and how plant doctors help sick plants.
- DAY 4** Tour the St. Paul Campus dairy barn, observe the microbes in a cow's rumen, measure out the feed ingredients for a lactating cow, and lead an assigned calf in the field.
- DAY 5** Visit the Supercomputing Institute and see how we use fast computers to link the information learned on Days 1-4 with the world's vast amount of information on food, animals and plants.
