Covenantal Community

One of the things I like to do—and I know most of our faculty and staff do as well—is open meetings with prayer, especially parent meetings. I believe that when we come together in prayer, even for just a minute or two, God is present in the situation. It also serves as a reminder that we are all working toward the same goal with a common purpose in mind. Our desire is to train each child to love the Lord through a personal relationship with Him and to know that He loves each of us right where we are. If we, as adults, continue to grow in this and demonstrate it to our children, peers, colleagues, and parents, just imagine the impact we could have as a Christian school. Our light would shine so brightly in this community, and we would be known for something truly unique and praiseworthy to God.

I am constantly reminded of God's goodness as I see and hear the students throughout the day:

- Recently, I was invited to the 8th-grade art class, where students selected a

 masterpieces to their peers. Let me just say—we have an incredibly talented
 group of students!
- This morning, I had the privilege of hearing the 3rd graders praise the Lord through song and movement in chapel, followed by a special recognition of our elementary LEGO team for winning first place in last weekend's competition.
- At the end of each day, it's common to see our middle and high school student-athletes practicing or competing on the fields. Right now, if you walk into Wichers Auditorium, you'll also find students rehearsing for next month's musical. (Have you bought your tickets yet?)

We have an amazing, talented group of students that continuously remind us of God's goodness, His faithfulness, and the way that He has made each of us unique! One of the greatest blessings of being in a Christian school is that we can openly celebrate these differences in a way that glorifies God.

This brings us to the third statement in our **BCS Statement of Values**, following **Comprehensive Excellence** and **Biblical Worldview**. We firmly believe that all things come from God and that the Bible is His living Word. Because of this, we believe that it is our mandate to do everything to the best of our abilities for the glory of God.

Our third value is that we strive to be a **Covenantal Community** for our families and students. This value is one of the main reasons we are so adamant about church recommendations and our desire to follow up with families to ensure regular involvement in a Christian church. It is not because we believe ourselves to be better at this than anyone else, that is certainly not the case. Rather, by asking for church attendance, we affirm a shared foundation and starting point for our community. Our community is made up of parents and guardians whose children are set apart by God and who are part of a covenantal community. He has given us a network of like-minded faculty, staff, parents, and students.

This week, I had a conversation with one of our local pastors, and we both agreed on the importance of partnering with churches. We desire to work together in partnership with you so that we can provide students with the strongest possible foundation as they grow and navigate life in this world.

Covenantal means that we have entered into an agreement with God to train our students to believe and profess that He is Lord of all. Our students are set apart by God, and as such, we are all part of His covenantal community—His called believers.




