Information Session Feedback: Siwanoy ES

- 1. Is there a more efficient Option B addition and interior renovation?
- 2. Please provide an analysis of the existing and proposed site areas.
- 3. Vehicle access to the site is not desirable.
- 4. Preservation of Siwanoy's historic architectural appearance is important.
- 5. Is it possible to make the rear play area more secure?
- 6. Is it possible to maintain the pathway through the Siwanoy ES campus?
- 7. Coat storage closets are important for classrooms.
- 8. Renovations should include **door security** upgrades.



Information Session Feedback: Siwanoy ES

- 9. All concepts must be considerate of 'community outdoor life'.
- 10. How will the proposed additions impact **stormwater management** and neighborhood flooding?
- 11. Please keep refuse away from the play area (maintain current system).
- 12. Please add a **kitchen** suitable for preparing meals (not a satellite warming kitchen).
- 13. Information regarding the **construction schedule** would be helpful.
- 14. Information regarding the construction **phasing and logistics** plan would be helpful. How will work occur safely at an occupied building?



Information Session Feedback: General

- 1. Please clarify the instructional space per student analysis.
- 2. Have photovoltaic systems been considered?
- 3. Please provide details of the projected tax impact.
- 4. Is it possible to determine the tax impact by assessed home value?
- 5. Has a long-term plan (20+ years) been developed to address other needs in the District?



Feedback: Open Response

- 1. Cost & Tax Implications Many residents worry about rising taxes and several request detailed breakdowns of tax impact and financing options, including bonds versus direct taxation.
- 2. Siwanoy School Concerns There is strong opposition to large-scale construction at Siwanoy with many worrying about the loss of playground space and the impact on the neighborhood.
- **3. Infrastructure Prioritization** Residents emphasize focusing on critical repairs, such as leaky roofs, temperature control, and ADA compliance, rather than adding non-essential features.
- **4. Transparency & Community Engagement** Calls for more input from teachers, staff, and technical experts to ensure projects are well-planned and necessary.
- **5. Alternative Solutions** Suggestions include staggering projects over a longer timeline, reconsidering the need for AC by modifying the school calendar, and utilizing existing district facilities more efficiently.
- **6. Middle & High School Needs** Concerns about student spaces at the high school (cafeteria, study areas) and questions about the necessity of certain renovations at the middle school.
- 7. Environmental & Logistical Considerations Requests for sustainable solutions, stormwater runoff mitigation, and minimizing construction disruptions.





Coordination with Pelham Manor


- 1. The purpose of the February 13th meeting was an informational on-site discussion with Lindsey Luft, the Village Manager.
- 2. Siwanoy Options B and C were reviewed in concept.
- 3. The primary focus of the conversation was **storm water management strategies** and coordination with ongoing and potential Pelham Manor capital improvements.
- 4. Pelham Manor agreed to share some existing technical drawings of the existing Village storm water systems to assist the School District with conceptual development of storm water strategies.
- Communication will continue so any potential capital project will best serve the needs of the Pelham UFSD and Pelham Manor.
