Students' State and Constitutional Rights

1. Non-Discrimination and Student Rights

All students, including those who are undocumented or from immigrant families, have the right to:

- Attend public school.
- Participate in school activities.
- Receive a quality education free from discrimination.

2. Confidentiality of Student Information

Schools are obligated to protect the privacy of their students. Personal information about students or their family members cannot be shared for immigration enforcement purposes without a valid court order or judicial subpoena. Additionally, schools are prohibited from:

- Requesting Social Security numbers.
- Inquiring about the citizenship or immigration status of students, their parents, or guardians, unless explicitly required by law.

3. Safe School Environment

Schools remain places where students can learn without fear. Immigration enforcement officers are required to present a judicial warrant or signed court order to be able to conduct any business on school campuses.

- Train administrators and key staff to ensure they are prepared to respond effectively to changes and challenges.

 - Schools are committed to safeguarding students from external inquiries and disruptions
- Messages will be shared by teachers, in communications, or at school organized activities or events.
