Board of Education Updates

The Board of Education (BOE) met on Monday, February 10, to discuss and approve several initiatives aimed at strengthening curriculum, enhancing technology infrastructure, and preparing for the upcoming school year.

The BOE approved the purchase of new reading materials and professional development for the district's K-5 Reading Curriculum from 95 Percent Group. This investment ensures that teachers have access to high-quality, research-based resources to support foundational reading skills for all students. Additionally, professional development opportunities will provide educators with the tools and strategies needed to implement the curriculum effectively, ultimately fostering stronger literacy growth across our elementary grades.

The BOE also addressed improvements to the district's technology infrastructure, approving new cabling for access points and the organization of technology closets in school buildings. These upgrades will enhance network reliability, improve internet connectivity, and ensure that all classrooms and learning spaces have seamless access to digital resources. As technology plays an increasingly vital role in education, these improvements will support both students and staff in their daily learning and instructional needs.

Another exciting highlight from the meeting was the approval of three new teachers who will be joining the district for the 2025-26 school year. We are thrilled to welcome Emily Cady, Jordyn Smith, and Shelby Kaup to our team! Their passion for education and dedication to student success will be a great addition to our schools. 
