Students who are interested in taking the Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery (ASVAB) test should sign up using this <u>ASVAB RSVP Link</u>. The ASVAB Career Exploration Program includes a validated aptitude test and interest assessment. The results are used to guide career exploration using career planning tools.

Rob Roy Scholarships for Cosmetology/Barber Programs and Esthetics



Rob Roy Academy offers two different scholarships for upcoming 2025 graduates.

- o \$1000.00 scholarships for our Cosmetology & Barber programs
- o \$600 scholarships for the Esthetics Program

At Rob Roy Academy, they offer Cosmetology, Barbering, and Esthetics programs. They pride themselves on their achieved graduation rate of 90.12 %. Scholarships will be awarded to graduates with a sincere desire to enter the fields of Cosmetology or Barbering. Below are the eligibility criteria for students applying for the scholarship:

- o Must be scheduled to graduate in the 2025 academic year
- o Submit a completed admission application
- o Enroll for either 1000 hours of Cosmetology, 1000 hours of Barbering or 600 hours of Esthetics
- o Provide one letter of recommendation (ex. Guidance counselor, teacher, employer, non-family member)
- o Submit two of the following for review:
 - 1. 250+ Word Essay explaining their career goals and why they want to become either a Barber or Cosmetologist. And/Or,

2. Two pieces of creative work, such as pictures of hairstyles, nail work, or make up that the applicant has personally created. And/Or,

3. A 3-minute video telling RRA about the applicant, their career goals, and why they want to become a Barber or Cosmetologist.

Once a student submits the scholarship requirements to the Admissions Department at <u>lpina@rob-roy.com</u> for consideration, the Admissions Department will be in contact with them for an interview. All scholarships are awarded at the completion of their program. Students must enroll on or before the September 2025 class start date and are expected to retain the scholarship by meeting satisfactory academic progress. **Please contact your guidance counselor to learn more if you are interested!**

Summer Job Opportunity



Mattapoisett Land Trust and the Buzzards Bay Coalition will be hiring a Summer Seasonal Stewardship Position for Summer 2025.

The Summer Land Steward will assist with aspects of conservation land stewardship for Buzzards Bay Coalition and Mattapoisett Land Trust. The position is a full-time, seasonal position that will run for roughly 10 weeks (~400 hours), with an ideal start date in May or early June. Candidates must have an educational

background, experience and passion for conservation land management, property management and outdoor work. The position is currently based out of the Coalition's Marion facility and the Mattapoisett Land Trust office. Conservation lands are located throughout the Buzzards Bay watershed with a primary focus on the Rochester, Acushnet, Mattapoisett, Fairhaven and Wareham areas.

Specific Responsibilities:

Tasks include but are not limited to:

- Maintain trails, signs, bridges, boardwalks, overlook decks, piers, dams and water control structures, fences, parking areas, and other structures and facilities.
- Perform mowing, brush clearing, erosion control, debris removal, sign and fence installation, and other property management tasks as needed.
- Respond to inquiries from the public and conservation land users and implement sound judgement regarding when a subject or inquiry should be more appropriately directed to a supervisor.
- Foster and maintain positive relations with abutters, neighbors and local communities. Help manage and maintain tools, supplies, materials and equipment as needed to support stewardship activities.
- Assist as needed the Restoration Ecologist regarding implementation of ecological restoration projects.
- Provide support to other local land trusts and municipalities within the Bay watershed regarding land stewardship activities.

Compensation

This is a temporary, at-will position, for approximately 10 weeks over the period of May to July/August 2025 with start and end dates to be confirmed during the application process. The pay rate will be between \$15 to \$20 per hour depending upon experience.
