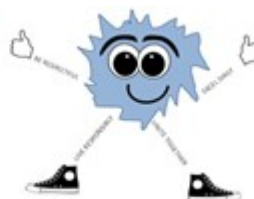

CURRICULUM CORNER

Each month information will be shared about what your child is learning in school. This will be an overview of topics being learned; please contact your child's teacher for more details as needed.

If you have special talents or knowledge of a topic to be studied that you would like to share, please reach out to your child's teacher.

We would love for you to share in our students' learning!

Grade 3: In Math, we will wrap up our study of area utilizing the area formula to find an unknown side or unknown area, including solving word problems with area. Then, we will begin our study of fractions! We will use concrete models to identify fractions as part of a whole and part of a set. In ELA, we will extend our study of Japan by reading *Dragon of Red Dawn from the Magic Tree House* series! Then, students will get to pick a country they want to research. We will round out the month by planning, drafting, and publishing informational writing pieces on our selected countries. In Social Studies, we will learn about the holidays of Carnival and Holi and in science we will begin our unit on Weather and Climate!

Grade 4: Fourth graders will be finishing our unit on Colonial America and will begin to investigate and learn about the American Revolution. Students will learn about different perspectives of the time period. For math students are finishing up the geometry unit and will begin the unit study of fractions. Students will learn to decompose, compare, add and subtract fractions. In science class, students will finish the electricity unit and begin a unit on Earth Processes and will explore rocks and fossils. Please continue to practice the spelling words each week!

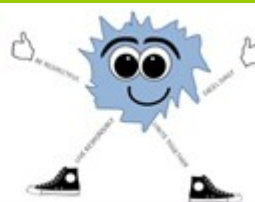
Grade 5: Fifth grade students continue to be busy learners! In Math, we are continuing to explore division and multiplication of fractions. In Science, we are reviewing the water cycle and completing an investigation about clouds, including a fun project on how to create a cloud in a bottle! Our next unit will focus on Earth and Space, where we will learn about Earth's movement in space, the planets, and the sun. In ELA, students are diving into a new unit titled "Sports in America." They will explore the importance of sports in American culture through reading and analyzing articles, discovering the author's opinions and supporting reasons. This ties in nicely with our writing unit while practicing reading nonfiction texts. Students will be finishing up their opinion writing pieces as they read engaging debate articles.

DATA CORNER

iReady sets yearly growth targets for our students. After the 2nd diagnostic test, data show:

- 68% of students have already met their Reading Growth target!
- 41% have already met their Math Growth target!

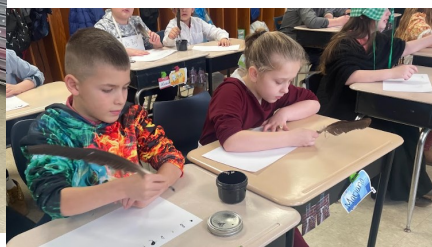
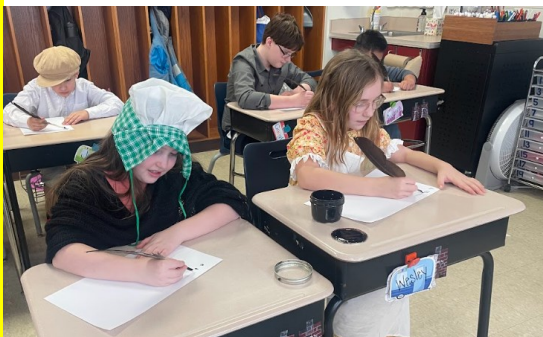
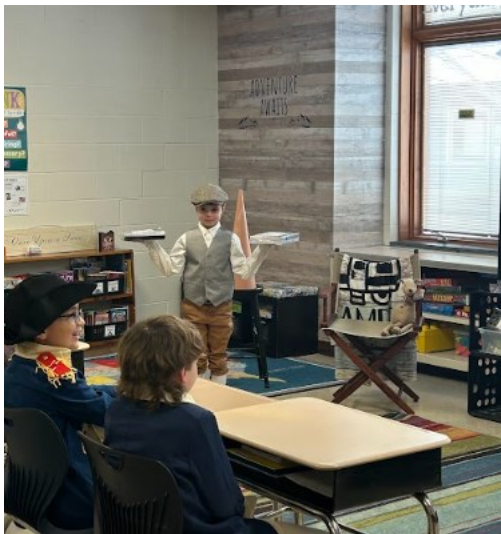
Grade 4 Colonial day—one of our students favorite traditions!
