adults, so try to set a good example.
During this month, try to show what
generosity looks like. When you are
being generous, call attention to it. Ask
your child, "How could we be generous
today?" Asking your children questions
will start a discussion and help them
pay attention to the example you set.*

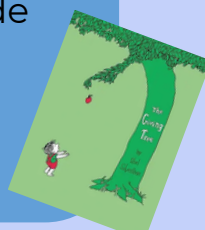
