• Call to Order & Welcome Present- Batts, Rickard, Steele, Artis, McCain, Robinson, and Weikart Meeting was called to motion Batts and seconded by Artis.

- Review of February 7th minutes (prior approved via email vote).
- Successes
 -K-5 teachers have analyzed K-2 math assessments and 3-5 interims.
 -4th vegetable service learning project is being serving at a local restaurant.
- Coaching Comments ~ No new comments at this time.
- Old Business
 - o A4.06 All teachers will be attentive to students'
 emotional states. (Ms. Rickard)
 - Review MOY staff survey Data was reviewed. The following positive were noted-
 - 1. Increased in staff's perception understanding of rules and procedures.
 - Staff's perceptions of admin team consistently enforcing rules increases.
 - 3. MOY as compared to Spring TWC, we have send significant growth.
 - The following areas of concern were noted-
 - 1. Students following rules as compared to BOY.
 - 2. School administrators support teacher's effort to maintain discipline in the classrooms as compared to BOY.
 - Review student MOY survey
 - Data was reviewed.
 - The following positive were noted-

- 1. Ms. Artis noted that she learned from her class in regards to question 5.
- 2. As compared to 2016 $4^{\rm th}{\rm student}$ survey data, we are seeing increases.
- The following areas of concern were noted-
 - 1. The results did drop some from BOY to Moy.
 - 2.81% of students stated a lot or sometimes classroom instruction being disrupted by other students.
- Review discipline data
 - Physical aggression 38%
 - Disruption/noncompliant/disrespect 58%
 - 7% of students have 64% of office referrals
 - 50% classroom referrals, 23% buses, rest from other areas.
 - 148 ISS incidences from 88 students resulted in 193 days of ISS.
 - 16 OSS incidences from 8 students resulted in 22 days.
- Additional task?
 - Look at repeat offenders (7% of students have 64% of office referrals) for CICO & behavior plans
 - Re-exposing behavior contracts
 - Written reflection with students
 - Reviewing 1:1 expectations
 - Class DOJO (making more tangible) and looking at re-emphasizing PAWS handouts
