Guided by the principles of academic rigor and diversity, The International School of San Francisco offers programs of study in French and English to prepare its graduates for a world in which the ability to think critically and to communicate across cultures is of paramount importance.

The International School of San Francisco is the city's oldest and largest bilingual school. The International School of San Francisco is the first school in San Francisco to offer the International Baccalaureate (IB) program, and the fourth in the U.S. to do so. Globally, The International School of San Francisco is recognized for its leaders and innovators in education.

A key aspect of The International School of San Francisco is the ability to balance change and stability. Over the years, the school has changed names four times, locations twelve times, and expanded significantly, but it has always remained committed to the core principles.

Founded in 1962 by a visionary group, The International School of San Francisco aimed to offer bilingual French education that would shape compassionate, confident, and principled individuals with an international outlook. This mission remains at the core.

Over the past 63 years, the community has empowered students with the skills and perspectives to navigate the world. The school offers rigorous bilingual French and IB programs, supported by a vibrant, multilingual community of educators and families.

By Grade 8, students at The International School of San Francisco are fluent in both French and English. In Grade 9, the community expands, welcoming students from across San Francisco and the world, many of whom are not yet bilingual but share a passion for global learning.

At the International High School, students earn both an internationally recognized IB diploma and a U.S. high school degree, preparing them to thrive at top universities globally.

Academics

Maternelle/Preschool

In France, early learning centers are called "Maternelle." At The International School of San Francisco, the Maternelle offers a unique bilingual immersion program for students starting at age 2 (PK2, PK3, PK4). Classes are conducted in French for 80%-90% of the time, allowing children to progress from no French to age-appropriate proficiency by the end of PK4. By Lower School, students communicate, understand, and respond in French, gaining lifelong cognitive and social benefits. Research shows that bilinguals excel in problem-solving, creative thinking, and cross-cultural connection, preparing them for the future workforce.

The Maternelle program is hands-on, child-centered, and focuses on both linguistic and social-emotional development. Children transition from home to school in a nurturing, independent environment. Bright, colorful classrooms and expansive shared spaces foster creativity, cooperation, and critical thinking, while teachers provide personalized guidance to each child's growth. The Maternelle students also go on local overnight trips.

Lower School

At The International School of San Francisco, the Maternelle's pedagogical approach is continued and strengthened in Lower School, with a bilingual curriculum in English and French that meets U.S. and French standards. By Grade 1, students are resourceful, independent, and confident due to their growing bilingualism.



As they move through Lower School, students develop self-sufficiency, collaboration, and the ability to express themselves logically while listening to others. Working with classmates and teachers from around the world broadens their understanding of diversity.

By Grade 5, students apply their bilingual skills during a two-week stay with a host family in France, becoming curious, independent learners. They enter Middle School confident and ready for new challenges. The Lower School students also go on local overnight trips.

Middle School

As students progress at The International School of San Francisco, they become fluent in at least three languages, study math in two languages, and engage in arts, athletics, and global travel programs. They participate in local and global service learning, and develop strong critical thinking skills in a challenging, engaging curriculum. In Middle School, 60% of instruction is in French, 30% in English, and 10% in a third language.

By Grade 8, students are fully bilingual, able to read and analyze both Victor Hugo and Shakespeare, and deliver fluent presentations in both languages. The International School of San Francisco is an IB/MYP candidate school and anticipaties approval in 2026-27.

Middle School students also take on leadership roles, explore new interests, and deepen their global citizenship. They study a range of subjects with different teachers, including English, French, Math, Science, Third Language, PE, Art, Music, Theater, and in Grade 7, Physique-Chimie. By Grade 8, they also add U.S. History. The experienced faculty at The International School of San Francisco supports students as they build independence, organization, and adapt to the middle school environment.

High School

At The International School of San Francisco, students who pursue the International Baccalaureate (IB) or French Baccalaureate (French Bac) diplomas push their boundaries, excel in collaboration, and build real confidence. These programs prepare students to thrive globally.

The IB program, created over 50 years ago, is recognized worldwide. The International School of San Francisco was the first school in California, and the fourth in the U.S., to offer the IB diploma. It's highly customizable, allowing students to tailor their studies to their strengths and interests.

About a quarter of the high school students pursue the French Bac, a rigorous and rewarding path. Many top-performing students in the French Track come from non-French-speaking families, showcasing the strength of the bilingual education from PreK to Grade 8.

Board of Trustees

The Board of Trustees maps and maintains the course of The International School of San Francisco. The Board is responsible for providing the highest level of leadership and support around issues of critical policy and works closely with the Head of School. The Board does not get involved in the school's day-to-day affairs, disciplinary or personnel issues, or administrative decisions—which are the responsibility of the Head of School. Leadership Profile

The Board of Trustees of The International of San Francisco is conducting a national and international search to identify its next Head of School. To that end, and to assist them in clarifying the opportunities and challenges, Mary Seppala and Eric Temple of Educators Collaborative received input from individuals during their site visit and by means of an electronic survey. Those interviewed and surveyed included faculty, administrators, staff, parents/guardians, trustees, alumni and students. Based on this input and the impressions of the consultants, as well as input from the search committee, the following represents a summary of The International School of San Francisco's strengths and the challenges and opportunities it faces in the next three to five years, as well as the qualifications and attributes of the next Head of School.

Strengths

As San Francisco's premier International School, The International School of San Francisco is deeply committed to the value of bilingual education, and the development of global citizens who will contribute in meaningful ways to an equitable and just society. The dynamic environment offers significant opportunities in academics, the arts, athletics, and extensive global travel experiences. Other strengths include:

- A strategic board that plans for the school's future while supporting its current mission and programs.
- A dedicated faculty, staff and administration committed to the school's bilingualism and international ethos.
- Strong financial planning and reserves, as well as sound strategic and fiduciary stewardship of the school's resources.
- An academically motivated and fully participatory student body.
- Strong connections to the City of San Francisco and partnerships with surrounding art and music institutions.
- Generous financial and institutional support for continual professional development and growth.
- A purposefully designed campus for its two through four year old students that supports a dynamic pre-school program.
- Mission aligned families who embrace and contribute to the school's commitment to an international education.



Challenges

The next leader of The International School of San Francisco must preserve and further strengthen the position of the school as a highly sought after, life-changing opportunity for students, in the face of a decline in the school-aged population of students in San Francisco, and be a passionate and highly effective advocate of the value of international education. Some of the challenges facing the school in the next three to five years include:

- In a market with healthy competition as well as unique demographic shifts, ensuring robust enrollment while navigating the benefits and challenges of a fully bilingual Age 2 through Grade 8 program, and a 9-12 International Baccalaureate or French Baccalaureate tracked high school will be a high priority.
- Making full use of the school's campus, and integrating the improvements completed during the campus redevelopment project into the school program in order to best meet its mission and the needs of students, faculty and staff.
- Navigating the school's identity as a French-English bilingual school with its identity as an expansive international organization.
- Nurturing the school's commitment to diversity, equity and inclusion, including global cross cultural understanding.
- Retaining and recruiting highly qualified faculty and staff.

Qualification and Attributes

The Board of Trustees seeks as the School's next leader an individual whose personal and professional attributes match The International School of San Francisco's culture and who will provide effective leadership in the coming years. To best serve The International School of San Francisco, the next Head of School will be someone with the following skills and dispositions:

- Experienced in independent school leadership and management.
- A strategic systems thinker who understands how change influences and reverberates across a school community.
- Innovative and forward-thinking with an entrepreneurial mindset.
- Resilient and capable of making difficult decisions.
- Committed to working productively with Union leadership to advance the mission of the school.



Cultural & Educational Philosophy

- Deeply values and understands French culture and international education. A fluent French speaker is preferred.
- Deep knowledge about child and adolescent development that spans Pre-K Grade 12, combined with a strong understanding of best practices in bilingual pedagogy that foster a rigorous academic experience rooted in critical thinking.
- Experienced in leading an environment committed to diversity, equity, inclusion, and belonging within the context of an international school.

People & Talent Management

- Committed to building leadership capacity and delegating to others throughout the school community
- Maintaining a strong relationship between the administration and the faculty, including the leadership of the Teachers Union.

Financial & Operational Acumen

- Has strong financial and budgeting acumen accompanied by a proven track record of successful fundraising.
- Skilled in enrollment management.

Personal Attributes & Leadership Style

- Honest and trustworthy with strong personal integrity.
