Avoca Elementary School 2024-25 Annual Report

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2022-23 educational progress for Avoca Elementary School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2022-23 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-23. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Avoca Elementary has not been given one of these labels.

Avoca Plan for School Improvement:

According to the School Index School Overview, Avoca Elementary is proud to have a School Index Value of 98.13. Further broken down, Avoca has scores of 88.13 in Proficiency, 100 in Growth, and 93.34 in School Quality and Student Success Index. Although our attendance shows On Track according to MI School Data School Grades and improved last year as compared to the previous year, Avoca's student attendance will continue to be an area of focus. Additionally, we will continue an emphasis on meeting proficiency targets for students who have an academic performance in the "Bottom 30%" of our school population.

Areas of Focus 2024 - 2025 School Year

Consistent, viable curriculum, including instructional practices and expectations

Ongoing professional development to support best practices in supporting instruction, technology, and student social-emotional needs.

Positive, safe and caring learning environment for all: TRAILS (District) and The Positivity Project

Implement systems to identify, develop, expand, and sustain positive character traits in all students.

Family engagement - continue to find ways to ensure family partnerships in all steps of the education process.

Social / Character building curriculum and interventions.

Implement a tiered system of supports that provide targeted interventions for students at different levels of needs, both academic and social.

1. Pupil assignment process:

The Yale Public School District and the St. Clair County Regional Educational Service Agency (RESA) have a policy and process in place for non-district residents' school of choice requests. Copies of this policy and procedures are available at the principal's office or through the central office.

2. School Improvement Plan status:

We have completed the 2023 School Improvement/MICIP Plan. The plan is a working document that the staff updates as needed. The goal for our staff is to aim for an increase in all subject areas of the state assessment and various district assessments. Our goals include increasing student proficiency as well as increasing teacher capacity to instruct and assess student

achievement in the areas of ELA, Math, Science, and Social Studies. Additionally, our district MICIP broad goal is to Provide a rigorous, well rounded education where all students are prepared to utilize our Portrait of a Learner (P.o.L) traits to develop college and career readiness.

Vision Statement: Avoca Elementary School is committed to preparing all students for continued educational and lifelong success.

Mission Statement: Avoca Elementary staff will provide a positive school atmosphere, quality education, and an equal opportunity to learn. All students will be encouraged to meet their maximum level of intellectual, physical, and social growth. We recognize the importance of school, family, and community working together to create a safe, supportive, and innovative learning environment.

3. Brief description of each specialized school:

Kindergarten through Grade 5 is located at Yale, Avoca, or Farrell-Emmett Elementary Schools. A three and four-year-old preschool is also located at each elementary school. Farrell-Emmett and Yale Elementary have Developmental Kindergarten Programs, while Avoca and Yale Elementary schools have GSRP programs. Avoca Elementary houses Yale Public School's Early Childhood Special Education and Cognitively Impaired programs. The District operates one junior high school building and one high school building with an alternative education program available on the district's main campus.

4. Core curriculum: Core Curricula and Curriculum Maps, as well as Pacing Guides, may be accessed at each of our school buildings. Additionally, all K-12 information may be found in the office of the Yale Assistant Superintendent. Our curricula is aligned to the Michigan State Standards.

- a. ELA curriculum aligned to state standards for all grade levels
- b. Math curriculum aligned to state standards for all grade levels
- c. Developing assessment strategies for each curricular objective
- d. Providing staff with professional development on best practices in all academic areas

The end product of this curriculum review process is a working document that will assist teachers in lesson planning and provide assurances that the district has curricula that are aligned, taught, and regularly assessed.
