Dear Parents and Community Members:

We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2024-25 educational progress for Yale Public School District and our schools. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and some requirements of state laws. Our staff is available to help you understand this information. Please contact Bill Kryscynski, Assistant Superintendent for Yale Public Schools, with any questions or assistance.

These reports contain the following information:

Student Assessment Data

- Includes the following three assessments: M-STEP (Michigan Student Test of Educational Progress), MI-Access (Alternate Assessment), and College Board SAT
- Present assessment information for English language arts and mathematics for grades 3 to 8 and 11, and MI-Access science for grades 4, 7, and 11, compared to state averages for all students as well as subgroups of students.

School Accountability Data

- Includes information on schools' performance on various measures such as student proficiency and growth on state assessments, graduation, and attendance rates. Performance is measured on 0-100 index scales
- Reports schools identified under three federally required categories for further support: Comprehensive Support and Improvement, Targeted Support and Improvement, and Additional Targeted Support

Educator Qualification Data

- Identifies the number and percentage of inexperienced teachers, principals, and other school leaders
- Reports teachers who are teaching with emergency or provisional credentials
- Includes teachers who are not teaching in the subject or field for which they are certified

NAEP Data (National Assessment of Educational Progress)

- Provides state results of the national assessment in mathematics and reading every other year in grades 4 and 8

Civil Rights Data

- Provides information on school quality, climate, and safety.

Review the table below listing our schools. For the 2024-25 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2023-24. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no status label is given.

Yale Public Schools is proud of the reputation it has developed in the county and surrounding areas as an educational leader who is focused on continuous improvement. The district has **two National Blue Ribbon schools** in Avoca Elementary and Farrell-Emmett Elementary Schools, along with leading the county M-STEP scores in several categories. All three elementary schools received all A's on recent state report cards while outperforming schools with similar demographics across the state. Our Junior High school had the highest M-STEP scores in St. Clair County and in the surrounding six counties. Yale High School was second in the county on SAT scores and continues to have all-state academic sports teams. While academic success and high expectations are standard in our district, our staff's ability to build relationships with students and families sets us apart. Our family and student-focused atmosphere creates an educational environment that helps students discover success. In our most recent parent survey, our outstanding staff was identified as the number one reason for the success of our district. Our staff's willingness to go the extra mile and how much they care for the students they work with stood out in almost every survey response.
