Staff Evaluations

PLORD Hours

Teacher-Itinerant Staff (FOR THOSE WHO DID NOT PARTICIPATE IN THE READ ACT): As a reminder, you are required to do 8 hours of Professional Local Options Research or Development (PLORD). This is part of your 181 duty days.

Examples of PLORD include Professional Learning Communities, Curriculum Development, Learning Project Research, Curriculum Writing, Job Site Safety Training, parent/teacher meetings, etc. PLORD hours are to be conducted outside of normal workday hours. Teacher-Itinerants choice of PLORD needs to be reviewed and approved by Administration. This needs to be completed by June 30, 2025.

****If you completed the Read Act, you do not have to fill out a PLORD form.

REMINDER: Per Master Agreement and Personnel Policies: Jury Duty Pay Policy

Freshwater will pay employees their full hourly wage during duty-related absences, provided they return any wages received for serving on jury duty. However, employees may keep any reimbursements for expenses such as mileage and meals. Employees must report jury duty days to their immediate supervisor.

If you are not selected to serve on a jury, please return to work as soon as possible.

Employee Responsibilities for Jury Duty

- Report jury duty days to your immediate supervisor.
- Return any wages received for serving on jury duty to Freshwater.
- Keep any reimbursements for expenses such as mileage and meals.

MnMT\$\$ FED Leadership Team Advances Family and Community Engagement Initiatives

The MnMTSS FED Leadership Team continues to deepen its commitment to family and community engagement (FACE), recognizing the critical role of equitable partnerships between families, schools, and district staff. During the most recent session on February 20, 2025, the team explored Minnesota's FACE Model and the FACE Stages of Development Tool, examining how these frameworks can be used to strengthen engagement practices within the district and support schools in fostering relational trust and shared responsibility for student success.

A key focus of the session was the Family Engagement Action Plan (FEAP), a strategic framework designed to help school leaders move from traditional family involvement events to transformative, ongoing engagement mechanisms. The team began discussions on developing a FEAP that aligns with the Minnesota Department of Education's Continuous Improvement process, ensuring that engagement strategies are sustainable, co-designed with families, and inclusive of the diverse school community.

Looking ahead, the next leadership team meeting in March will shift focus to district-level data-based decision-making, further strengthening the team's ability to support schools through evidence-driven strategies. By integrating FACE principles and strategic family engagement planning, the MnMTSS FED Leadership Team is laying the foundation for stronger, more inclusive school-community partnerships that benefit all students.
