Students Nail Home Repair in New Class

When a faucet drips or a toilet runs or a gutter becomes clogged, many homeowners call in a handy person. But with a little knowhow, they could fix problems like these themselves. That is exactly what Wheatland-Chili High School students are learning to do in a brand-new property maintenance course.

Launched at the beginning of the school year, the technology elective teaches students how to do basic repairs and maintenance around the house. In class, you can find students pulling apart a broken dryer, building the wood frame of a wall and running electrical wiring through it, mounting a toilet or knocking down a counter and cabinets with a sledgehammer. It all depends on what students want to do. The class is student driven. Teacher Scott Melville has set up the class to give students more control over what they learn, allowing them to choose their projects.

"They are at the center of their learning," said Melville. "I want them to get their hands dirty and be confident in their skills."

Besides their own projects, students are tackling work for people outside the class. They recently built a miniature golf hole for another classroom. The school will expand on that idea with another new elective this spring. The construction systems course will have students building structures like shelving units, sheds, chicken coops and more. Melville hopes to solicit projects from the community. Students will design the product to the client's

specifications and devise a list of materials required. All the client has to do is purchase the materials.

Classes like property maintenance and construction systems also give students the opportunity to dip into the different trades before they have the option to enroll in more intense career and technical education programs. In October, property maintenance students participated in the Careers and Construction Day at the Monroe County Fleet Center, where they tried out jobs like brick laying and welding and even got to operate some heavy machinery.

These hands-on, student-driven learning experiences allow students to gain valuable skills, empowering them to be more self-sufficient while setting them up for success beyond high school. They are not only an investment in students' futures, but a benefit to the community.

The property maintenance class is always on the lookout for materials to work with like used appliances, fixtures, and construction, electrical and plumbing supplies. 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Capital Improvements Continue

Wheatland-Chili is wrapping up its current capital improvement project and moving forward with the next.

The Middle/High School underwent quite a transformation this summer. Students and staff returned for the new school year to a brand-new kitchen, cafeteria, and senior and staff lounges, a renovated nurse's suite, and new wall tile in the front hallway. Crews also repaved the bus and drop-off loops at both the MS/HS and T. J. Connor Elementary over the summer.

The installation of new door locksets with secure key fob access and new front-entrance marquees at both schools, the last phase of the project, is now underway and is expected to be complete by January.

The work is part of the capital improvement project approved by voters in May 2022. It also included a new accessible playground at T. J. Connor, which was completed in August 2023.

Planning for the next capital project approved by voters in May 2024 is now underway.

The no-tax-impact project includes renovations to the counseling suite and pool at the MS/HS; bathroom renovations and fire alarm upgrades at T. J. Connor; and repaving of parking lots and new roofing at both schools.

Work on the next project is expected to begin this spring and continue through summer 2026.

The Wheatland-Chili Board of Education has three new members.

Stephanie Ely, Heather Woerner and Adria Callery began their terms as trustees this August after District residents elected them to the Board of Education during the annual election in May.
