Admission counselors attend college fairs to help you with any questions you may have about their school to see if it is the right [college fit](#) for you. Here are a few sample questions to help you uncover key information. Remember to ask anything specific to your needs and interests and prioritize your questions in order of importance.

- 1.What do students like most about your school? What is the biggest complaint from students?
- 2.What kinds of students are happiest at your school?
- 3.Where do students hang out on campus? Do students mostly live on or off campus?
- 4.What financial aid programs does your college offer?
- 5.What academic programs are the most popular at your college?
- 6.Do admission officers make decisions solely on numbers and stats, or do extracurricular activities truly matter at your school?
- 7.How would you describe the academic pressure and workload?
- 8.How does your career planning department compare to other colleges/universities?
- 9.What are the faculty like and how accessible are they outside of class?
- 10.Are there internships available specific to my major?
- 11.Is there job placement help for graduates?
- 12.Are you able to give me the names of a few students that I can talk to about their experience at your school?

Guilford County Schools is now offering a secure site for current and former students to access transcripts, attendance, and employment verifications.

Per District policy and the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA) student records are only available to those who have authorization from the student or parent, guardian or responsible person if the student is less than 18 years of age. If the student is 18 years of age or older, school records will not be released to a parent, guardian, or responsible person without the student's written consent.

- Most schools continue to be **test-optional**.

University of North Carolina System

UNC System universities will not require **SAT** and **ACT test scores** on students' applications next year **unless your weighted GPA is below 2.8.**

Minimum Admissions Requirements:

- 2.5 cum weighted GPA or 1010 combined SAT score/19 composite ACT score
- Each UNC system school has freedom to set its own requirements above these minimums

Testing will occur November 13-15 and 18-20

Students receive score reports that indicate their score level and explains their career readiness. Many employers review Workkeys scores to measure workplace skills.

shift_ed Scholarship


A need-based scholarship designed to assist in paying for college. shift_ed scholarship dollars are strictly to be applied as last-dollar tuition payments and therefore do not cover the total cost of attendance for post-secondary education.

Last-Dollar Tuition Scholarship



shift_ed's scholarship will cover the remaining balance of a student's tuition costs (up to the designated tuition cap) after the Pell Grant, state need-based aid, and institutional aid have been applied based on their financial aid award package for the academic year.

Merit, academic, or outside scholarships are not factored into a student's shift_ed scholarship.



Scholarship Eligibility

With equity as the guiding principle, shift_ed's scholarship registration is a simple process that takes around 5 minutes to complete.

The shift_ed scholarship is RENEWABLE - students must maintain full-time enrollment and a minimum GPA of 2.0 at a post-secondary institution.

6 Things to Know Before Filling Out the FAFSA

With the 2025-2026 Application...

1. You'll need to **create** a StudentAid.gov account to access and fill out the 2024–25 FAFSA form.
2. To find out if your parent(s) will be a **contributor** on your FAFSA form, check out the [*Is My Parent a Contributor When I Fill Out My FAFSA® Form?*](#)
3. Make sure you report **2022 income** on the 2024–25 FAFSA form.
4. You and your contributors may need to answer FAFSA questions about **untaxed income**, such as child support and interest income.
5. Report the current amounts of your **assets** as of the date you sign the FAFSA form, rather than reporting the 2022 tax year amounts.
6. Be sure to **add any colleges, career schools, or trade schools** you're considering, even if you haven't applied or been accepted yet. You can list up to **20 schools**.

What is Residency?

The state of North Carolina partially subsidizes the cost of North Carolina public college and university tuition for all students whose domicile, or permanent legal residence, is in North Carolina. Residency determination establishes if students should have in-state or out-of-state tuition. Because North Carolina residency status is governed solely by North Carolina statute, lack of eligibility for in-state status in another state does not guarantee in-state status in North Carolina. The residency statute mandates only those who can demonstrate a minimum of twelve months of uninterrupted domicile (legal residence) in North Carolina are eligible for in-state tuition. The statute also places the burden of proof on the student to establish, by a preponderance of evidence, that they are a bona fide domiciliary rather than mere residents of North Carolina.

The Residency Determination Service (RDS) was established in coordination with the University of North Carolina (UNC), the North Carolina Community College System (NCCCS), the North Carolina State Education Assistance Authority (NCSEAA), and the North Carolina Independent Colleges and Universities (NCICU) as the centralized service for determining residency for students. This service enables a student to use one residency determination for admissions applications to multiple North Carolina public colleges and universities and to demonstrate residency for state aid programs consideration at all (public and private) North Carolina colleges and universities.
