# Capital Campaign

## A Lady with Vision - by Mac Walcott

In cleaning out my desk a few weeks ago, I came across an old binder with "Mary Emma Potts" engraved on the front. In a nutshell, the binder contained a history of our past capital campaigns that have given us the church home we now have. Mary Emma kept a thorough record of newspaper articles, Anchor Lines, reports, and parish meeting notes that tracked our journey from 1988 to 1998, when we finished our last major campaign.

Many of us were blessed to know Mary Emma and her husband Jack. What I remember most clearly about her was her no-nonsense devotion to our church and its mission. She and Jack made a perfect team, delightfully working together for 40+ years in the vineyard we call St. James. Mary Emma had two passions that I remember well. One was a vision for how our youth programs must grow and prosper if the church were ever to do the same. I remember a parish meeting in 1988 to discuss the hiring of a youth minister. Mary Emma stood up and kindly admonished us all to look around at the number of gray heads in the crowd and asked "Are we doing this for us, or for those who come after us?" Mary Emma's other passion was our Newcomer's Ministry. Under her leadership, that effort grew to a well-oiled machine. We had monthly training sessions and specific coverages assigned for each service. It was a delight to work with her and she would remind anyone she could that we were all members of that committee! Many churches have iconic lay leaders like Mary Emma and Jack who have plowed the rough ground to make things easier for those who have followed. Our challenge is to learn from them and remember the lessons they taught us. Father De and I had a good visit recently to sit together and review the binder. In walking through this history, I was struck by the similarities of what happened then and what is happening now in our capital campaign journey.

In the late 1980's, we struggled mightily with the concept of growth. For many of us, it was an alien concept, something that those "other" churches did. In 1990, after a couple of years of learning to hear God's calling for our future, we decided to move forward and bought the 9.6 acres we are on now. We talked then about all of the things that might eventually happen in the future on this "giant" parcel (our previous campus was 2.2 acres). We dreamed of parish life buildings, a school, a larger sanctuary, and even an assisted living facility! Through a similar "listening" process that we are using today, our church leaders then developed the vision and design for our new campus. In 1992, the total cost of our new campus was estimated to be \$2.3 million. Then, as now, that was a lot of money, and quite intimidating. Our annual budget then was around \$450,000. We went forward with the 1992 campaign which yielded "only" \$1.7 million. The vestry, in its wisdom, developed a plan to allow us to proceed with the "have to" parts of the campus, with the other parts "shelled-in" for completion in the future. We broke ground in 1993 and dedicated the new church on Easter 1994. In 1996, we started a followup capital campaign with a goal of \$500,000. Its purpose was to reduce some debt and complete the Parish Hall and Christian Education areas. It was successfully completed in 1998. Today, our vestry is wrestling with the same issues: namely, how can we get our wallets to match our will and our vision? In 1992, we went forward with a plan that did not have all of the questions answered immediately, but did have the questions answered over time. We broke ground in 1993 with the confidence that our plan would eventually allow us to complete everything - and we did.

In her new form, I believe that Mary Emma knows what we are up to and will probably be dancing a jig when we break ground later this year. She might also remind us that as our school grows, so grows our church, and so grows God's ministry.


