Improving Sleep Hygiene

- · Keep a consistent sleep schedule. Try to go to bed and wake up at the same time every day.
- Make sure your bedtime allows you to get 7-8 hours of sleep per night.
- Create a relaxing bedtime routine. Try a warm bath or shower. Gentle stretches or meditation to calm the body and mind.
- Turn off electronic devices before you go to sleep.
- Try some focused relaxed breathing. Four seconds in and four seconds out.
- Limit caffeine prior to bedtime.
- Write down worries or info you need to remember before going to bed.
- Manage light exposure.
- Limit large meals before bed.
- Bedtime temperature should be 60-67 degrees for optimal sleep.
- Getting good sleep is crucial for mental and physical health as well as your quality of life.


