

The College Board Opportunity Scholarships is a new, national scholarship program.

- ★ The College Board is committing \$25 million in scholarships over the next five years.
- → 4,000 students each year will earn scholarships ranging from \$500 to \$40,000.
- → Half of the scholarships will be designated for students whose families earn less than \$60,000 per year.
- ★ Students earn chances at scholarships by completing key actions along the path to college. Scholarships will be awarded monthly through drawings among all eligible students.

This is not your typical scholarship program. The College Board Opportunity Scholarships:

- ★ Are open to all students, regardless of GPA, test scores, status/citizenship and family income
- → Simplify the college planning process
- **→** Reward **effort** and **action**
- **→** Promote **practice**
- → Don't require an application or essay—the program is all about rewarding students for taking the actions needed to access college (2 year and 4 year colleges)

How does the College Board Opportunity Scholarships Program work?

The College Board Opportunity Scholarships recognize students who take six key actions to prepare for college.






