The lifetime prevalence of Non-Suicidal Self-Injury (NSSI) or self-harm among school-aged children is around 17%, with girls generally reporting higher rates than boys. Some studies show a prevalence of 19.4% for females and 12.9% for males, meaning roughly 1 in 6 school-aged children may engage in NSSI at some point in their lives. Self-harm refers to when a person hurts their own body on purpose. A person who self-harms usually does not mean to kill themselves, but they are at higher risk of attempting and/or dying by suicide if they do not get help. While most common in adolescents and young adults. younger children may also engage in self-harm.





DISSOLVING PEEPS!

I don't love to eat Peeps, but they sure are cute! If you've got some left over, why not donate them to science? LittleBinsForLittleHands has so many fun activities using Peeps!

Here's one...what happens to Peeps candy when you put them in different liquids?

Testing how easily peeps dissolve in different liquids or their solubility is a classic science experiment and so much fun to do with candy!

SUPPLIES: Cups, Peeps, and a variety of liquids from the kitchen! Try hot water, cold water, vinegar, juice, cooking oil, or any other non-toxic kitchen "liquid" you have on hand.

SET UP/PROCESS: Start by pouring the same amount of liquid into each cup. What happens to the peeps in the liquids after a certain amount of time?

SIMPLE SCIENCE: Peeps are water soluble meaning they can be dissolved by water because they are made of sugar. You will notice the color from the peeps dissolve the fastest. If you choose to use vinegar (good idea), you will notice the acidity from the vinegar breaks down the peeps the fastest. Have the kids make predictions, use a timer to track the progress of each liquid, write down observations, and ask questions like "How can you dissolve a floating peep when you can't immerse it in the liquid?"
