
We received 134 responses:





Gender (Optional question)






Race and Ethnicity (Optional questions)







"Have you changed majors since your acceptance into college?"



Historical comparison of the survey question "Have you changed majors since your acceptance into college?"




"Did you transfer to a different college in the past two years?"







Mentioned for its role in college prep, advising, and providing support for students' mental health and academic planning.


Library & Databases:

Office Hours & Free Periods: Mentioned as valuable times for students to seek additional help from teachers, work on assignments, and manage their time effectively.








"To what degree did the Pittsford Central School District develop your knowledge in each of the areas below?"













Math: Historical Comparison by School











"Which of the following areas do you feel could be improved to better prepare future students for post-high school graduation?"

- **1.Social and Emotional Intelligence**: There is a strong call for the District to practice what it preaches in terms of social and emotional intelligence. Students want an environment where they can openly discuss issues like racism, sexism, and homophobia without censorship. They also emphasize the need for better mental health support, including more therapists and health-based electives focused on coping mechanisms and mental illness.
- **2.Communication and Collaboration**: Students desire more opportunities to express themselves and learn to be independent, such as running clubs with teacher supervision. They also want better communication from the administration regarding decisions and policies.
- **3.Academic Rigor and Curriculum**: There is a need for a more challenging curriculum that better prepares students for college. This includes more rigorous gym classes, updated research education, and a stronger emphasis on critical thinking and creativity. Students also suggest offering courses in finance, budgeting, and practical business skills.
- **4.Extracurricular Activities and Inclusivity**: Students want more inclusive sports and extracurricular activities, as well as public events that foster bonding. They also highlight the need for more spots on teams and better support for special needs students.
- **5.Health and Sex Education**: There is a call for a stronger sex education program that covers non-abstinence methods and personal health topics like vaccination and medication. Students also want comprehensive health education that doesn't skip important topics.
- **6.Technology and Modern Skills**: Students suggest updating the curriculum to include modern research methods, generative AI, and other new technologies used in the job market. They also want more exposure to applications and platforms relevant to the workforce.
- **7.Political Neutrality**: There is a request to keep politics out of the classroom or at least provide a balanced view. Students feel that political bias in teaching can be detrimental to their education.
- **8.Positive Experiences and Suggestions**: Despite the challenges, some students enjoyed their high school experience and appreciated certain programs like the free block class (power hour) and the senior carnival. They also suggest practical improvements like having native speakers for language classes and providing basic knowledge to help students succeed in the future business world

Microsoft Office Suite:

Google Suite: This encompasses Google Docs, Google Drive, Google Slides, and other Google products, which are popular for collaboration and cloud storage.




Canvas: A learning management system used for classes, assignments, and communication between students and educators.




Adobe Creative Cloud:

"Other Feedback"

College Counseling and Preparation: There are mixed feelings about the college counseling services. Some found it amazing and much needed, while others felt it could have been significantly better, especially when compared to other schools.

Extracurricular Activities and Inclusivity: There is a desire for more emphasis on extracurricular activities, inclusive sports, and public events that foster bonding among students. The need for more therapists and better mental health support is also highlighted.

Respect for Religious Beliefs and Anti-Racism: Some students expressed a need for more respect for religious beliefs and maintaining an anti-racist environment. There were concerns about the LGBTQ movement being pushed in a way that made some students uncomfortable due to their beliefs.

Funding and Resources: There is a call for more funding for the music department and better resources for special needs students. The business program also needs to focus more on practical skills like Excel and AI.

Administration and Controversy Handling: The administration's handling of controversies and bullying is a significant concern. Students feel that the administration is more focused on protecting itself rather than addressing issues like racism, homophobia, and bullying effectively.

Social and Emotional Skills: The feedback indicates a need for better social and emotional skills education. Some students experienced trauma and mental health issues due to the school environment and felt that more support and understanding from the staff were necessary.

Political Neutrality and Curriculum: There is a request to keep politics out of the school or at least provide a balanced view. Some students found it tiring to argue with teachers who taught based on politics rather than actual information or curriculum.

Positive Experiences: Despite the challenges, some students enjoyed their high school experience and appreciated certain programs like the free block class (power hour) and the senior carnival.
