Sample Script:

My name is ______ and I am a parent of ______ at Pittsburgh Fulton Elementary School. I would like to voice my concern about the proposed Facilities Utilization plan, which has been hastily pulled together without meaningful community input. This plan would disrupt or close nearly all of the city schools and the Board has failed to even explain the reason for the proposed changes. Our children deserve better. In particular, I would like to share my support for Pittsburgh Fulton and ask that the board keep this school open.
