What does Kindergarten look like at Creekside?

- Approximately 18 students per class
- 4 teachers
- Students have reading, writing, math, science/social studies, and purposeful play every day
- Each week, students have 2 classes of physical education (PE), 2 classes of music, and one library class.





Kindergarten Day

- All students get Full Day
 - 9:15 am 3:40 pm on Mondays, Tuesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays
 - 9:15 am 1:30 pm on Wednesdays
- If you want Half Day indicate on online enrollment
 - 9:15 am 12:15 pm on Mondays, Tuesdays, Wednesdays, Thursdays, and Fridays







Kindergarten Readiness

Independence and Health Skills to Develop Before Starting School

- ✓ Uses the toilet, washes hands, and blows nose independently
- ✓ Packs backpack and puts on coat and shoes independently
- Opens snack and food containers and eats independently
- ✓ Start a consistent bedtime and morning routine before school starts







All children grow at their own pace. They all have unique strengths and skills to work on! Use this as a guide to identify opportunities to learn and grow. Students will continue to work on these skills in kindergarten!

Social and Emotional Development

- Shares ideas and takes turns
- Names or identifies feelings
- C Keeps trying when things feel hard
 - and asks for help, if needed
- Suggests solutions to problems

Language and Communication

- Uses words to express wants, needs, thoughts, and feelings
- Remembers and retells an experience
-] Takes turns in conversations
- Follows one and two-step directions

Set Expectations

- Be a role model by showing your child a positive attitude about school and learning.
- Talk with your child about going to kindergarten and answer any questions they might have.
- Talk about how you expect them to behave at school and the importance of respecting teachers, students, and other staff.


Practice Skills at Home

- Read to your child and tell stories daily in English and/or your home language!
- Find the math in daily experiences (count, sort, name shapes, compare object, etc.)! Count or sort toys, laundry, food items...anything and everywhere!
- Teach your child their full name and practice writing their first name.
- Use everyday situations to practice taking turns, sharing, and following routines.
- · Get plenty of exercise and spend time outdoors every day!
- Talk about feelings and help with calm-down strategies (such as taking deep breaths or counting).
 Help them use words to name feelings and solve problems.
- Encourage them to solve problems independently (try different ways). If needed, help them come up with solutions. Celebrate their efforts when they keep trying when things feel hard!






Kindergarten Timeline

Online Registration Process

- To enroll a student in kindergarten for the 2025-2026 school year, a child <u>must</u> turn 5 years old by August 31, 2025.
- **Required Documentation**: Parents/Guardians are required to provide, and return, the following documents to their neighborhood school to finish the registration process:
 - Parent identification
 - Proof of birth date (birth certificate or passport)
 - PSE Bill no older than 30 days. •
 - ONE of the following:
 - Home purchase papers or property tax statement
 - Lease/Rental agreement (original) on company letterhead.
 - Notarized verification of proof of residency
- You have successfully completed the kindergarten registration process when the online registration is completed and your so be (E) of neighborhood school has received all required documents. SAO

April/May – Kindergarten Screener

- Purpose
 - Assist in making appropriate class placement
 - Baseline/snapshot of PreK skills
 - Letters, sounds, sight words, numbers, counting
- No prep needed
- Quick 10-15 minutes, on site at Creekside
- Watch for email end of March/beginning of April, once enrollment application is complete

- Route Information: New students registered in the ISD by August 1st will be able to get route information by the end of August. Go to the ISD Transportation website for route information.







Enrollment Verification

- August 2025
- Required for students in grades 1-5
- Incoming Kindergarten student no longer need to complete Enrollment Verification as long as they completed the Kindergarten Registration in March/April.

Immunizations & Life-Threatening Health Conditions

Requirements for Incoming Students

2025-26 School Year



Proof of Immunization Required

- New students need to provide a **medically verified** immunization record at the time of registration.
- A medically verified record can come directly from:
 - The Washington State Immunization Information System (WAIIS).
 - A medical clinic or office where immunizations were given
 - Pharmacy records of immunizations given
 - Another state's or country's formal immunization database
 - Immunizations verified by the State Dept.



CIS or WAIIS Documentation

- A Certificate of Immunization Status (CIS) printed from the (WAIIS)
- A physical copy of the State CIS form with a healthcare provider signature.
- A CIS printed from MyIR.

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Required Immunizations for K-6 Students

- 5 doses of DTaP (diphtheria, tetanus & pertussis) given in the appropriate time frames
 - 1 Tdap for students 7th grade and above
- 3 doses of Hepatitis B, given in the appropriate time frames
- 4 doses of polio (IPV) given in a specific time frames
- 2 doses of MMR (measles, mumps and rubella) given in the appropriate time frames
- 2 doses of varicella given in the appropriate time frames



Missing Doses

- If students are missing doses, they will need to get **all the doses they are eligible** to receive **before** starting school.
- They can then attend school in a **Conditional Status** until the minimum valid date of the next vaccine is reached.
- They then have 30 calendar days to turn in documentation of having received the dose.
- This continues on until all vaccines have been administered and documented.



Example

- If a child has all their immunizations except the 2-dose MMR series, and they get dose 1 of MMR the day before school starts (and it is documented with the school that day) the child can enter school because...
 - Dose 2 of the MMR cannot be given until 28 days after the first dose.
 - Beginning on day 29 after the first dose, the child has 30 days to get MMR dose #2.





SUMMARY of IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION

- Your student may register for school, but MAY NOT attend school until provider-verified immunizations have been received and validated by the school nurse.
- The child must have all immunizations they are eligible to receive prior to starting school.
- Or there is a **Certificate of Exemption** on file signed by the parent AND the licensed healthcare provider.



Notify the School if your Child has a Life-Threatening Health Condition such as:

- Allergy requiring an Epipen[™]
- Insulin-dependent Diabetes
- Severe Asthma
- A Seizure disorder
- A Cardiac condition
- Adrenal Insufficiency
- Other conditions



Why does the school need to know?

- If your child has a life-threatening condition, **WA state law** says there must be an **emergency care plan and any associated medication** in place in the school building **before the child can attend school**.
- This is to keep the student safe in the event they experience a medical emergency during the school day.
- If your child has a life-threatening condition, let the school nurse know:
 - School Care Plan signed by provider, parent and RN
 - Medication prescribed by provider with ISD paperwork

Daily Enrichment

Enrichment activities happen mostly in the afternoon

PE: Appropriate clothes and closed toe shoes required, 2X a week

Library: Return books on library day or your child will have to wait a week to check out another book. Damaged or lost books must be paid for by family, 1X a week Music: Students will enjoy learning a wide range of musical

skills, 2X a week, concert in the spring

Purposeful Play: Science, STEM, Social Emotional Growth







Snack

- Students will have a snack time each day.
- Students bring their own snack. No Sharing!
 - Provide a simple, healthy, nut free snack.
- Pack separately from lunch
 Make sure your child can access their snack on their own.







School Lunch:

- If buying, add money to their account online.
- Students make choices when arrive at school.
- Please help them at home decide what they want that day. Lunch menus found on ISD website.

Lunch from Home:

- Label your child's lunchbox with their first and last name.
- Be sure to send containers your child can open on their own.







- Students are allowed to use the restrooms as needed throughout the day.
- Accidents can happen and in that case your child is sent to the health room for a change of clothes. Please keep an extra set of clothes in their backpack.
- Teach your child how to use a public restroom (urinals included)







Lost & Found

- To help prevent things from getting lost, be sure to put your child's name on everything!
- Lost and Found is located downstairs by the main stairwell. Please check it regularly, as we donate left items several times throughout the year.







Foster Independence

Lunch/Snack:

• Have your child practice opening and closing commonly used containers and food items

Car:

- Have your child practice unbuckling and buckling seatbelt/car seat buckle
- Child must exit right/passenger side of car Clothes:
- Have your child practice tying shoes, zipping zippers, buttoning, etc.
- Opening/closing backpacks and taking on and off







Nervousness

- Remind your child that each day will be fun as they learn new things and make new friends. Build them up with positivity!
- Quick goodbyes work best, even if there are tears.
- Watch for signs of stress... please let your teacher know
 - Sore stomach
 - Sleeplessness
 - Changes in behavior/ attitude







Zzzz... Bedtime

August - set a routine:

- It is important for your child to be alert and ready to learn each day. Set a bedtime, practice it and be consistent.
- Read a book before bed
