AGENDA with MINUTES

1. Call to Order and Establish a Quorum
Patrick Just called the meeting to order at 5:02 PM and began recording. A Quorum of voting members were present.

3. Welcome and Introductions
Members present: Patrick Just, Nichól Smithers, Farah Brabson, Daysha Crain, Rebecca Stuart, Shawn Hughes, Janice Longino, Betsy Wooldridge
4. Election of Officers
Patrick Just recommended waiting until the next meeting to elect officers and all present were in agreement.
5. BasePoint Academy -- Angie Scalf
Angie Scalf from BasePoint Academy presented on the children's mental health national state of emergency, access to mental healthcare, and services provided by BasePoint mental health facility including Intensive Outpatient and Partial Hospitalization, mental health screening and assistance with finding care and providers. Patrick Just recommended the SHAC consider initiatives to help our school community with mental health.
6. Fentanyl Awareness Review (Tucker's Law) HB 3908
Patrick Just presented the district video for grades 6-8 that will be played for students to meet the HB 3908 requirements. The video content is scripted from Texas Education Agency's requirements.

7. Medication for Respiratory Distress (TEC §38.201-215) Policy Adoption
Consideration

Nichól Smithers presented information about adopting a policy to allow the district to provide medication for respiratory distress. The Education Code was amended in 2023 and the Department of State Health Services posted their draft rules for public comment in October. Final rules are anticipated in January 2025. From August 2022 to today, district nurses have had 362 clinic visits from 269 students for respiratory distress that required them to be sent home, to the ER or EMS to be called. Albuterol costs about 60 cents per nebulized dose. Implementation of the program would cost approximately \$525 with the goal of preventing EMS calls or ER visits.

8. Future Topics and Discussions

Patrick Just again recommended the SHAC consider initiatives to help our school community with mental health.

Janice Longino presented successes from the Kids Teaching Kids 21-Day Challenge held this fall at all 16 elementary schools. The program involves CTE students who compete to create menus that elementary students can use for their 21-day healthy snack challenge. 1700 elementary students signed up for the challenge. Eleven PE teachers had high student participation and received a paid membership to TAHPERD from Medical City Dallas, who sponsors the program. The challenge ends with a participation survey and three Rockwall ISD teachers had high survey participation and were awarded a paid registration and lodging to TAHPERD annual conference. The district also held the staff healthy snack challenge at the same time and 250 staff members participated. Cullins-Lake Pointe Elementary had the highest staff participation and won a staff lunch.
