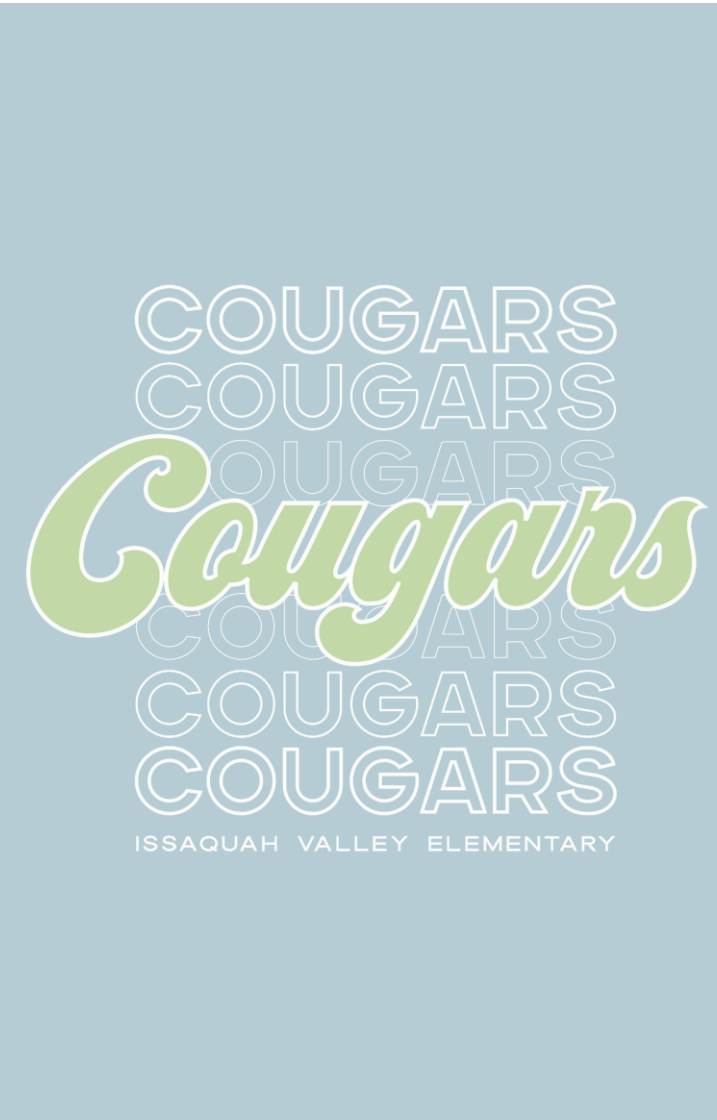

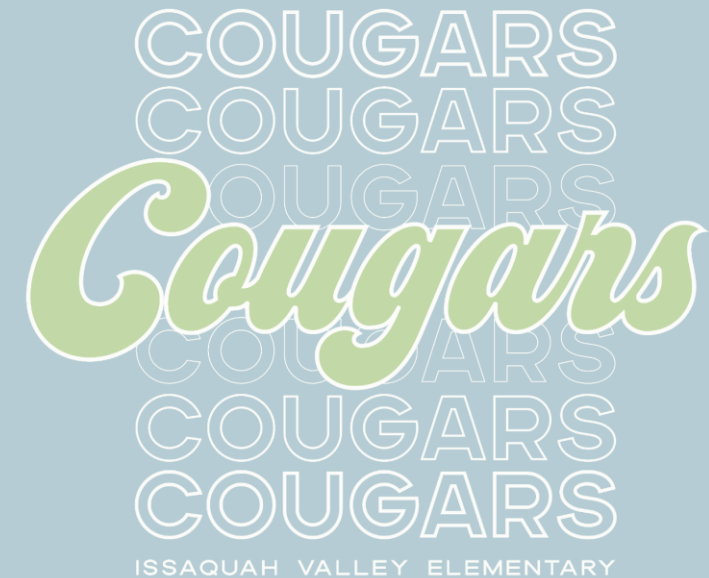

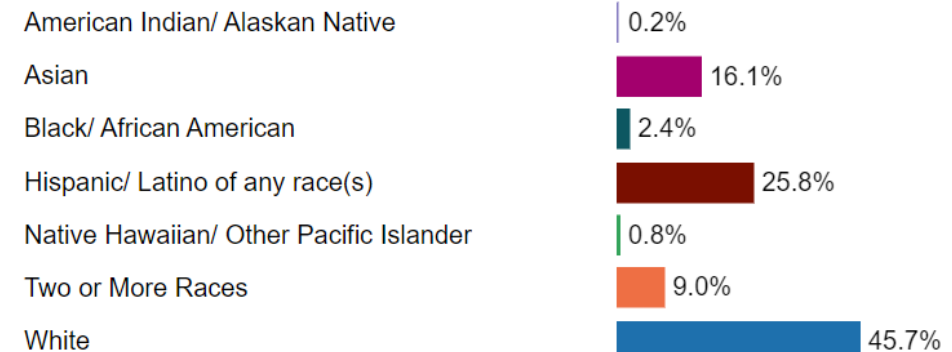

# Medically Verified Immunization Records

- Students new to the Issaquah School District and incoming Kindergarten students need to provide a medically verified immunization record at the time of registration.
- A medically verified record can come directly from the **W**ashington **S**tate **I**mmunization **I**nformation **S**ystem (**WAIIS**).
- **The WAIIS** is the database for Washington State and is where medically verified immunization information is maintained. All parents have access to this site to print a validated Certificate of Immunization (**CIS**) for students. Health Care Practitioner offices also have this information for their families.

# Acceptable Immunization Documentation Includes ONE of the Following:

- A Certificate of Immunization Status (CIS) printed from the (WAIIS)
- A physical copy of the State CIS form with a healthcare provider signature.
- A physical copy of the CIS with accompanying medical immunization records from a healthcare provider verified and signed by school staff
- A CIS printed from MyIR.

# Required Immunizations for New Students

- 2 MMR's (measles, mumps and rubella) given in the appropriate time frames
- 5 doses of DTaP (diphtheria, tetanus & pertussis) given in the appropriate time frames
- 2 doses of varicella given in the appropriate time frames
- 4 doses of polio (IPV) given in a specific time frames
- 3 doses of Hepatitis B, given in the appropriate time frames
- 1 Tdap for students 7th grade and above
- Vaccines against COVID-19 are not required for school attendance.

# 30 Day Conditional Status from the First Day of Attendance no Longer in Effect

Students will need a completed CIS or **Certificate of Exemption (COE)** on file at school **before the first day of attendance.**

If students are missing doses, they will need to get **all the doses they are eligible** to receive **before** starting school. They can then attend school in a Conditional Status until the minimum valid date of the next vaccine is reached. They then have 30 calendar days to turn in documentation of having received the dose. This continues on until all vaccines have been administered and documented.

# Example

- If a child has all their immunizations except the 2-dose MMR series, and they get dose 1 of the MMR the day before school starts and it is documented with the school that day, the child can enter school because...
  - Dose 2 of the MMR cannot be given until 28 days after the first dose.
  - Beginning on day 29 after the first dose, the child has 30 days to get MMR dose #2.

# MY CHILD IS NOT 5 YEARS OLD YET...

Children can receive their school immunizations at age 4. Contact your healthcare provider to schedule your appointment.





# We are moving from another state and cannot find our immunization records. Now what?



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- Immunization records from another state's immunization registry are accepted as medically verified records.

OR

- Call your provider in the state you moved from and have them send the immunization records directly to the school either by fax or by email.



# We are moving from another country and cannot find our child's immunization records. What do we do?

- Immunizations verified by the Immigration Dept are accepted
- If possible, contact the provider in your first country via email or phone to have them send you the records
- Get established with a provider in this country. They can order lab titers to be drawn which will determine if your child has immunity to the different diseases.

# SUMMARY of IMMUNIZATION INFORMATION

- Your student may register for school, but MAY NOT attend school until provider-verified immunizations have been received and validated by the school nurse.
- The child must have all immunizations they are eligible to receive prior to starting school.
- Or there is a **Certificate of Exemption** on file signed by the parent AND the licensed healthcare provider.

# Please Notify the School if your Child has a Life-Threatening Health Condition such as:

- A severe allergy for which an epinephrine auto injector device (Epipen™) has been prescribed.
- Diabetes
- Severe asthma
- A seizure disorder
- A cardiac condition
- Adrenal Insufficiency
- Other conditions of concern

# Why does the school need to know if my child has one of these conditions?

- If your child has a life-threatening condition, WA state law says there must be an emergency care plan and any associated medication in place in the school building before the child can attend school.
- This is to keep the student safe in the event they experience a medical emergency during the school day.
- If your child has a life-threatening condition, please contact the school nurse in your child's school before the student attends.

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# 2025-26 Incoming Kindergarten Registration

It is an exciting time of year as the Issaquah School District begins to reach out to our community in preparation of welcoming the incoming Kindergarten at their neighborhood school. The Issaquah School District offers full day Kindergarten at no cost to all students. If you have a child who will be a kindergartener for the 2025-2026, **please visit the [ISD New Student Enrollment website](#)**. Students who are turning 5 years old by August 31, 2025, are eligible for enrollment for the 2025-2026 school year.

Schools plan to meet with incoming Kindergarten families in February and March 2025. Schools will share this information in their electronic bulletins and on their website. Connect with your neighborhood school for more details about that meeting. This meeting will prepare families to complete the online registration. Registration begins March 12, 2025. Please visit the **ISD New Student Enrollment website** to begin your incoming kindergartner's registration. Once the online portion is complete, you will work with your neighborhood school to complete the enrollment process. *If you cannot access the online application, please call or visit your neighborhood school for assistance.*

- *Please Note: Students in the **Early Childhood Education (ECE) Program, SLP Program, Early Childhood Education & Assistance Program (ECEAP), Transition to Kindergarten (TK)** and those **previously evaluated by Special Services (ex. Childfind)** must still complete the online kindergarten enrollment process to register for kindergarten. Please start the process as though you are a new student to the Issaquah School District.*

School offices are open from 8:30 a.m. – 4:30 p.m. to assist you. Please note for your convenience, arrival and dismissal times are very high traffic times for the school office. Picking up or submitting required documents at this time may result in longer wait times.

All incoming kindergartners are registering at their neighborhood school. The Issaquah School District doesn't allow for families to choose the school their students attend. Your neighborhood school is determined by your home address.

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# REGISTRATION

- Students who are turning 5 years old by August 31, 2025, are eligible for enrollment for 2025-2026 school year.
- Registration is online some items will need to be brought to the school.
- Documents that need to be turned in, please make an appointment, or if you have questions, please contact our Registrar: Wendee Fowler (425-837-6600) or [fowlerw@issaquah.wednet.edu](mailto:fowlerw@issaquah.wednet.edu)
- Registration begins: March 12th



# Things to remember

- To enroll a student in kindergarten for the 2025-2026 school year, a child must turn 5 years old by August 31, 2025.
- A half day, morning kindergarten option will be available for families. Half day kindergarten students may still ride the bus in the morning. However, parents or guardians will be responsible for picking their child up at the end of the three-hour, half-day morning session.
- **Required Documentation:** Parents/Guardians are required to provide, and return, the following documents to their neighborhood school to finish the registration process:
  1. Parent identification
  2. Proof of birth date (birth certificate or passport)
  3. PSE Bill - no older than 30 days.
  4. ONE of the following:
    - Home purchase papers or property tax statement
    - Lease/Rental agreement (original) on company letterhead.
    - Notarized verification of proof of residency
- You have successfully completed the kindergarten registration process when the online registration is completed and your neighborhood school has received all required documents.

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# Dual Language Program at IVE

- The Dual Language Program is offered at IVE
- Priority registration is given to siblings of students already within the Dual Language Program and those living within the IVE attendance area.
- We accept applications throughout the elementary years, but in order to fully benefit from the program, it is best when students begin in kindergarten.
- We ask that families commit to remaining in the program throughout the elementary years.



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## Kindergarten Readiness

### Independence and Health Skills to Develop Before Starting School

- ✓ Uses the toilet, washes hands, and blows nose independently
- ✓ Packs backpack and puts on coat and shoes independently
- ✓ Opens snack and food containers and eats independently
- ✓ Start a consistent bedtime and morning routine before school starts



**All children grow at their own pace. They all have unique strengths and skills to work on!**

Use this as a guide to identify opportunities to learn and grow. Students will continue to work on these skills in kindergarten!

### Social and Emotional Development

- ☐ Shares ideas and takes turns
- ☐ Names or identifies feelings
- ☐ Keeps trying when things feel hard and asks for help, if needed
- ☐ Suggests solutions to problems



### Language and Communication

- ☐ Uses words to express wants, needs, thoughts, and feelings
- ☐ Remembers and retells an experience
- ☐ Takes turns in conversations
- ☐ Follows one and two-step directions

### Early Literacy

- ☐ Enjoys stories and knows how to turn pages in a book
- ☐ Knows some letters and letter sounds
- ☐ Writes the letters in their first name
- ☐ Claps syllables in words and engages in rhyming activities
- ☐ Holds a pencil with 3-point finger grip



### Mathematical Thinking

- ☐ Counts 10 items accurately
- ☐ Knows basic colors and shapes
- ☐ Sorts objects in different ways
- ☐ Compares quantities and uses words such as "more" and "less"

# How can I help my child prepare for kindergarten?

## Get to Know Your School

- Check your **school website and sign up for e-news!** Take your child to welcome events or to play on the playground.
- Walk to the bus stop before the first day so your child gets familiar with the routine. Attend the **Bus Ride-along** event in August!
- In August, attend **Meet the Teacher and Family Connection Meeting**. We can't wait to meet everyone!

## Be Ready for the School Day

- Help your child build independence and master these skills **before** school.
  - Using the bathroom independently
  - Washing hands –make sure to scrub for about 20 seconds!
  - Opening food containers and eating lunch within 20 minutes, without prompting
  - Putting on footwear – if they are unable to tie laces, slip-ons or Velcro are great!
  - Putting on a coat – practice buttoning or zipping up
- Kids need energy to learn, play, and manage emotions. Ensure they are getting enough sleep (9-12 hours) and start their day with a nutritious breakfast.
- Consistent bedtime and morning routine – get this started **before** school starts

## Set Expectations

- Be a role model by showing your child a positive attitude about school and learning.
- Talk with your child about going to kindergarten and answer any questions they might have.
- Talk about how you expect them to behave at school and the importance of respecting teachers, students, and other staff.

## Practice Skills at Home

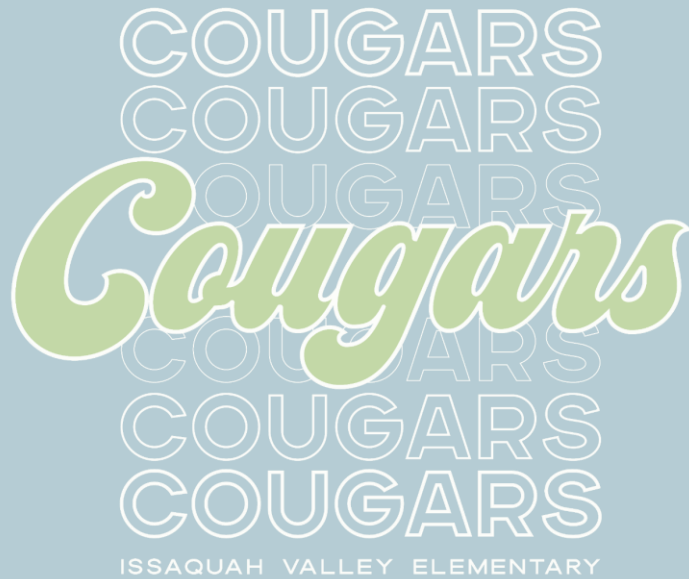
- Read to your child and tell stories daily – in English and/or your home language!
- Find the math in daily experiences (count, sort, name shapes, compare object, etc)! Count or sort toys, laundry, food items...anything and everywhere!
- Teach your child their full name and practice writing their first name.
- Use everyday situations to practice taking turns, sharing, and following routines.



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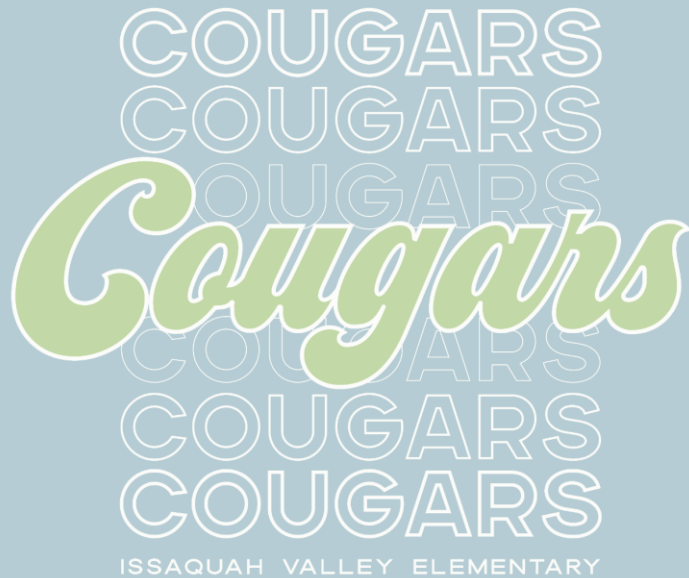

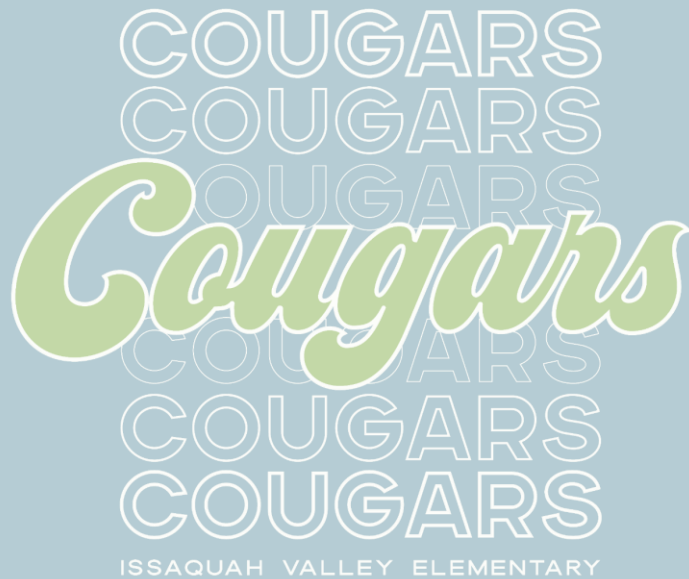

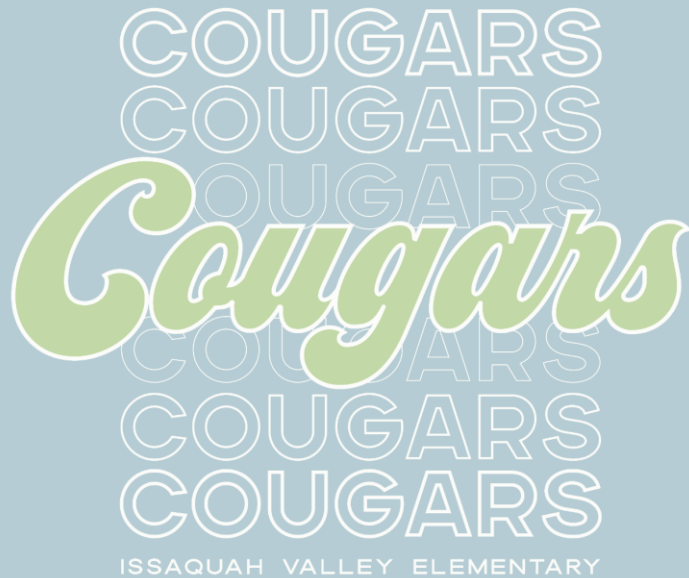


# Kindergarten Screener

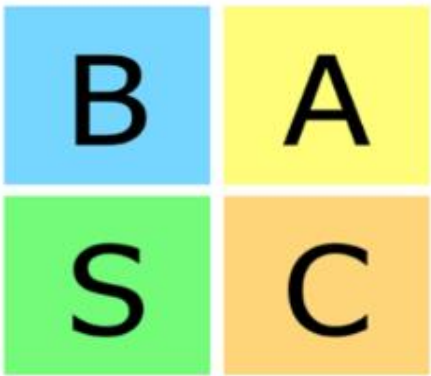

## SCHOOL AGE CARE

### SERVING K-5 STUDENTS

The Before and After School Care Program (BASC) provides a positive environment for children to grow socially, emotionally, and intellectually under the guidance of our well-trained team. We offer diverse activities to meet the interests and skill levels of our participants, including STEM, cooperative games, community service learning, art, and cooking.

During out of school time, children will be able to access many areas of our schools, including the gym, playground, and multi-purpose room. 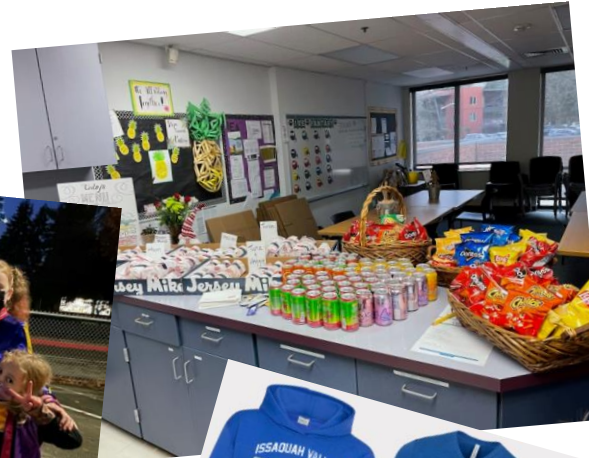

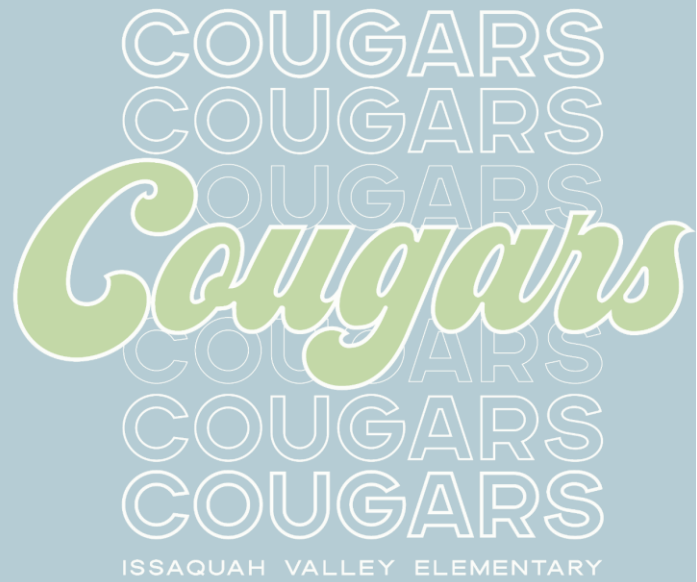

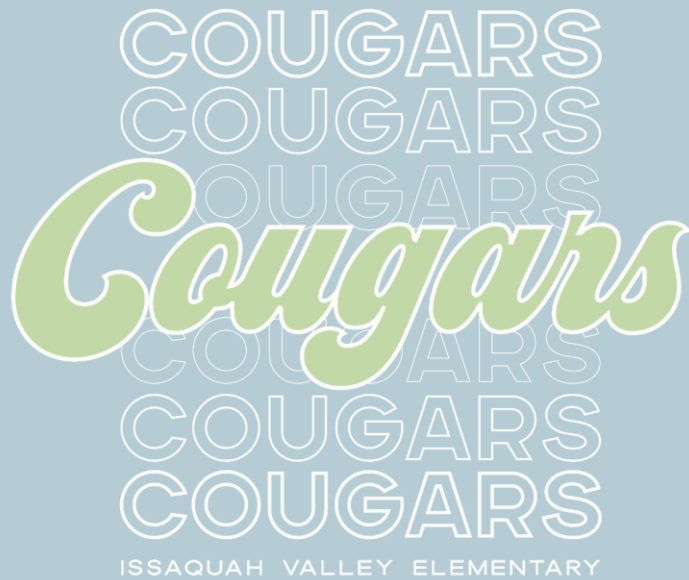
