**THE FIRST SUNDAY OF LENT**  
**MARCH 9, 2025**

**From Fr. Eric:**

*The Temptation of Jesus*

The narrative of the temptation of Jesus in the Gospel Reading is very well known to many Christians. The distinct feature is how Jesus makes a difference in the story of humanity, particularly in the area of temptation and sin. It is important to note Luke's particular attention to Jesus' sojourn in the desert. He affirms that Jesus did not go there of his own accord but was led by the Holy Spirit. The purpose of his sojourn in the desert must therefore be related to what the Holy Spirit can do in the life of those who are docile to him. The information that Jesus was filled with the Holy Spirit anticipates the successful outcome of the encounter between Jesus and the devil.

The duration of the temptation is given as forty days, and it is only at the end that the devil tried a last chance with a triple temptation. Luke's version is different from the text of Matthew in which Jesus fasted for forty days and forty nights at the end of which he was tempted. Luke was not interested in telling us what form the temptation took within the forty days. His focus, just like that of Matthew, is on the last lap of the encounter. This last attempt is the climax of the encounter between Jesus and the devil, and it is what has become the popular story of the temptation.

The dialogue between Jesus and the devil is significant for the lesson that we are invited to learn from the story. Each question of the devil can be said to be well founded and very appealing to the human mind. For example, in the first temptation, the hungry Jesus was asked to do something that would benefit him personally not only because it would give him food to satisfy his hunger, but it will also prove that he is truly the Son of God. Human tendency is to use the easiest means to provide for our needs. The temptation to turn stones into food for our own satisfaction is very attractive. We would not have to toil to obtain our food. As a way of defending our selfish act, we would not be far from concurring with the devil that such an act proves that indeed we are children of God.

The response of Jesus to the devil indicates that divine sonship is not for exploitation by the person who is endowed with it. God did not make Jesus "son" so that he can misuse his powers. His sonship is meant for those he has come to redeem. An abuse of power as proposed by the devil will not be in consonant with his divine nature. For us human beings too, we need to be careful not to make use of God's gifts to us in a selfish way. God bestows his blessings and graces on us for the benefit of others. Our gifts are for service to the human race and not for our personal gains. We should not ask ourselves what we shall gain from what we do but rather how our actions fulfil the plan of God for the good of our brothers and sisters. When we seek personal satisfaction, we end up being short-sighted and fail to cooperate with God in the realization of his kingdom here on earth. We fail to be instruments in the hand of God for the good of humanity. We should not be over-worried about our personal needs because God has his own ways of providing for those who trust in him. The prayer of thanksgiving that Moses prescribed for the people of Israel at the time of harvest is a key to understanding God's care for us. Moses asked the people to acknowledge their humble origins before God. They are to recall their time of slavery and deliverance. The land that gives them the fruits that they bring to offer to him is a gift from him. In acknowledging that all comes from God and is pure gift, we free ourselves from all forms of temptation and learn to rely on him. He guides our steps on the right path & never allows us to stray away from him.

"Jesus, be my shield and strength in times of temptation!"
