Certificate of Multilingual Proficiency

Attention senior, are you bilingual? Did you test out of the WIDA test? Do you want to be recognized for being proficient in two or more languages?

The Certificate of Multilingual Proficiency is an award designated on a student's transcript that shows the student has attained a higher level of proficiency in one or more languages in addition to English.

What are the requirements?



In order to receive the Certificate of Multilingual Proficiency, a student must do the following:



- Meet high school English Language Arts requirement of 8 credits in ELA
- Score Level 5 or higher on WIDA Access OR satisfy the
 High School 51 A requirement
- High School ELA requirement
 Earn at least 6 credits in World Languages (or
- Earn at least 6 creats in world Languages (or through demonstrating proficiency)
- Demonstrate a proficiency level of Intermediate High on an approved external exam.

Graduation will be here before you know it, and hopefully, by now you have begun to think about your post-secondary plans, whether that be a 4-year college/university, 2-year college, technical/trade school, the military, or the workforce. Continuing your education requires you to be knowledgeable and proactive about the application process, because many schools have hard and fast deadlines that are quickly approaching.

Most colleges and universities require the following to be considered for admission: a completed online application, a recent high school transcript, and SAT/ACT test scores (sent from the testing agency). Additional information that may be required includes a letter of recommendation, a secondary school report/counselor form, and a written essay/personal statement. We encourage you to visit the admissions sites of the schools you are considering in order to learn about their specific criteria and requirements. It is important to note that both Purdue and Indiana University-Bloomington have a November 1, 2024 deadline to be considered for merit-based scholarships and some selective programs/majors. For Purdue this includes consideration for the Honors College, computer science, nursing, and vet-tech programs, and for IU this includes the Jacobs School of Music.

Creating a StudentAid.Gov account (also called FSA ID account)

Before students start the 2025-26 FAFSA, there are a few steps they and their family can do to be ready to file.

- Have the student create a <u>StudentAid.gov</u> account at least 3 days BEFORE filing.
- <u>Have them check their dependency status</u>. Note: Most students will be considered dependent students.
- Dependent students will be required to include their parent's financial information on the FAFSA. See who is <u>considered a parent.</u>
- Their parents will also need to <u>create a StudentAid.gov username and password</u>.
- Then, they can <u>log in at studentaid.gov</u> to make sure they are all set.

How to file the 2025-2026 FAFSA

Students can file the FAFSA online at $\underline{studentaid.gov}.$ Information needed to complete the FAFSA include:

- StudentAid.gov Account (FSA ID)
- Federal income tax returns, W-2s, and other records of money earned from 2023
- List of any federal benefits received
- Asset information including bank statements and records of investments (if applicable)
- Records of untaxed income (if applicable)
