English Language Learners - 1st Grade

Rationale

Mehlville School District's First and Second Grade English Language Learners (ELL) curriculum enables the ELL student to participate actively in a social and educational setting. Particular emphasis is placed on developing communication skills and introducing the student to the procedures of the American classroom. Initially, the teacher works to enable the student to meet safety, emotional, and social needs. Special emphasis at this grade level is placed on gaining meaning from text, conveying meaning through both oral and written language, and listening effectively, all skills that are vital to the student's on-going participation in the American classroom.

Course Description

In a print-rich environment, the ELL student is encouraged to interact with the teacher and classmates. Through guided reading, language experience activities, discussion, appropriate artwork, and games, the student will develop increasing confidence in their abilities to make meaning of English text and to share meaning. The teacher continues to be mindful and respectful of the growth and influence of the child's native and dominant language. Teaching will be appropriate to the child's individual needs.

Course Objectives

1. The student will give information and respond to questions about home and family and state his or her name, address, and phone number with 90% accuracy. (1.8; TESOL 1-1)
