### Clubs and Activities Offered At OTHS

**Academic Challenge Team** Academic Challenge Team is a competitive series of tests. The tests are offered to high school teams and are designed to challenge the brightest students. Test material, drawn from freshman-level college coursework, is written by teams of college and university faculty. Students are tested in the areas of: Biology, Chemistry, Computer science, Engineering graphics, English, Mathematics and Physics. Membership in the OTHS Academic Challenge Team is by invitation only, where team members are selected by recommendations of their English, Math, and Science teachers. Once the team is chosen, we practice once a week per subject area. Since each person on the team must compete in TWO subject areas, each person will meet twice a week to practice in their subject. **Adrenaline A Cappella:** Adrenaline is OTHS's premier a cappella ensemble. Music is performed entirely with voices, and repertoire includes popular music, unlike the traditional curricular choirs. Mrs. Polett ([poletth@oths.us](mailto:poletth@oths.us)) is the group's sponsor.

**AFJROTC (Air Force Junior Reserve Officer Training Corps):** AFJROTC provides citizenship training and an aerospace science program for high school students. Secondary school students who enroll in the AFJROTC program are offered a wide variety of curricular and co-curricular activities. The program explores the historic and scientific aspects of aerospace technology and teaches high school students self-reliance, self-discipline, and other leadership characteristics. Science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) concepts are also an important part of this world-class program. By Title 10 United States Code, the program is a citizenship program and not chartered as a recruiting program for the military services and those students who participate in AFJROTC do not incur any obligation to the Air Force. AFJROTC objectives are to educate and train high school cadets in citizenship and life skills; promote community service; instill a sense of responsibility; and develop character, leadership, and self-discipline through education and instruction in air and space fundamentals and the Air Force's core values of integrity first, service before self and excellence in all we do. **Art Club:** Art Club is open to all students. They do not have to be enrolled in an art class. The club is a social club for students to participate in a variety of art activities and receive opportunities to volunteer for special events that require young artists. Any OTHS student can join by filling out a short student information form and submitting a five-dollar entry fee to Ms. Linneman no later than Wednesday September 20th. Forms can be picked up in room 2414 at Milburn and 615 at Smiley. Meetings will be held in room 615 at the Smiley campus tentatively every third Wednesday of each month from 3:00-4:00 pm. **Asian Culture Club:** The Asian Culture Club is open to anyone who would love to learn more about Asian culture. This includes all Asian ethnic groups including East Asia, Middle East, India, etc. This is a safe space to share and discuss about Asian culture including food, dress, games, music, holidays, and so much more. **Athletic Leadership Council:** The OTHS Athletic Leadership Council is an initiative that was started in an effort to provide mentoring for those who have been identified as people of influence within their respective OTHS athletic teams. Meetings are held throughout the school year with a focus on the following to PAVE the way to successful leadership: Principles (a fundamental, primary, or general law or truth from which others are derived), Action (what students will do to align with who they want to be), Values (qualities that represent our highest priorities and deeply held beliefs; focused on three pillars – compete fiercely, lead boldly, and love strong), and Examine/Evaluate (reflection on actions, challenges, and meeting intention. **Band and Color guard:** The OTHS Band program has over 250 students. Offerings range from curricular music ensembles to numerous extracurricular activities and ensembles. The following are the extra-curricular offerings for the fall: Jazz Band, Jazz Ensemble, Jazz Combo, Madrigal Brass, Flute Choir, and Winter guard. Fall Marching Band and Fall Color guard are co-curricular. The following are the extra-curricular offerings for the spring: Jazz Band, Jazz Ensemble, Jazz Combo, Flute Choir, Winter guard, Musical Pit. OTHS is the 2011 WGI Scholastic A World Champion. Winter guard begins in November and ends in April. This indoor color guard group rehearses an artistic show utilizing various color guard equipment and dance. Experience is encouraged but not necessary. The O'Fallon Band program is recognized as being a top comprehensive program in the State of Illinois, due to the musical numerous offerings and performance achievements of the ensembles. The band also takes a trip every other year (New York – 2014, Tournament of Roses 2015). **Bass Fishing Club:** The Bass Fishing Club will teach students about the sport of bass fishing both recreationally and competitively. Students will develop necessary skills, discover how to become effective leaders and selfless teammates, and learn to enjoy bass fishing. The club will have monthly meetings, club outings, and tournaments. The Bass Fishing club will represent our high school and the community of O'Fallon throughout the state of Illinois. **Chemistry Team:** The Washington University Chemistry Tournament (WUCT) is a national high school chemistry competition held on Washington University's Danforth campus in St. Louis, MO. We invite high school students across the nation to participate in a series of individual and team-based chemistry exams, engage with college students and faculty, and earn recognition at an awards ceremony. WUCT emphasizes real-world applications of science and encourages problem-solving and teamwork skills. Additionally, we hope to increase the relationships between our community and students at OTHS. Mrs. Magee ([mageel@oths.us](mailto:mageel@oths.us)) is the sponsor for this activity.

**History Club:** The History Club is an activity for individuals who are interested in expanding their knowledge of all forms in history; American, World, Contemporary, Ancient, etc. It is a forum that will provide a different approach to understanding history where a classroom setting is limited. The club will watch historical films, take field trips, research holidays and historical events, and conduct interviews of family members. All students are eligible to participate in History Club. History club typically begins meeting following Thanksgiving break; please listen for meeting dates on the Panther Beat broadcast. **Illinois Music Honor Society:** In a phrase, perform, lead, and serve. An Illinois Music Honor Society chapter opens up a world of opportunities for students who have already shown themselves to be academically capable and musically gifted. Through performance and community service, they'll develop confidence, creativity, critical thinking, compassion, and a host of other leadership skills sure to serve students well in school and beyond. Students must be enrolled in a music class to join. Dr. Gustafson-Hinds ([gustafson-hindsm@oths.us](mailto:gustafson-hindsm@oths.us)) is the sponsor for this activity.

**Interact Club:** Interact is Rotary International's service club for young people. Each year, Interact clubs complete at least two community service projects, one of which furthers international understanding and goodwill. At OTHS, we participate in Rotary's Highway 50 clean up twice a year, purchase gifts for "Secret Santa" for children of need in our community, as well as other small-scale community service projects. Opportunities are also available for students to participate in Interact related conferences and participate in an international service project. General member meetings are every other Tuesday in room 110 on the Smiley campus. All students are eligible to participate in Interact Club. **Intramurals:** Students will have the opportunity to participate in a number of alternative sports. The sports offered this year will likely be, but not limited to: Quidditch, 3 on 3 basketball, Ping Pong, and Laser Tag. All students are eligible to participate in Intramurals. Limits on the number of teams/players will be determined for each individual sport. Mr. Henry ([henryn@oths.us](mailto:henryn@oths.us)) is the sponsor for this activity.

**Investment Club:** The OTHS Investment club was created to help improve financial literacy within the student body. The objective is to provide opportunities for students from all backgrounds and socio-economic levels to learn finance and investing skills that will last a lifetime and empower students to take control of their financial future. Topics such as building credit, loans, taxes, stocks, bonds, mutual funds, real estate, precious metals, and collectibles will be presented, discussed, and analyzed. The club

**Key Club** is the largest and oldest student-led service organization in the world. It is sponsored by the local Kiwanis Club and an OTHS faculty member. This club provides its members with opportunities to be servants within the school and their communities, build character, prepare for useful citizenship, and develop initiative and leadership. Key Club is open to all freshman through senior level. We hold monthly meetings and complete service activities throughout the year around our area community. **Martin Luther King, Jr. Legacy Club:** The purpose of this club is to create opportunities to discuss and integrate African-American history and culture throughout the OTHS and Metro-East community. The members of the MLK Legacy Club will develop an annual calendar of events highlighting contributions of African Americans. On the 1st and 3rd Tuesdays of the month at 3:15pm., the team will inform and educate our community on specific aspects of African American Culture and its contributions to our collective American history. In addition, the club will support and promote community activities that highlight its diversity and give back to the community through service opportunities as well. The club is open to all students who have an interest in promoting positive images of African Americans through our school and community and are expected to participate and help with this effort. **Math Team:** More than 60 students participate in math team at OTHS each year. Students are able to brush up on old math concepts, learn some new ones, and compete with and against the best math students in the area! OTHS's math team participates in nine contests each school year, beginning in September and ending in May. See the math team website for a full competition schedule. Math team members are invited to participate by their honors math teachers based on in-class performance and natural ability. **Mock Trial:** The Mock Trial Team allows interested students to acquire knowledge of careers and topics related to law. Students can learn about trial procedures, case analysis, and trial strategy. Formal tryouts are conducted to select a team of ten students to represent OTHS at the Illinois High School Mock Trial Competition sponsored by the Illinois State Bar Association. The team receives guidance from a teacher coach and local attorneys but all of the arguments, questions and theories are the original work of the students. The competition consists of a law test and participating in two trials. There is an annual field trip to serve as jurors for law school students at Washington University. Guests are also invited to provide students with information about careers in law related occupations.

**Model United Nations:** Model United Nations is a simulation of the United Nations that educates students about diplomacy, international affairs, and public speaking. Students "represent" nations from across the world and participate in simulated sessions of United Nation's committees. This activity involves research into international issues as well as debate and communication skills. MUN enhances a student's understanding of international relations and global affairs while also teaching teamwork and collaboration skills. We meet after school several times each semester. New students will be assigned mentors to assist students in preparation and participation. Model UN participants will have the opportunity to participate in conferences held at McKendree University in November and March. All

students are eligible to participate in Model UN. Mrs. Turner ([turnerk@oths.us](mailto:turnerk@oths.us)) is the sponsor for this activity.

**National Honor Society:** Membership in the local OTHS National Honor Society chapter is an honor bestowed upon a student. Selection for membership is by a faculty council and based on outstanding achievement in 4 areas: Scholarship, Service, Leadership, and Character. Leadership: All members are required to actively participate in multiple activities in and out of the classroom. Character: All members must behave responsibly and follow the OTHS Code of Conduct. Service: All members are required to serve 15 hours of community service between the time of induction to April 1st of their senior year. Scholarship: All members are required to maintain academic eligibility with a GPA of 3.5 or higher and taking and passing 5 academic courses each semester. Students at OTHS will be invited to apply into the National Honor Society in March and inducted during an evening ceremony in April, when the following criteria are met:

1. Cumulative GPA of 3.500 or higher after completing their 5th, 6th, or 7th semester
2. Academically eligible, taking and passing 5 academic classes at the end of 5th, 6th, or 7th semester
3. Behaved responsibly and has had no major violations of school policy or Level 1 or 2 Code of Conduct violations
4. Candidates must have been in attendance at the school the equivalent of one semester

Juniors will participate in the induction ceremony during their 6th semester and seniors will participate during their 8th semester. Once inducted, members have the responsibility to continue to demonstrate these qualities and the NHS National Constitution defines several obligations for members. First, all members are to maintain the standards by which they were selected. In addition, the constitution expects members to attend meetings, and to participate in both individual and chapter service projects during the year. All members in Good Standing will earn the distinction of wearing the National Honor Society Gold Stole at graduation. **Outdoors Club:** The OTHS Outdoors Club promotes interest in the outdoors by providing opportunities to participate in various outdoor activities and to teach participants to become stewards of the environment. These goals are achieved through club meetings, outdoor activities and other educational events and service learning projects. Activities include kayaking/canoeing, rock climbing, archery, paddle-boarding, hiking, geocaching and biking. **Panther Beat Broadcast Club:** The Broadcast club produces a daily announcements show and monthly broadcast that airs during advisories and on O'Fallon's public access cable channel. Sophomores, juniors, and seniors need to take at least one semester of Beginning Video Production class in order to participate. Once trained in the class, they are welcome to freelance as members of the club. Freshmen are welcome to ride the activity bus and assist after school behind the scenes with the taping of the daily broadcast in room 103, assist with the live streaming of athletic games, and report from the Milburn campus. Freshmen interested in reporting from Milburn should attend a special training session. The date for training will be announced on the Panther Beat. **Panther Connect:** Panther Connect is a student-led group centered on mental wellness and making real-life personal connections. It provides students an opportunity to “unplug” from our artificially connected world and, instead, to get to know others, build genuine relationships, and even get to know themselves better along the way. Panther Connect student leaders meet 2-4 times per month to socialize, support one another, and plan fun, stress-relieving activities for the school community that are conducted throughout the year. This group focuses on mental-health awareness, positivity, empowerment, and providing safe spaces for students to be their authentic selves. **Peace of Mind Yoga Club:** Peace of Mind is a place where our students can gather to work on mindfulness, positive coping mechanisms, and begin to understand how a consistent yoga practice can benefit their overall health. We will create a community that focuses on self-growth, self-care and building awareness of our body, breath and mind connection. **Philosophy Club:** Activities will include student led studies of notable philosophers from history (Aristotle, Plato, Nietzsche, Kant, etc.) along with discussions of notable topics (nature vs. nurture, interactive dualism, morality, justice and law, religion, existentialism, etc.) to introduce students to classical thought. Members will be asked to conduct research into these individuals, their beliefs and to connect these classics to contemporary issues. Discussions will be shared at each club meeting.

**Pride (formerly GSA):** Pride is a student organization intended to provide a safe and supportive environment for lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender (LGBT+) youth and their straight allies. The goal of the organization is to make the school community safe and welcoming to all students, regardless of sexual orientation or gender identity. Pride participates in national campaigns to raise awareness and other fun activities members are interested in. All students are eligible to participate in Pride. Meetings will be held at Smiley directly after school. Meetings will be announced on Panther Beat and will be posted in the daily bulletin on the OTHS website. **Prom Committee:** The Prom Committee is responsible for helping with various aspects of the junior-senior prom including assembling decorations on the day of prom as well as distributing invitations and creating locker signs in the weeks leading up to the prom. **Robotics Team (aka Team 1208, aka the Metool Brigade):** The OTHS Robotics Team participates in the First Robotics Competition (FRC). We design, build and operate a 140 lb, 5-foot-high robot. Each competition season presents a new challenge for robot design. Students have the opportunity to work in computer programming, electronics, mechanics, construction, graphic design, and administration. Our team and robot participate in a worldwide competition with over 2600 teams. All students are eligible to participate in Robotics. **Scholar Bowl:** Scholar Bowl is a competitive academic team. The team plays 5 on 5 matches with other schools using questions taken from several academic and cultural disciplines. Any student can play provided they come to practices, are involved in fundraising, and stay eligible. Scholar Bowl meets on Thursday's for practice (starting the first Thursday of October) and have matches on Thursdays evenings (beginning in late November). Tournaments are on Saturdays (4 or 5 tournaments throughout the year). We also participate in Hi-Q, which is a televised competition held by SIU-Carbondale (3 Monday evenings in November and December, if we continue to win matches). **Science Olympiad:** Science Olympiad is a team competition where students compete in events pertaining to science. There are many different areas of competition, so there is something for everyone! The competitive events encompass all disciplines of science, including life science, earth and space science, physical science and chemistry, technology and engineering, and inquiry and nature of science. The Science Olympiad team will compete at the regional competition and possibly the state competition. **Sign Language Club:** OTHS American Sign Language Club is a space for students to meet new people, learn the language, and become immersed in Deaf culture. Students will learn their alphabet, numbers, basic signs, and conversational phrases. Students will engage in vocabulary lessons and play games to put their new skills to use. **SkillsUSA:** Skills USA is geared toward occupational competitions ranging from Construction related fields to Culinary Arts. The club generally meets during the spring semester. **Spanish Club:** Spanish club is an activity in which students can learn more about the Spanish language and cultural aspects of Spanish Speaking Countries. **Speech and Acting Team:** Members of the Speech and Acting Team participate in competitive speech and acting events. All students are eligible to participate in Speech and Acting Team. Practices begin in September. Regular season competitions start in November. The state finals are in February. **Sports Medicine Club:** Members of the sports medicine club will discuss career fields related to sports medicine. Team doctors, physical therapists, and other professionals will share information about the

**Sports Psychology Club:** It is the vision of the Sport Psychology club to help students to evaluate who they really are and what their potential in life might be. It is important to understand the importance of team work and individual responsibilities in reaching maximum potential. It is important that student athletes learn responsibility, humility, and careful decision making in every area of their life. All students are eligible to participate in the Sports Psychology Club. **Spring Musical:** The Spring Musical is an annual performance of a Broadway show performed by OTHS students in grades 9-12. Any and all students are invited to audition and perform. Both on stage and off stage roles are available. Off stage roles allow students to learn the more technical side of putting on a stage performance. Duties include but are not excluded to; running the spot lights, helping with sound and lighting, or designing and setting the stage for various scenes. Those who participate in on stage duties, such as acting or singing, will be expected to attend all rehearsals. Auditions for the spring musical will be held in January, rehearsals begin in January, and the performances are in March! **Student Council:** Student Council, which includes all class officers and representatives, leads and sets the example for students of OTHS through our character and attitude, organizing of events, promoting the general welfare of the school, and bettering the surrounding community. Student Council is made up of an appointed Executive Council, elected class officers, and elected representatives. All students are eligible to run for Student Council. Students are elected by fellow classmates based off a completed petition, interview process, and an election. Elections for freshmen are held at the beginning of the school year, and sophomore, junior, and senior elections are held second semester for the following year. **Tabletop Club:** Creative problem solving, teamwork, and fast math skills all come together in a unique combination when looking at Dungeons and Dragons and other Tabletop Role Playing Games. The aim is to build a community and solidarity among the members of Tabletop Club, giving people an opportunity to explore this remarkably interesting world of TTRPGs without the pressure of finding a large enough friend group. The club meets weekly in the school cafeteria to learn about the games, how to play, and build relationships. All students are welcome and eligible to participate in the Tabletop Club. **Thespian Society:** The OTHS Thespian Society (Troupe #5822) is a division of the larger governing body, The International Thespian Society. The Thespian Society recognizes excellence in student theatre and inducts students who have shown involvement in the Fall Play and/or the Spring Musical. Throughout the course of the year, Thespians attend meetings, elect officers, perform skits, and help promote OTHS productions. Joining the Thespian Society is by invitation only. When a student has acquired 10 Thespian points (as set forth in the International Thespian Handbook), he/she receives an invitation. Freshmen-Seniors may be invited to join. Ms. Eve Knipp ([othsthespians@gmail.com](mailto:othsthespians@gmail.com)) is the sponsor for this activity.

**Threads:** Threads is a sewing and design club-an after-school activity for designing and sewing clothing and accessories. We hope to create an environment conducive to learning sewing and design skills,

receiving helpful feedback from other students, and completing sewing projects to be displayed in a fashion show at the end of the year. Fabric can be supplied by the students if needed, or possibly through fabric donation. Fashion and Design club hopes to be an activity to develop creativity, teamwork skills, life skills relating to sewing, and a fun environment for students to take part in and to make friendly connections. **Treat Yourself (& Others): Self Care Club:** The mission of this group is to learn and practice self-care techniques to help reduce stress and promote positive mental health individually as well as collectively. **Young Conservatives Club:** The O'Fallon Young Conservatives Club is open to all students looking to become active politically. Our mission is to make known and promote the principles of the Republican Party among members of the OTHS campus and community; to engage in and promote meaningful and civil conversation over political topics; to aid in the election of Republican candidates at all levels of government; to encourage and assist in the organization and active functioning of the Republican Party at the local, state, and national levels; to develop political skills and leadership abilities among Republican students as preparation for future service by them to the party and the community.
