## Stewardship

One of the things we all expect—usually two or three times a year—is a sermon in church about giving and stewardship. It's a necessary message, but sometimes, we find ourselves tuning out because we feel like we've "heard it all before." This week's value is all about stewardship, but we may be approaching it differently than you expect.

At a Christian school, stewardship isn't just about being fiscally wise and responsible. It also includes caring for our physical environment, ensuring excellence in education, fostering community support, prioritizing spiritual formation, and preparing to invest wisely for the future.

#### **Financial Stewardship**

The first area of stewardship at BCS is ensuring we handle our budget and financial resources responsibly. This includes fundraising, annual budgets, and tuition. We don't raise tuition simply because it's expected; rather, we carefully evaluate tuition to ensure it covers our expenses, including faculty and staff compensation, utilities, reserves, and much more. It amazes me when I see some of the monthly utility bills that come through in a school our size. It makes me want to go around and turn the lights off all the time. In addition to managing expenses wisely, clear communication about our financial needs is an essential part of stewardship. This is why we hold two association meetings each year—to present our finances, answer questions, and maintain transparency.

#### **Facilities and Physical Environment**

Another area of stewardship is our facilities and physical environment. We strive to maintain our buildings properly—not just to keep them clean, but to ensure they are safe, conducive to learning, and welcoming to parents and visitors. God has blessed us with this facility, and it is our responsibility to care for it, seek ways to improve it, and use our resources wisely.

#### **Educational Stewardship**

One of the most important aspects of stewardship at BCS is educational stewardship—and this is an area where you should expect us to excel. Our commitment extends beyond ensuring a Christian worldview in our curriculum; we also hold ourselves accountable for providing an education that honors God's truths in every subject. This means that we regularly evaluate our curriculum, faculty, and staff to ensure that we are aligned with our mission and vision. As we look ahead to next year, we are carefully assessing class sizes, course offerings, and faculty placement to ensure that we have the right teachers in the right roles—equipping students to grow and succeed to the best of their abilities. This is an ongoing process, one that requires discernment, wisdom, and, most importantly, continual prayer.

#### **Partnership and Communication**

As parents and stakeholders, you may not always see the inner workings of what really goes on in faculty meetings, board discussions, or one-on-one meetings between teachers, parents, and administrators. But rest assured, very few issues go undiscussed by those who have the ability to implement change. Often, when a parent shares a concern, they mention that "many other parents feel the same way." If that's the case, my encouragement to all of you is to come and talk with one of us in administration. We want to hear from you and want to discourage small-group discussions that don't lead to solutions. We've also heard concerns that teachers might take frustrations out on students. If this ever happens, it is a serious issue that we want to address immediately. We want to reaffirm that we want to be in partnership with you, not against you. Our goal is to help your students succeed—not just now, but in the years ahead as they grow into the men and women God has created them to be.

#### **Spiritual Stewardship**

Spiritual stewardship is foundational—not just for our students, but for all of us at BCS. Our prayer is that we will exemplify Christ-like behavior so that our students see a glimpse of Him in our actions. At the same time, we also pray that we will see Christ in them. We are all a work in progress, but we ask God to continue shaping us in our interactions—with parents, students, and colleagues. Additionally, we strive to provide opportunities for students to serve in the community, as true stewardship involves giving back. Our service requirements and volunteer opportunities help students learn through serving.

One incredible example was watching our students and families come together after the recent hurricanes, reaching out in countless ways to help those in need. It was a beautiful demonstration of faith in action.

#### **Legacy Stewardship**

That brings me to the area of legacy stewardship. With everything that falls under stewardship, our ultimate goal is to ensure that this school continues to serve families for generations to come. God has entrusted us with this land, these buildings, our resources, our faculty and staff, our parents, and—most importantly—our students so that we may proclaim His name long after we are gone. This includes our Parrish property, which was given to us for this very purpose. God calls us to use the blessings He has provided to glorify Him and expand His Kingdom.




