2025-26 fiscal year, a Governing Board to declare its operational intent to run an ELO to the Superintendent of Public Instruction, and authorizes districts to use ELO funds to

support attendance recovery programs.

Regulation updated to add definition of "intersession program" and clarify, by describing when a student is considered to be enrolled in an expanded learning opportunities program (ELO), the definition of "provide access". Additionally, regulation updated to require a district that receives ELO apportionment to provide transportation to any student who attends a school that is not operating an ELO so that the student may attend at a location that is providing an ELO and return to the original location or another location that is established by the district. In addition, regulation updated to clarify that for hours of operation of an ELO program, recess and meals are included in the required nine hours of combined time per instructional day. Regulation also updated to reflect NEW LAW (AB 723, 2023) which requires a district that operates an intersession program to grant priority access to a foster youth and NEW LAW (AB 373, 2023) which grants priority access to a student experiencing homelessness, both of which provide that if a student experiencing homelessness or foster youth will be moving during an intersession period, the student's educational rights holder, or in the case of an American Indian Student, Indian custodian, may determine which school the student attends for the intersession period. Additionally, regulation updated to reflect NEW LAW (SB 141, 2023) which provides that a district that is temporarily prevented from operating an ELO because of a school or program site closure due to emergency conditions will not be subject to penalties if the Governing Board adopts a resolution and provides documentation substantiating the need for closure. Add language regarding priority enrollment for English Language Learners (Ed Code 46120, 42238.02)

The Board of Trustees desires to provide learning opportunities for students beyond the regular school day that support the regular education program in a supervised environment. In order to increase academic achievement of participating students, the The content of such programs shall be coordinated with the district's vision and goals for student learning, local control and accountability plan, curriculum, and academic standards.

Each program offered by the district shall be planned through a collaborative process as required by law. (Education Code 8422, 8482.5, 8484.75, 46120)

To the extent feasible, the district shall give priority to establishing expanded learning opportunities beyond the regular school day in low-performing schools and/or programs that serve low-income and other at-risk students.

Any expanded learning opportunities, including but not limited to After School Education and Safety Program (ASES),_21st Century Community Learning Center Program (21st CCLC), 21st Century High School After School Safety and Enrichment for Teens Program (ASSETs), Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELO), or any other program to be established pursuant to Education Code 8421, 8482.3, 8484.75, or 46120, shall be approved by the Board.

Description

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all staff who directly supervise students in the district's any expanded learning opportunity programs opportunities possess appropriate knowledge and experience. As needed, staff and volunteers shall receive ongoing training related to their job responsibilities.

Each before-school, after-school, summer, vacation or intersessional expanded learning opportunity program-shall include academic and enrichment elements in accordance with law and administrative regulation. In addition, and may be used in conjunction with attendance recovery programs. Additionally, each program may include support services that reinforce the educational component and promote student health and well-being.

No fee shall be charged for participation in the program.

Eligible students who are 11 or 12 years of age shall be placed in a before-school or after-school program, if and when available, rather than subsidized child-care and development services. During the time that the before-school or after-school program does not operate, such students may be provided the option of enrolling in child-care and development services in accordance with the enrollment priorities established in ARAdministrative Regulation 5148 —Child Care and Development. (Welfare and Institutions Code 10273)

The Board and the Superintendent or designee shall monitor student participation rates and shall identify multiple measures that shall be used to evaluate program effectiveness. Such measures may include, but are not limited to, student outcome data; program self-assessments; feedback from staff, participating students, and parents/guardians; and observations of program activities.

Every three years, the Superintendent or designee shall review the after-school program plan, including, but not limited to, program goals, program content, and outcome measures. Documentation of the program plan shall be maintained for a minimum of five years-in accordance with law and as specified in Board Policy/Administrative Record 3580 - District Records and Board Policy/Administrative Record 5125 - Student Records. (Education Code 8482.3, 46120)

Regulation 5148.2: Before/After School Programs

Definitions

Expanded learning opportunities means before school, after school, summer, vacation, and/or intersessional learning programs that focus on developing the academic, social, emotional, and physical needs and interests of students through hands-on, engaging learning experiences. Expanded learning opportunities does not mean an extension of instructional time, but rather, opportunities to engage students in enrichment, play, nutrition, and other developmentally appropriate activities. (Education Code 8482.1, 46120)

<u>Intersession program</u> means an expanded learning program offered by a district on non-school days, including, but not limited to, summer school. (Education Code 48853.5)

Offer access, with regard to an Expanded Learning Opportunities Program (ELO) program, means to recruit, advertise, publicize, or solicit through culturally and linguistically effective and appropriate communication channels. (Education Code 46120) (Education Code 46120)

Provide access, with regard to an ELO-program, means to register or enroll a student in an ELO-program. If a parent/guardian has a signed an ELO registration form and that form is on file, the student shall be considered enrolled in the ELO. (Education Code 46120)

Unduplicated student means a student enrolled in a district who is either classified as an English learner, eligible for a free or reduced-price meal, or is a foster youth. (Education Code 42238.02, 46120)

Grades TK-6Transitional Kindergarten-6

The district's After School Education and Safety Program (ASES) program or 21st Century Community Learning Center Program (21st CCLC) program shall serve students in any of grades Transitional (Education Code 8482.3, 8484.7, 8484.75, 8484.8)

The district's 21st CCLC program shall primarily serve students in Title I schoolwide programs. (Education Code 8484.8; 20 USC 7173)

The district's ELO program-shall serve students in grades TK-6. (Education Code 46120)

The district's programs shall be planned through a collaborative process that includes parents/guardians, students, and representatives of participating schools, governmental agencies, including city and county parks and recreation departments, local law enforcement, community organizations, and the private sector. As appropriate, the Superintendent or designee may include other stakeholders in such collaborative process. (Education Code 8422, 8482.5, 8483.3, 8484.75, 46120)

For the 2022 23 school year, the The district shall offer access to ELO programs to all unduplicated students in grades

_TK-6 and provide access to such programs-program to at least 50 percent of enrolled unduplicated students. (Education Code 46120)

Commencing with the 2023-24 school year, the The district shall offer access to the ELO program to all classroom-based students in grades TK-6. The district shall provide access to any student whose parent/guardian requests placement in an ELO program.

The district shall provide transportation to any student who attends a school that is not operating an ELO so that the student may attend at a location that is providing an ELO and return to the original location or another location that is established by the district. (Education Code 46120)

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that the plan to provide access to full-day learning programs the year before kindergarten addresses the needs of children and their families as specified in BPBoard Policy 6170.1 —Transitional Kindergarten. (Education Code 8322)

The district's ASES, 21st CCLC, and ELO program(s) shall be operated in accordance with the following:

1. Program Elements

- a. The program shall include an educational and literacy element in which tutoring or homework assistance is provided in language arts, mathematics, history and social science, computer training, and/or science. (Education Code 8482.3, 8484.75, 46120)
- b. The program shall include an educational enrichment element which may include, but is not limited to, fine arts, career technical education, recreation, technology, physical fitness, and prevention activities— (Education Code 8482.3, 8484.75, 46120)

2. Nutrition

a. Snacks or meals made available in the program shall conform to nutrition standards specified in Education Code 49430-49434 or 42 USC 1766 as applicable. (Education Code 8482.3, 8484.75, 46120;

46120; 42 USC 1766-1766a; 7 CFR 226.17)

b. The district's before-school program shall offer a breakfast meal as described in Education Code 49553 for all program participants. (Education Code 8483.1, 8484.75)

3. Location of Program

- a. The program may be offered at one or multiple school sites and/or at an easily available and accessible off-campus facility- (Education Code 8482.3, 8484.75)
- b. When there is a significant barrier to student participation in either the before-school or after-school component of a program at the school of attendance, the Superintendent or designee may, with the approval of the Superintendent of Public Instruction, provide services at another school site.
 - b. Such transfer of services shall occur only if the school to which the program will be transferred agrees to receive students from the transferring school and has an existing grant of the same type as the transferring school, or does not have a 10-percent lower percentage of students eligible for free or reduced-price meals than the transferring school. A significant barrier includes any of the following: -(Education Code 8482.8, 8484.75)

- i. Fewer than 20 students participating in the program component
- ii. Extreme transportation constraints, including, but not limited to, desegregation busing, busing for magnet or open enrollment schools, or student dependence on public transportation
- iii. A reduction in the program grant of an existing school due to its merging into a new school opened by the district or the splitting of its students with a new school

In such cases, the district shall arrange for safe, supervised transportation between school sites; ensure communication among staff in the regular school program, staff in the beforeschool or after-school program, and parents/guardians; and ensure alignment of the educational and literacy elements with the regular school program of participating students. (Education Code 8482.8, 8484.75)

4. Staffing

- a. All staff members who directly supervise students shall, at a minimum, meet the qualifications for an instructional aide. (Education Code 8483.4, 8484.75, 45330, 45344, 45344.5)
- b. All program staff and volunteers shall be subject to the health screening and fingerprint clearance requirements in law and Board policy. (Education Code 8483.4, 8484.75)
- c. The student-to-staff ratio shall be no more than 20 to 1, except that programs serving transitional kindergarten<u>TK</u> or kindergarten students shall maintain a student-to-staff member ratio of no more than 10 to 1 (Education Code 8483.4, 8484.75, 46120)

5. Hours of Operation

- a. A before-school program shall not operate for less than one and one-half hours per regular school day. (Education Code 8483.1, 8484.75)
- b. An after-school program shall begin immediately upon the conclusion of the regular school day and shall operate a minimum of 15 hours per week and at least until 6 p.m. on every regular school day. (Education Code 8483, 8484.75)
- c. An ELO program shall provide in-person before or after school expanded learning opportunities that.
- c. when added to daily instructional minutes, <u>recess</u>, <u>and meals</u>, shall not be less than nine hours of combined instructional time, <u>recess</u>, <u>meals</u>, and expanded learning opportunities per instructional day. (Education Code 46120)

6. Admissions

- a. Every student attending a school operating a program is eligible to participate in the program, subject to program capacity. (Education Code 8482.6, 8484.75)
- b. If the number of students wishing to participate in the program exceeds program capacity, students shall be selected for enrollment based on the following guidelines:

i. First priority for enrollment shall be given to students who are identified as homeless youth, as defined by the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 USC 11434a), at the time they apply for enrollment or at any time during the school year, to students who are identified by the program as being in foster care, and to students who are eligible for free or reduced-price meals. (Education Code 8483, 8483.1, 8484.75)

The district is not required to disenroll a current student in order to secure the enrollment of a student who has priority for enrollment. (Education Code 8483, 8483.1)

The district shall inform the parent/guardian of a homeless student experiencing homelessness or foster youth, or student eligible for free or reduced price meals, or English Language Learner of the right of the child to receive priority enrollment and how to request priority enrollment. (Education Code 8483, 8484.75, 46120, 42238.02)

If a student experiencing homelessness or a foster youth will be moving during an intersession period, the student's educational rights holder, or in the case of an American Indian Student, Indian custodian, may determine which school the student attends for the intersession period. (Education Code 48850, 48853.5)

- ii. Second priority for enrollment of middle or junior high school students shall be given to students who attend daily. (Education Code 8483, 8483.1, 8484.75)
- iii. Third priority for enrollment shall be given to students identified as in need of academic remediation or support in accordance with Board policy or administrative regulation.
 - iv. Any remaining capacity shall be filled by students selected at random-
 - v. A waiting list shall be established to accommodate additional students if space becomes available.

7. Attendance/Early Release

- a. Each student admitted into a district program shall be expected to attend the full number of hours that the program is in operation every day that the student participates.
 - a. An ELO-program offered pursuant to Education Code 46120 does not have an attendance requirement, but the district may track student attendance for safety and continuous quality improvement purposes.
- b. When necessary, a student's parent/guardian may request, in writing, that the Superintendent or designee approve the reasonable late daily arrival for the before-school program or the reasonable early daily release from the after-school program.
 - b. The Superintendent or designee shall not approve such a request if the student would be attending less than one-half of the daily program hours.
- 8. Summer/Intersession/Vacation Programs

- a. <u>ELO programsELOs</u> shall offer no less than nine hours of in-person expanded learning opportunities per day for at least 30 non-school days, during <u>intersessional periods.extended school year or intersession periods</u> (Education Code 46120)
- <u>b.</u> A before-school program operating during summer, intersession, and/or vacation days shall be offered for a minimum of two hours per day.
 - b. An after-school program offered during summer, intersession, and/or vacation days may be operated for either three hours or six hours per day in accordance with Education Code 8483.76. When both before-school beforeschool and after-school programs are offered for the same students on such days, they shall be operated for a minimum of four and one-half hours per day. (Education Code 8483, 8483.1, 8483.2, 8483.76)
- c. A program offered during summer, intersession, and/or vacation periods may open eligibility to every student attending a school in the district, with priority for enrollment given to students enrolled in the school that received the grant- (Education Code 8483.76)
- d. To address the needs of students and school closures, the program may be conducted at an offsite location or an alternate school site. The program shall notify the California Department of Education

(CDE)When a district is temporarily prevented from operating an ELO because of a school or program site closure due to emergency conditions specified in Education Code 8482.8 or 41422, the Superintendent or designee shall complete and submit to the California Department of Education (CDE) any necessary forms or records substantiating the need for closure, including a resolution adopted by the Governing Board. (Education Code 46120)

<u>The program shall notify CDE</u> of the change of location and shall include a plan to provide safe transportation pursuant to
_Education Code 8484.6. (Education Code 8483.76)

- e. Any program operating for six hours per day shall provide at least one nutritionally adequate free or reduced-price meal to each eligible student during each program day. (Education Code 8483.76)
- f. For any program operating six hours per day, district procedures pertaining to student attendance and early release as specified in item #7 above shall apply. (Education Code 8483.76)

Volunteers

The Superintendent or designee may establish a registry of volunteer after-school physical recreation instructors and other before-school and after-school program volunteers. (Education Code 35021.3)

To be included in the registry, a volunteer shall submit to a criminal background check pursuant to Education Code 45125. The volunteer shall also submit current contact information to the district and shall update that information whenever the information changes. (Education Code 35021.3)

The Superintendent or designee may use a volunteer registered with the district or may select another person to provide physical recreation to students after school hours or to provide other services. (Education Code 35021.3)

ITEM: Board Policy and Administrative Regulation: 6158 Independent Study

PURPOSE: Policy was reviewed in December 2024. Druing the same time period, CSBA posted recommended changes. Minor changes since last review include moving specific language from BP 6158 to AR 6158. More significant additions include incorporating course based independent study requirements. Currently, HESD Independent Study program does not use a course based system. The addition of course based language in the policy provides flexibility for the structure of

independent study in HESD.

Policy 6158: Independent Study

Original Adopted Date: 04/08/2015 | Last Revised Date: 12/18/2024

The Governing Board authorizes independent study as an optional alternative instructional strategy for students whose needs may be best met through study outside of the regular classroom setting. Independent study shall offer a means of individualizing the educational plan to serve students who desire a more challenging educational experience, whose health or other personal circumstances make classroom attendance difficult, who are unable to access course(s) due to scheduling problems, and/or who need to make up credits or fill gaps in their learning. As necessary to meet student needs, independent study may be offered for short- or long-term placements, on a full-time or part-time basis, and/or in conjunction with part- or full-time classroom study.

The Board shall hold a public hearing when considering the scope of its existing or prospective use of independent study as an instructional strategy, its purposes in authorizing independent study, and factors bearing specifically on the maximum realistic lengths of assignments and acceptable number of missed assignments for specific populations of students or adult education students.—(Education Code 51747; 5 CCR 11701)

The Superintendent or designee may provide a variety of independent study opportunities, including, but not limited to, through a program or class within a comprehensive school, <u>a charter school</u>, an alternative school or program of choice, <u>a charter school</u>, and <u>/or</u> an online course.

Student participation in independent study shall be voluntary and no student shall be required to participate.—(Education Code 51747, 51749.5, 51749.6)

Independent study for each student shall be under the general supervision of a district employee who possesses a valid certification document pursuant to Education Code 44865 or an emergency credential pursuant to Education Code 44300. Students' independent study shall be coordinated, evaluated, and documented, as prescribed by law and reflected in the accompanying administrative regulation. (Education Code 51747.5)

The ratio of average daily attendance for independent study pupils to school district full-time equivalent certificated employees responsible for independent study, shall not exceed the equivalent ratio of average daily attendance to full-time equivalent certificated employees providing instruction in other educational programs operated by the school district, unless a new higher or lower average daily attendance ratio for all other educational programs offered is negotiated in a collective bargaining agreement or a memorandum of understanding is entered into that indicates an existing collective bargaining agreement contains an alternative average daily attendance ratio.

Not more than 10 percent of the pupils participating in an opportunity school or program, calculated as specified by the department, shall be eligible for apportionment credit for independent study. A pupil who is pregnant or is a parent who is the primary caregiver for one or more of their children shall not be counted within the 10 percent cap.

Special education pupils may participate in independent study if their individualized education program (IEP) specifically provides for that participation. EC Section 51745(c)

A temporarily disabled pupil shall not receive individual instruction pursuant to Section 48206.3 through independent study.

Statewide testing results shall be reported and assigned to the school at which the student is enrolled and shall be included in the aggregate results of the district. Test results also shall be disaggregated for purposes of comparisons with the test results of students enrolled in classroombased courses.

(Education Code 51747.5)

An independent study student shall not be credited with more than one day of attendance per calendar day. (Education Code 46300)

A nutritionally adequate breakfast and lunch shall be made available at no cost to any independent study student scheduled for educational activities lasting two or more hours at a school site, resource center, meeting space, or other satellite facility, who requests a meal. (Education Code 49501.5)

General Independent Study Requirements

The Superintendent or designee may offer and approve independent study for an individual student upon determining that the student is prepared to meet the district's requirements for participation and is likely to succeed as well as or better than the student would in the regular classroom setting.

The minimum instructional minutes shall be the same for all students at each school including students participating in independent study, except as otherwise permitted by law.—_(Education Code 46100)

Because excessive leniency in the duration of independent study assignments may result in a student falling behind peers and increase the risk of dropping out of school, independent study assignments shall be completed no more than —10 school days one week after assigned for all grade levels and types of programs. When necessary, based on the specific circumstances of the student's approved program, the Superintendent or designee may allow for a longer period of time between the date an assignment is made and when it is due. However, in no event shall the due date of an assignment be extended beyond the termination date specified in the student's written agreement.

An evaluation shall be conducted to determine whether it is in a student's best interest to remain in independent study whenever the student fails to make satisfactory educational progress and/or misses five-three assignments. Satisfactory educational progress shall be determined based on all of the following indicators:—(Education Code 51747)

 The student's achievement and engagement in the independent study program, as indicated by the student's performance on applicable student-level measures of student achievement and engagement specified in Education Code 52060

- 2. The completion of assignments, assessments, or other indicators that evidence that the student is working on assignments
- 3. Learning of required concepts, as determined by the supervising teacher
- 4. HESD SCH 104A at-risk criteria: If a student is determined to be at-risk based on the local SCH 104A process, an evaluation shall be immediately conducted to determine whether it is in a student's best interest to remain in independent study.
- <u>5.4.</u>Progress towards successful completion of the course of study or individual course, as determined by the supervising teacher

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that students participating in independent study are provided with content aligned to grade level standards at a level of quality and intellectual challenge substantially equivalent to in-person instruction. For high schools, this shall include access to all courses offered by the district for graduation and approved by the University of California (UC) or the California State University (CSU) as creditable under the A-G admissions criteria.—(Education Code 51747)

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that all students participating in independent study for 16-school days or more in a school year receive the following throughout the school year:—(Education Code 51747)

- 1. For students in grades transitional kindergarten, kindergarten, and grades 1 to (TK)-3, opportunities for daily synchronous instruction
- 2. For students in grades 4-8, opportunities for both daily live interaction and at least weekly synchronous instruction
- 3. For students in grades 9-12, opportunities for at least weekly synchronous instruction

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that procedures for tiered reengagement strategies are used for all students participating in an independent study program for 16-school days or more <u>in a school year</u> who are:—(Education Code 51747)

- 1. Not generating attendance for more than ten percent of required minimum instructional time over four continuous weeks of the district's approved instructional calendar
- 2. Not participating in synchronous instructional offerings pursuant to Education Code 51747.5 for more than 50 percent of the scheduled times of synchronous instruction in a school month as applicable by grade span
- 3. In violation of their written agreement

Tiered reengagement strategies procedures used in district independent study programs shall include local programs intended to address chronic absenteeism, as applicable, including but not limited to the following:—(Education Code 51747)

1. Verification of current contact information for each enrolled student

- 2. Notification to parents/guardians of lack of participation within one school day of the recording of a nonattendance day or lack of participation
- 3. A plan for outreach from the school to determine student needs, including connection with health and social services as necessary
- 4. A clear standard for requiring a student-parent-educator conference to review a student's written agreement and reconsider the independent study program's impact on the student's achievement and well-being

The Superintendent or designee shall, for students who participate in an independent study program for 16-school days <u>ofor</u> more <u>in a school year</u>, develop a plan to transition students whose families wish to return to in-person instruction from independent study expeditiously, and, in no case, later than five instructional days.—(Education Code 51747)

When any student enrolled in classroom-based instruction is participating in independent study due to necessary medical treatment or inpatient treatment for mental health or substance abuse under the care of appropriately licensed professionals, the student shall be exempt from the live interaction and/or synchronous instruction, tiered reengagement strategies, and transition back to in-person instruction requirements specified above. In such cases, evidence from appropriately licensed professionals, of the student's need to participate in independent study, shall be submitted to the Superintendent or designee.— (Education Code 51747)

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that a written agreement exists for each participating student as prescribed by law.— (Education Code 51747, 51749.5)

Upon the request of the parent/guardian of a student, and before signing a written agreement as described below in the section "Master Agreement," below, the district shall conduct a telephone, video conference videoconference, or in-person student-parent-educator conference or other meeting during which the student, parent/guardian, and, if requested by the parent/guardian an advocate, may ask questions about the educational options, including which curriculum offerings and nonacademic supports will be available to the student in independent study.—_(Education Code 51747)

Master Agreement

A written agreement shall be developed and implemented for each student participating in independent study.—_(Education Code 46300, 51747)

For student participation for lasting 16-school days or more, a signed written agreement shall be obtained before the student begins independent study. For student participation of less than 15 school days or fewer, a signed written agreement shall may be obtained within at any time during the same school year as in which the student participated in independent study. program takes place. (Education Code 46300, 51747)

The agreement shall include general student data, including the student's name, address, grade level, birth date, school of enrollment, and program placement.

The independent study agreement for each participating student also shall include, but is not limited to, all of the following:—(Education Code 51747; 5 CCR 11700, 11702)

- The manner, time, frequency, and place for submitting the student's assignments, reporting
 the student's academic progress, and communicating with a student's parent/guardian
 regarding the student's academic progress
- 2. The objectives and methods of study for the student's work and the methods used to evaluate that work
- 3. The specific resources that will be made available to the student, including materials and personnel, and access to Internet connectivity and devices adequate to participate in the educational program and complete assigned work

4. A statement of the Board's policy detailing the maximum length of time allowed between an assignment and its completion, the level of satisfactory educational progress, and the number of missed assignments which will triggergive rise to an evaluation of whether the student should be allowed to continue in independent study

- 5. The duration of the independent study agreement, including the beginning and ending dates for the student's participation in independent study under the agreement, with a maximum of one school year
- 6. A statement of the <u>number of course credits or, for the elementary grades, other</u> measures of academic accomplishment appropriate to the agreement, to be earned by the student upon completion
- 7. A statement detailing the academic and other supports that will be provided to address the needs of students who are not performing at grade level, or need support in other areas, such as English learners, students with disabilities with an individualized education program or a Section 504 plan in order to be consistent with their program or plan, students in foster care or experiencing homelessness, and students requiring mental health supports
- 8. A statement that independent study is an optional educational alternative in which and no student may be required to participate
- 9. In the case of a suspended or expelled student who is referred or assigned to any school, class, or program pursuant to Education Code 48915 or 48917, a statement that instruction may be provided through independent study only if the student is offered the alternative of classroom instruction
- 10. Before the commencement of independent study projected to last for 16 school days or more, or within the same school year of the independent study for independent study for less than 16 school days, the agreementAll learning agreements shall be signed and dated by the student, the student's parent/guardian or caregiver if the student is underless than 18 years of age, the certificated employee responsible for the general supervision of independent study, and as applicable for students with disabilities, the certificated employee designated as having responsibility for the special education programming of the student

. If the independent study program is projected to last for more than 15 school days, the learning agreement shall be signed before the commencement of the program. For an independent study program that is projected to last for 15 or fewer school days, the learning agreement shall be signed at any time during the school year in which the independent study program is to take

For purposes of the above paragraph, caregiver means a person who has met the requirements of Family Code 6550-6552.

Written agreements may be signed using an electronic signature that complies with state and federal standards, as determined by the California Department of Education (CDE).—_(Education Code 51747)

The parent/guardian's signature on the agreement shall constitute permission for the student to receive instruction through independent study.

Records Course-Based Independent Study

The Superintendent or designee district's course-based independent study program for students in grades K-12 shall ensure that records are maintained for audit purposes.

These records shall include, but not be limited subject to: the following requirements: (Education Code 51748; 51749.5 CCR 11703)

- 1. A signed learning agreement shall be completed and on file for each participating student, pursuant to Education Code 51749.6
- 2. Courses shall be taught under the general supervision of certificated employees who hold the appropriate subject matter credential and are employed by the district or by another district, charter school, or county office of education with which the district has a memorandum of understanding to provide the instruction
- 3. Courses shall be annually certified by Board resolution to be of the same rigor and educational quality and to provide intellectual challenge that is substantially equivalent to in-person, classroom-based instruction, and shall be aligned to all relevant local and state content standards

For high schools, this shall include access to all courses offered by the district for graduation and approved by UC or CSU as creditable under the A-G admissions criteria.

The certification shall, at a minimum, include the duration, number of equivalent daily instructional minutes for each school day that a student is enrolled, number of equivalent total instructional minutes, and number of course credits for each course, consistent with that of equivalent classroom-based courses. Additionally, the certification shall include plans to provide opportunities throughout the school year for all students in TK-3 to receive daily synchronous instruction, for all students in grades 4-8, to receive both daily live interaction and at least weekly synchronous instruction, and for all students in grades 9-12 to receive at least weekly synchronous instruction.

- 4. Students enrolled in independent study courses shall meet the applicable age requirements established pursuant to Education Code 46300.1, 46300.4, 47612, and 47612.1, and the applicable residency and enrollment requirements established pursuant to Education Code 46300.2, 47612, 48204, and 51747.3
- 5. For each student participating in an independent study course, satisfactory educational progress shall be determined based on the student's achievement and engagement in the independent study program as indicated by the student's performance on applicable

student-level measures of student achievement and engagement set forth in Education Code 52060; completion of assignments, assessments, or other indicators that evidence that the student is working on assignments; learning of required concepts, as determined by the supervising teacher; and progress toward successful completion of the course of study or individual course, as determined by the supervising teacher

If satisfactory educational progress in one or more independent study courses is not being made, the teacher providing instruction shall notify the student and, if the student is under 18 years of age, the student's parent/guardian. The teacher shall conduct an evaluation to determine whether it is in the student's best interest to remain in the course or whether the student should be referred to an alternative program, which may include, but is not limited to, a regular school program.

Procedures for tiered reengagement strategies shall be used for all students who are not making satisfactory educational progress in one or more courses or who are in violation of the written learning agreement, as described in the section "Learning Agreement for Course-Based Independent Study" below. These procedures shall include, but are not necessarily limited to, the verification of current contact information for each enrolled student; a plan for outreach from the school to determine student needs, including connection with health and social services as necessary; and a clear standard for requiring a student-parent-educator conference to review a student's written agreement and reconsider the independent study program's impact on the student's achievement and well-being.

- 6. Examinations shall be administered by a proctor
- 7. Statewide testing results shall be reported and assigned to the school at which the student is enrolled and shall be included in the aggregate results of the district

<u>Test results also shall be disaggregated for purposes of comparisons with the test results of students enrolled in classroom-based courses.</u>

- 8. A student shall not be required to enroll in courses included in the course-based independent study program
- 9. The student-teacher ratio in the courses in this program shall be in accordance with Education Code 51745.6
- 10. For each student, the combined equivalent daily instructional minutes for courses in this program and all other courses shall meet applicable minimum instructional day requirements, and the student shall be offered the minimum annual total equivalent instructional minutes pursuant to Education Code 46200-46208
- 11. Courses required for high school graduation or for admission to UC or CSU shall not be offered exclusively through independent study
- 12. A student participating in this program shall not be assessed a fee that is prohibited by Education Code 49011
- 13. A student shall not be prohibited from participating in independent study solely on the basis that the student does not have the materials, equipment, or access to Internet connectivity necessary to participate in the course
- 14. A student with disabilities, as defined in Education Code 56026, may participate in course-based independent study if the student's individualized education program specifically

- 15. A temporarily disabled student shall not receive individual instruction pursuant to Education Code 48206.3 through course-based independent study
- 16. The district shall maintain a plan to transition any student whose family wishes to return to in-person instruction from course-based independent study expeditiously, and, in no case, later than five instructional days

Learning Agreement for Course-Based Independent Study

Before enrolling a student in a course within a course-based independent study program, the Superintendent or designee shall provide the student and, if the student is under age 18 years, the student's parent/guardian, with a written learning agreement that includes all of the following: (Education Code 51749.6)

- 1. A summary of the district's policies and procedures related to course-based independent study pursuant to Education Code 51749.5
- 2. The duration of the enrolled course(s) and the number of course credits for each enrolled course, consistent with the Board certifications made pursuant to Item #3 of "Course-Based Independent Study" above
- 3. The duration of the learning agreement, which shall not exceed a school year or span multiple school years
- 4. The learning objectives and expectations for each course, including, but not limited to, a description of how satisfactory educational progress is measured and when a student evaluation is required to determine whether the student should remain in the course or be referred to an alternative program, which may include, but is not limited to, a regular school program
- 5. The specific resources that will be made available to the student, including materials and personnel, and access to Internet connectivity and devices adequate to participate in the educational program and complete assigned work
- 6. A statement detailing the academic and other supports that will be provided to address the needs of students who are not performing at grade level, or need support in other areas, such as English learners, students with disabilities with an individualized education program or a Section 504 plan in order to be consistent with their program or plan, students in foster care or experiencing homelessness, and students requiring mental health supports
- 7. A statement that enrollment is an optional educational alternative and no student may be required to participate
 - In the case of a suspended or expelled student who is referred or assigned to any school, class, or program pursuant to Education Code 48915 or 48917, a statement that instruction may be provided through course-based independent study only if the student is offered the alternative of classroom instruction.
- 8. The manner, time, frequency, and place for submitting a student's assignments, for reporting the student's academic progress, and for communicating with a student's parent/guardian regarding a student's academic progress

- 9. The objectives and methods of study for the student's work, and the methods used to evaluate that work
- 10. A statement of the adopted policies regarding the maximum length of time allowed between the assignment and the completion of a student's assigned work, the level of satisfactory educational progress, and the number of missed assignments allowed before an evaluation of whether the student should be allowed to continue in course-based independent study
- 11. A statement of the number of course credits or, for the elementary grades, other measures of academic accomplishment appropriate to the learning agreement, to be earned by the student upon completion.

All learning agreements shall be signed by the student, the student's parent/guardian or caregiver if the student is less than 18 years of age, the certificated employee responsible for the general supervision of the independent study course, and as applicable for students with disabilities, the certificated employee designated as having responsibility for the special education programming of the student. If the independent study program is projected to last for more than 15 school days, the learning agreement shall be signed before the commencement of the program. For an independent study program that is projected to last for 15 or fewer school days, the learning agreement shall be signed at any time during the school year in which the independent study program is to take place. (Education Code 51749.6)

For purposes of the above paragraph, caregiver means a person who has met the requirements of Family Code 6550-6552.

<u>Learning agreements may be signed using an electronic signature that complies with state and federal standards, as determined by CDE. (Education Code 51749.6)</u>

A signed learning agreement from a parent/guardian of a student who is less than 18 years of age shall constitute the parent/guardian's permission for the student to receive instruction through course-based independent study. (Education Code 51749.6)

Upon the request of a student's parent/guardian, and before signing a learning agreement as described above, the district shall conduct a telephone, videoconference, or in-person student-parent-educator conference, or other meeting during which the student, parent/guardian, and, if requested by the parent/guardian, an advocate, may ask questions about the educational options, including which curriculum offerings and nonacademic supports will be available to the student in independent study. (Education Code 51749.6)

Student-Parent-Educator Conferences

A student-parent-educator conference shall be held as appropriate including, but not limited to, as a reengagement strategy and/or, if requested by a parent/guardian, prior to enrollment or disenrollment from independent study. (Education Code 51745.5, 51747, 51749.5)

Records

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that records are maintained for audit purposes.

These records shall include, but not be limited to: (Education Code 51748; 5 CCR 11703)

- 1. A copy of the Board policy, administrative regulation, and other procedures related to independent study
- 2. A listing of the students, by grade level, program, and school, who have participated in independent study, along with the units of the curriculum attempted and completed by students in grades K-8 and the course credits attempted by and awarded to students in grades 9-12 and adult education
- 3. A file of all agreements, with representative samples of each student's work products bearing the supervising teacher's signed or initialed and dated notations indicating that the teacher has personally evaluated the work or personally reviewed the evaluations made by another certificated teacher
- 4. As appropriate to the program in which the students are participating, a daily-<u>or hourly</u> attendance register-<u>maintained to the hour or fraction of an hour</u>_that is separate from classroom attendance records, maintained on a current basis as time values of student work products judged by a certificated teacher, and reviewed by the supervising teacher if they are two different persons-
 - 1. Time value of student work product includes the combination of synchronous instruction, completed work product, and time spent on asynchronous activities such as participation in a computer activity or platform where time engaged is recorded, but an assignment is not produced or completed.

Additionally, the district shall maintain documentation of hours or fraction of an hour for student work products and the time that students engaged in asynchronous instruction. (Education Code 54747.5)

- 5. Appropriate documentation of compliance with the teacher-student ratios required by Education Code 51745.6 and 51749.5 (Education Code 51745.6 and 51749.5)
- 6. Appropriate documentation of compliance with the requirements pursuant to Education Code 51747.5 to ensure the coordination, evaluation, and supervision of the independent study of each student by a district employee who possesses a valid certification document pursuant to Education Code 44865 or an emergency credential pursuant to Education Code 44300 (Education Code 51747.5)

The district shall document each student's participation in live interaction and synchronous instruction pursuant to Education Code 51747 on each school day, as applicable, in whole or in part, for which live interaction or synchronous instruction is provided as part of the independent study program. A student who does not participate in scheduled live interaction or synchronous instruction shall be documented as non-participatory for that school day.— (Education Code 51747.5)

The Superintendent or designee shall also maintain a written or computer-based record such as a grade book or summary document of student engagement, for each class, of all grades, assignments, and assessments for each student for independent study assignments.—(Education Code 51747.5)

Signed written and supplemental agreements, assignment records, work samples, and attendance records may be maintained as an electronic file in accordance with Education Code 51747 and 51749.6, as applicable.

The Superintendent or designee shall annually report to the Board the number of district students participating in independent study, the average daily attendance generated for apportionment purposes, student performance as measured by standard indicators and in comparison to students in classroom-based instruction, and the number and proportion of independent study students who graduate or successfully complete independent study. Based on the program evaluation, the Board and Superintendent shall determine areas for program improvement, as needed.

Definitions

Live interaction means interaction between the student and classified or certificated staff, and may include peers, provided for the purpose of maintaining school connectedness, including, but not limited to, wellness checks, progress monitoring, provision of services, and instruction. This interaction may take place in-person, or in the form of the Internet or telephonic communication. (Education Code 51745.5)

Student-parent-educator conference means a meeting involving, at a minimum, all parties who signed the student's written independent study agreement pursuant to Education Code 51747 or the written learning agreement pursuant to Education Code 51749.6. (Education Code 51745.5)

Synchronous instruction means classroom-style instruction or designated small group or one-on-one instruction delivered in-person, or in the form of Internet or telephonic communications, and involving live two-way communication between the teacher and student. Synchronous instruction shall be provided by a teacher or teachers(s) of record for that student pursuant to Education Code 51747.5 or the certificated employee providing instruction for course-based independent study. (Education Code 51745.5)

Educational Opportunities

Educational opportunities offered through independent study may include, but are not limited to: (Education Code 51745)

- 1. Special assignments extending the content of regular courses of instruction
- 2. Individualized study in a particular area of interest or in a subject not currently available in the regular school curriculum
- **4.3.**Continuing and special study during travel
- 4. Volunteer community service activities and leadership opportunities that support and strengthen student achievement
- 2.5. Individualized study for a student whose health, as determined by the student's parent/guardian, would be put at risk by in-person instruction or for a student who is unable to attend in-person instruction due to a quarantine due to exposure to, or infection with, COVID-19, pursuant to local or state public health guidance

In addition, when requested by a parent/guardian due to an emergency or illness, independent study may be used on a short-term basis to ensure that the student is able to maintain academic progress in the student's regular classes.

No course required for high school graduation shall be offered exclusively through independent study. (Education Code 51745)

Equivalency

The district's independent study option shall be substantially equivalent in quality and quantity to classroom instruction to enable participating students to complete the district's adopted course of study within the customary timeframe. Students in independent study shall have access to the same services and resources that are available to other students in the school and shall have equal rights and privileges. (5 CCR 11700, 11701.5)

Students participating in independent study shall have access to Internet connectivity and devices adequate to participate in the educational program and complete assigned work. (Education Code 51747)

The district shall not provide independent study students and their parents/guardians with funds or items of value that are not provided for other students and their parents/guardians. -Providing access to Internet connectivity and district-owned devices adequate to participate in an independent study program and complete assigned work consistent with Education Code 51747, or to participate in an independent study course, as authorized by Education Code 51749.5, shall not be considered funds or other things of value. (Education Code 46300.6, 51747.3)

Eligibility for Independent Study

To participate in independent study, a student shall be enrolled in a district school. (Education Code 51748)

The Superintendent or designee may approve the participation of a student who demonstrates the motivation, commitment, organizational skills, and academic skills necessary to work independently provided that experienced certificated staff are available to effectively supervise students in independent study. -The Superintendent or designee may also approve the participation of a student whose health would be put at risk by in-person instruction. -A student whose academic performance is not at grade level may participate in independent study only if the program is able to provide appropriate support, such as supplemental instruction, tutoring, counseling, ongoing diagnostic assessments, and/or differentiated materials, to enable the student to be successful. -For an elementary student, the Superintendent or designee may consider the parent/guardian's level of commitment to assist the student.

A student participating in independent study mustshall be a resident of the county or an adjacent county. -Full-time independent study shall not be available to students whose district residency status is based on their parent/guardian's employment within district boundaries pursuant to Education Code 48204. (Education Code 46300.2, 51747.3)

A student with disabilities, as defined in Education Code 56026, may participate in independent study if the student's individualized education program (IEP) specifically provides for such participation. -If a parent/guardian of a student with disabilities requests independent study because the student's health would be put at risk by in-person instruction, the student's IEP team

shall make an individualized determination as to whether the student can receive a free appropriate public education (FAPE) in an independent study placement. A student's inability to work independently, need for adult support, or need for special education or related services shall not preclude the IEP team from determining that the student can receive FAPE in an independent study placement. (Education Code 51745)

In addition, any student with disabilities who receives services from a nonpublic, nonsectarian school through a virtual program may be permitted to participate in independent study if the student's IEP team determines that FAPE can be provided to the student by means of the virtual program and other conditions of law are satisfied. (Education Code 51745)

A temporarily disabled student shall not receive individual instruction pursuant to Education Code 48206.3 through independent study. (Education Code 51745)

Except for students participating in independent study due to an emergency as described in Education Code 41422 and 46392 and pregnant and parenting students who are the primary caregiver for their child(ren), no more than 10 percent of the students enrolled in a continuation high school or opportunity school or program shall be enrolled in independent study. (Education Code 51745)

Monitoring Student Progress

The independent study administrator and/or supervising teacher shall promptly and directly address any failure by the student to meet the terms of the student's written agreement. The following supportive strategies may be used:

- 1. A letter to the student and/or parent/guardian
- 2. A meeting between the student, parent/guardian, and the teacher and/or counselor
- 3. A meeting between the student, parent/guardian, and the independent study administrator, including the parent/guardian if appropriate
- 4. An increase in the amount of time the student works under direct supervision

When the student has failed to make satisfactory educational progress or missed the number of assignments specified in the written agreement as requiring an evaluation, the Superintendent or designee shall conduct an evaluation to determine whether independent study is in the student's best interest. This evaluation may result in termination of the independent study agreement and the student's return to the regular classroom program or other alternative program. (Education Code 51747, 51749.5; 5 CCR 11701)

A written record of the findings of any such evaluation shall be treated as a mandatory interim student record which shall be maintained for three years from the date of the evaluation, and if the student transfers to another public school in California, the record shall be forwarded to that school. (Education Code 51747, 51749.5)

The responsibilities of the independent study administrator include, but are not limited to:

- Recommending certificated staff to be assigned as independent study teachers at the required teacher-student ratios pursuant to Education Code 51745.6 and supervising staff assigned to independent study functions who are not regularly supervised by another administrator
- 2. Approving or denying the participation of students requesting independent study
- 3. Facilitating the completion of written independent study agreements
- 4. Ensuring a smooth transition for students into and out of the independent study mode of instruction
- 5. Approving work completion and synchronous participation records all credits earned through independent study
- 6. Completing or coordinating the preparation of all records and reports required by law, Board policy, or administrative regulation

Assignment and Responsibilities of Independent Study Teachers

Each student's independent study shall be coordinated, evaluated, and carried out under the general supervision of a district employee who possesses a valid certification document pursuant to Education Code 44865 or emergency credential pursuant to Education Code 44300, registered as required by law, and who consents to the assignment. (Education Code 44865, 51747.5; 5 CCR 11700)

The ratio of student average daily attendance for independent study students age 18 years or younger to full-time equivalent certificated employees responsible for independent study shall not exceed the equivalent ratio for all other education programs in the district, unless a new higher or lower ratio for all other educational programs offered is negotiated in a collective bargaining agreement or the district enters into a memorandum of understanding that indicates an existing collective bargaining agreement contains an alternative ratio. (Education Code 51745.6)

The responsibilities of the supervising teacher shall include, but are not limited to:

- 1. Completing designated portions of the written independent study agreement and signing the agreement
- 2. Supervising and approving coursework and assignments
- 3. Maintaining records of student assignments showing the date the assignment is given and the date the assignment is due
- 4. Maintaining a daily or hourly attendance register in accordance with Item #4 in the section on "Records" in the accompanying Board policy
- 5. Providing direct instruction and counsel as necessary for individual student success

- 6. Regularly meeting with the student to discuss the student's progress
- 7. Determining the time value of assigned work or work products completed and submitted by the student. This may include, including time that the combination of synchronous instruction and student engaged in asynchronous participation activities that are recorded within a platform or program but do not result in a work productinstruction
- 8. Assessing student work and assigning grades or other approved measures of achievement
- Documenting each student's participation in live interaction and/or synchronous instruction pursuant to Education Code 51747 on each school day, as applicable, in whole or in part, for which live interaction or synchronous instruction is provided as part of the independent study program

The Superintendent or designee shall ensure that independent study teachers have access to professional development and support comparable to classroom-based teachers.

ITEM:

Consider approval of investment banking agreement with RBC.

PURPOSE:

The District issued a Request for Proposal for bond underwriter services on January 10, 2025. Four firms were interviewed by a committee composed of the Superintendent, Chief Business Official and the District's financial advisor with RBC prevailing.

FISCAL IMPACT:

The costs associated with the selection of RBC will be included as part of the bond issuance.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

INVESTMENT BANKING AGREEMENT

THIS AGREEMENT ("Agreement") is made and entered into this _	day of	, 20, by and among
the Hanford Elementary School District (the "District") and RBC C	Capital Markets, LLC (the "	Underwriter" or
"RBC CM"), with reference to the following facts:		

RECITALS

WHEREAS, voters passed Measure U on November 5, 2024 which approved \$23,000,000 in General Obligation Bond for Hanford Elementary School District. Measure U will be sold in one or more series of General Obligation Bond financings (hereinafter "Bonds") to acquire, improve, construct and modernize District facilities; and

WHEREAS, the District desires and is authorized by law to retain the services of an Underwriter in connection with the issuance of the Bonds; and

WHEREAS, the Underwriter agrees to be retained by the District and to provide to the District the services described herein; and

WHEREAS, the Underwriter agrees to act as an underwriter, subject to the conditions set forth herein,

NOW therefore, for and in consideration of the mutual promises, covenants, and conditions herein contained, the parties hereto agree as follows:

Scope of Services

The Underwriter shall develop a financing plan with the purpose of assisting the District in achieving its financial objectives. The District acknowledges and agrees that: (i) the transaction contemplated by this Agreement is an arm's length, commercial transaction between the District and the Underwriter in which the Underwriter is acting solely as a principal and is not acting as a municipal advisor, financial advisor or fiduciary to the District; (ii) the Underwriter has not assumed any advisory or fiduciary responsibility to the District with respect to the transaction contemplated hereby and the discussions, undertakings and procedures leading thereto (irrespective of whether the Underwriter has provided other services or is currently providing other services to the District on other matters); (iii) the Underwriter is acting solely in its capacity as an underwriter for its own accounts (iv) the only obligations the Underwriter has to the District with respect to the transaction contemplated hereby expressly are set forth in this Agreement; and (v) the District has consulted its own legal, accounting, tax, financial and other advisors, as applicable, to the extent it has deemed appropriate. The services of the Underwriter shall consist of the following:

- 1. Analyze the financing alternatives available to the District for the issuance of the Bonds and develop a financing plan, taking into account the District's objectives and considerations;
- 2. Size the Bonds, taking into account the needs of the District, reimbursements to the District, rating services, fees and other costs of issuance;
- 3. In cooperation with District, prepare and/or review of all documents necessary to implement the issuance of the Bonds, including, but not limited to, authorizing resolutions, bond purchase agreement, and preliminary and final official statements distributed to potential investors, as required;

- 4. Together with the District and any other appropriate parties, consult on the terms and conditions of the Bonds, such as maturities, coupon rates, call features and security features, for the purpose of meeting market demands and the objectives of the District;
- 5. Provide information and material as needed to support presentations for rating agencies and/or bond insurance companies; if requested;
- 6. Coordinate printing and distribution of the preliminary and final official statements;
- 7. Schedule, coordinate and attend necessary rating agency meetings (as applicable) to support the District's efforts to obtain the highest possible rating on the issue;
- 8. Organize and participate in information meetings, if needed, to create investor interest with potential retail and/or institutional clients in the bond issue;
- 9. Together with the District and other appropriate parties, provide market information on the timing of the sale of the Bonds in relation to the market conditions and financing needs;
- 10. Arrange for distribution of the final official statements in accordance with Section 240.15c2-12 of Title 17 of the Code of Federal Regulations;
- 11. Arrange for the printing of the Bonds and assist in the signing and delivering of the Bonds; and
- 12. Serve as sole underwriter of the Bonds, which obligation is conditioned upon the execution of a mutually satisfactory bond purchase agreement and other customary documentation, and coordinate with all parties so as to consummate the sale and delivery of the Bonds in a timely manner.

Limitation of Duties

The District acknowledges and agrees that RBC CM is not making a commitment to extend credit, make a loan or otherwise fund the Bonds beyond the obligations contained in a mutually satisfactory bond purchase agreement. The District acknowledges that the services provided under this Agreement involve professional judgment on our part and that the results cannot be, and are not, guaranteed.

Know Your Client, Anti-Money Laundering, and Terrorist Financing Rules and Regulations

The District agrees to provide information to satisfy "Know Your Client," "Anti-Money Laundering" and Terrorist Financing" rules and regulations, in each case, in accordance with the Underwriter's requirements.

Compensation

The Underwriter agrees to prepare and coordinate all aspects of the sale of the Bonds. The Underwriter's compensation will be negotiated with the District and any other appropriate parties at the time each series of Bonds is issued. However, in no instance will Underwriter's compensation exceed 0.50% of the total principal amount of new money bonds being issued.

Fees and commissions are paid from the proceeds of the Bonds and are calculated as a discount on the total bond amount. All fees are contingent on a successful sale of the Bonds and are payable from the Bond proceeds.

Expenses

The District, from the Bond proceeds or other lawfully available funds, shall pay any expenses incident to the authorization, issuance, marketing, sale and delivery of the Bonds including, but not limited to: (i) legal fees, including bond counsel, District counsel, disclosure counsel, and special tax counsel, if any; (ii) fees and disbursements of the financial advisor, if any; (iii) cost of printing and distribution of the preliminary and official statements; (iv) rating agency and credit enhancement fees, (v) and fees and disbursements of any trustee, paying agent or engineers, accountants, and other experts, consultants or advisers retained by the District, if any. In addition, the District will pay all incidental expenses related to the issuance of the Bonds, including, but not limited to, meals, transportation, and lodging incurred by personnel of the District and the Underwriter, if any, and any other miscellaneous costs.

Term of Agreement

This Agreement is to continue until the Bonds or any Refunding Bonds are issued unless terminated, with or without cause, by either party upon five (5) day prior written notice to the other party of its intent to terminate. Any such termination, however, shall not affect the obligations of the District under the Expenses section hereof.

Severability of Provisions

If any provision of this Agreement is held invalid, the remainder of the Agreement shall not be affected thereby if such remainder would then continue to conform to the terms and requirements of applicable law.

Governing Law

This Agreement, and the rights and obligations of the parties hereto, shall be construed, interpreted and enforced pursuant to the laws of the State of California and exclusive venue in any and all actions existing under this Agreement shall be laid in the action or proceeding which District or Underwriter may be required to prosecute to enforce its respective rights within this Agreement. The unsuccessful party therein agrees to pay all costs incurred by the prevailing party therein, including reasonable interest and attorney's fees, to be fixed by court, and said costs, interest, and attorneys' fees shall be made a part of the judgment in said action. Prior to the commencement of any litigation concerning this Agreement, the District and the Underwriter agree to first submit any disagreements to mediation. This mediation requirement is intended to reduce the costs of dispute resolution for both parties.

Indemnity

To the extent permitted by law, the District agrees to indemnify and hold the Underwriter harmless against any losses, claims, damages or liabilities, including reasonable and necessary legal fees to which RBCCM may become subject, that arise from or relate to the transaction contemplated herein or the issuance of the Bonds. Such indemnity shall include indemnity for claims that may allege or involve negligence of RBCCM, but shall not include claims involving willful misconduct or gross negligence of RBCCM.

Miscellaneous

Nothing contained herein shall preclude the Underwriter from carrying on its customary and usual business activities. The Underwriter specifically reserves the right, but is not obligated, to bid for and maintain secondary markets on any District outstanding bonds subject to appropriate information barriers. Services provided by the Underwriter in connection with this Agreement shall not limit the Underwriter from providing services for the District in conjunction with other services requested by the District except as limited by rule of law or regulation.

In connection with services agreed to herein, it is understood that the Underwriter will render professional services as an independent contractor. Neither the Underwriter nor any of its agents or employees shall be deemed an employee of the District for any purpose.

The Underwriter shall not assign or otherwise transfer any interest in this Agreement without the prior written consent of the District.

This Agreement constitutes the entire agreement between the parties relating to the subject matter thereof and supersedes any prior understandings or representations. The Agreement may be amended or modified only by a writing signed by both parties. It is solely for the benefit of the District and RBC CM, and no other person.

This Agreement is submitted in duplicate originals. The acceptance of this Agreement by the District will occur upon the return of one original executed by an authorized District representative, and the District hereby represents that the signatory below is so authorized.
